House Resolution No. 291.

A resolution to declare May 11, 2016, as Older Michigianians Day in the state of Michigan.

Whereas, Over 1.9 million Michigianians age 60 and over deserve our utmost respect and gratitude for their many contributions to our communities and our state. Older citizens play a vital role in cities and towns all across our great state; and

Whereas, Older Michigianians are active supporters of Michigan’s economy, workforce, charities, religious institutions, local communities, and institutions of government. This group is one of our state’s greatest resources of understanding our past and improving our future. They are truly a foundation upon which we can build a better tomorrow; and

Whereas, This invaluable group of citizens is being honored and admired for their many years of service to the state of Michigan. They have been an indispensable source of knowledge and inspiration throughout the years; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of this legislative body declare May 11, 2016, as Older Michigianians Day in the state of Michigan. We honor our state’s population of older citizens.

House Resolution No. 292.

A resolution to declare May 2016 as Stroke Awareness Month in the state of Michigan.

Whereas, Stroke is one of the leading causes of death and serious long-term disability in the state of Michigan; and

Whereas, The federal government estimates show more than \$34 billion is spent annually on strokes, including the cost of health care services, medications, and lost productivity; and

Whereas, Nearly 58 percent of Americans do not know if they are at risk for a stroke and one in three Americans cannot name any of the signs or symptoms of a stroke; and

Whereas, The F.A.S.T. warning signs and symptoms of a stroke include face drooping, arm weakness, speech difficulty, and time to call 9-1-1. Additional stroke warning signs and symptoms include sudden numbness or weakness of the face, arm, or leg, especially on one side of the body, confusion, trouble speaking or difficulty understanding speech, trouble seeing in one or both eyes, trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination and severe headache with no known cause; and

Whereas, The American Heart Association urges people to lower their risk of heart disease and stroke by focusing on "Life's Simple 7" key health factors and behaviors: managing blood pressure, controlling cholesterol, reducing blood sugar, getting active, eating better, losing weight, and stopping smoking; and

Whereas, New and effective treatments have been developed to treat and minimize the severity and damaging effect of strokes, but much more research is needed; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of this legislative body declare May 2016 as Stroke Awareness Month in the state of Michigan. We urge increased public awareness of the risk factors, warning signs, and symptoms of stroke; and be it further

Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the Members of the Michigan Congressional Delegation, the Governor of the State of Michigan, and the Secretary of the Michigan Senate.

House Bill No. 5314, entitled

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code," by amending sections 9155 and 9156 (MCL 333.9155 and 333.9156), section 9155 as added by 2012 PA 342 and section 9156 as added by 2012 PA 343.

Was read a second time, and the question being on the adoption of the proposed substitute (H-1) previously recommended by the Committee on Health Policy,

The substitute (H-1) was adopted, a majority of the members serving voting therefor.

Rep. Hooker moved that the bill be placed on the order of Third Reading of Bills.

Senate Bill No. 606, entitled

A bill to amend 1893 PA 206, entitled "The general property tax act," by amending section 7cc (MCL 211.7cc), as amended by 2014 PA 40.

House Bill No. 5326, entitled

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code," by amending sections 7422, 17708, and 17757 (MCL 333.7422, 333.17708, and 333.17757), section 7422 as added by 2014 PA 313, section 17708 as amended by 2012 PA 209, and section 17757 as amended by 2014 PA 525, and by adding section 17744e.

Was read a second time, and the question being on the adoption of the proposed substitute (H-3) previously recommended by the Committee on Health Policy,

The substitute (H-3) was adopted, a majority of the members serving voting therefor.

Rep. Forlini moved to amend the bill as follows:

1. Amend page 6, line 6, by striking out all of subsection (12) and renumbering the remaining subsection.

The motion prevailed and the amendment was adopted, a majority of the members serving voting therefor.

Rep. Forlini moved that the bill be placed on the order of Third Reading of Bills.

A bill to amend 2012 PA 615, entitled "Michigan energy assistance act," by amending section 6 (MCL 400.1236).

Was read a second time, and the question being on the adoption of the proposed substitute (H-1) previously recommended by the Committee on Appropriations,

The substitute (H-1) was adopted, a majority of the members serving voting therefor.

Rep. Poleski moved that the bill be placed on the order of Third Reading of Bills.

Senate Bill No. 343, entitled

A bill to amend 1980 PA 300, entitled "The public school employees retirement act of 1979," by amending sections 41 and 41a (MCL 38.1341 and 38.1341a), as amended by 2012 PA 300.

Was read a second time, and the question being on the adoption of the proposed substitute (H-1) previously recommended by the Committee on Appropriations,

The substitute (H-1) was adopted, a majority of the members serving voting therefor.

Rep. Nesbitt moved that the bill be placed on the order of Third Reading of Bills.

The motion prevailed.

House Bill No. 5562, entitled

A bill to amend 1939 PA 280, entitled "The social welfare act," by amending section 117a (MCL 400.117a), as amended by 2015 PA 81.

The bill was read a second time.

Rep. Hoadley moved to amend the bill as follows:

1. Amend page 5, line 1, after "subdivision" by inserting "AND SUBSECTION (9)".

2. Amend page 7, following line 11, by inserting:

"(9) A COUNTY SEEKING REIMBURSEMENT UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL ENSURE THAT AGENCIES PROVIDING FOSTER CARE SERVICES REPORT TO THE DEPARTMENT BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING:

(A) THE AGENCY'S POLICY ON PROVIDING FOSTER CARE PLACEMENTS WITH SAME-SEX COUPLES.

(B) THE AGENCY'S POLICY RELATING TO FOSTER CARE PARENTS' RELIGIOUS FAITH AND WHETHER THE AGENCY WOULD REFUSE A FOSTER CARE PLACEMENT WITH A FOSTER PARENT BASED ON THAT FOSTER CARE PARENT'S RELIGIOUS PREFERENCE."

The motion did not prevail and the amendments were not adopted, a majority of the members serving not voting therefor.

Amend page 1, line 7, after "operation" by striking out the balance of the page through "**SUBSECTION.**" on line 9 of page 2 and inserting a period and "**THE NONRESIDENT OPERATOR MAY OPERATE A MOTOR VEHICLE IN COMPLIANCE WITH OTHERWISE APPLICABLE STATE AND FEDERAL LAW USING THE LICENSE TO OPERATE A MOTOR VEHICLE ISSUED BY A COUNTRY OTHER THAN THE UNITED STATES IF THE COUNTRY THAT ISSUED THE NONRESIDENT OPERATOR'S LICENSE IS A PARTY TO AN INTERNATIONAL TREATY, CONVENTION, OR AGREEMENT REGULATING TRAFFIC, DRIVING, OR THE OPERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO WHICH THE UNITED STATES OR THIS STATE IS ALSO A PARTY, ACCORDING TO THE TERMS OF THAT TREATY, CONVENTION, OR AGREEMENT. IF THE ISSUING COUNTRY IS NOT A PARTY TO A TREATY, CONVENTION, OR AGREEMENT DESCRIBED IN THIS SUBSECTION, THE NONRESIDENT OPERATOR MAY OPERATE A MOTOR VEHICLE USING THE LICENSE ISSUED BY HIS OR HER HOME COUNTRY IF HE OR SHE WOULD OTHERWISE BE ABLE TO SATISFY THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 307(1) EXCEPT FOR ANY REQUIREMENT TO ESTABLISH AN ADDRESS IN THIS STATE OR RESIDENCY.**".

3. Amend page 2, line 10, after the first "A" by striking out "**MOTOR**" and inserting "**PASSENGER**".
