Sec. 203. Sec. 307. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for 13 14 community-based care project, the department of health and human 15 services shall appropriate \$750,000.00 to a nonprofit organization 16 organized under the laws of this state that is exempt from federal 17 income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the internal revenue code of 1986, 26 USC 501, located in a city with a population between 18 97,000 and 109,000 according to the 2010 federal decennial census 19 20 to implement a community-based care project to support the entire 21 family while they are in contact with the child welfare system. To 22 be eligible for the funding, the entity must have been established in 1978 and have a stated mission of: with the support of the 23 community, we preserve families when possible and create new 24 25 families when necessary.

(1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for 2 integrated care center, the department of health and human services 3 shall allocate \$15,000,000.00 to a PIHP operating in a county with 4 a population greater than 1,300,000, according to the 2010 federal 5 6 decennial census, to implement a centrally located integrated 7 service center to offer separate child and adult units to provide physical and mental health services. These services must include, 8 but are not limited to: 9
