SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4268

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending sections 2253 and 2453 (MCL 333.2253 and 333.2453), section 2253 as amended by 2006 PA 157, and by adding sections 2254 and 2454.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 2253. (1) If Subject to subsection (4), if the director determines that control of an epidemic is necessary to protect the public health, the director by emergency order may prohibit the gathering of people for any purpose and may establish procedures to be followed during the epidemic to insure ensure continuation of essential public health services and enforcement of health laws. Emergency procedures shall are not be limited to this code.

(2) If an epidemic described in subsection (1) involves avian
 influenza or another virus or disease that is or may be spread by
 contact with animals, the department of agriculture and rural
 development shall cooperate with and assist the director in the
 director's response to the epidemic.

6 (3) Upon On request from the director, the department of
7 agriculture and rural development shall assist the department in
8 any review or update of the department's pandemic influenza plan
9 under section 5112.

10 (4) An emergency order issued under this section is valid for11 28 days.

Sec. 2254. A business that, because of an epidemic involving a communicable disease, is required to cease its operations under an emergency order issued under section 2253 or a rule promulgated by the department and that continues to operate is not in violation of the order or rule if the business complies with each health or safety precaution that the order or rule requires of another business that is allowed to operate under the order or rule.

19 Sec. 2453. (1) If a local health officer determines that 20 control of an epidemic is necessary to protect the public health, the local health officer may issue an emergency order to prohibit 21 22 the gathering of people for any purpose and may establish 23 procedures to be followed by persons, including a local 24 governmental entity, during the epidemic to insure ensure 25 continuation of essential public health services and enforcement of 26 health laws. Emergency procedures shall are not be limited to this 27 code.

28 (2) A local health department or the department may provide29 for the involuntary detention and treatment of individuals with

hazardous communicable disease in the manner prescribed in sections
 5201 to 5238.5210.

3 Sec. 2454. A business that, because of an epidemic involving a 4 communicable disease, is required to cease its operations under an emergency order issued under section 2453 or a regulation adopted 5 6 by a local health department and that continues to operate is not 7 in violation of the order or regulation if the business complies 8 with each health or safety precaution that the order or regulation 9 requires of another business that is allowed to operate under the 10 order or regulation.
