A bill to make, supplement, and adjust appropriations for various state departments and agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022; to provide for certain conditions on appropriations; and to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations.

1 PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS

2 **GENERAL SECTIONS**

3 Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state  
4 constitution of 1963, total state spending from state sources under  
5 part 1 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022 is \$17,538,700  
6 and total state spending from state sources to be paid to local  
7 units of government is \$15,038,700.00.

8 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and expenditures authorized  
9 under this part and part 1 and the departments, commissions,  
10 boards, offices, and programs for which appropriations are made  
11 under this part and part 1 are subject to the management and budget  
12 act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594.

13 Sec. 203. If the state administrative board, acting under  
14 section 3 of 1921 PA 2, MCL 17.3, transfers funds from an amount  
15 appropriated under part 1, the legislature may, by a concurrent  
16 resolution adopted by a majority of the members elected to and  
17 serving in each house, inter-transfer funds within part 1 for the  
18 particular department, board, commission, office, or institution.

19  
20 **DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES**

21 Sec. 301. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for health  
22 homes, the department of health and human services shall maintain  
23 the number of behavioral health homes in PIHP regions 1, 2, and 8  
24 and maintain the number of substance use disorder health homes in  
25 PIHP regions 1, 2, 4, and 9. The department may expand the number  
26 of behavioral health homes in PIHP regions 6 and 7 and the number  
27 of substance use disorder health homes in PIHP regions 6, 7, and  
28 10.

29 (2) On a quarterly basis, the department of health and human



1 services shall provide a report to the house and senate  
2 appropriation subcommittees on the department budget, the house and  
3 senate fiscal agencies, the house and senate policy offices, and  
4 the state budget office on the number of individuals being served  
5 and expenditures incurred by each PIHP region by site.

6 Sec. 302. (1) The funds appropriated in part 1 for Medicaid  
7 mental health services shall be used to complete the phase out of  
8 local funds provided by each PIHP, from internal resources, used as  
9 a part of the state match required under the Medicaid program in  
10 order to increase capitation rates for PIHPs.

11 (2) The funds appropriated in part 1 for Medicaid mental  
12 health services must not be spent or otherwise distributed unless  
13 all of the following bills of the 101st Legislature are enacted  
14 into law:

15 (a) Senate Bill No. 597.

16 (b) Senate Bill No. 598.

17 Sec. 303. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
18 adverse childhood experiences awareness program, the department of  
19 health and human services shall appropriate \$3,500,000.00 to the  
20 Michigan ACE Initiative in partial support of House Concurrent  
21 Resolution No. 2 of the 100th Legislature and Senate Concurrent  
22 Resolution No. 8 of the 100th Legislature. The funds are to be used  
23 to support the continued implementation of an awareness program on  
24 adverse childhood experiences, particularly for instructional and  
25 administrative staff in Michigan's schools, and to begin a program  
26 to focus resilience efforts to mitigate the effects of adverse  
27 childhood experiences.

28 (2) Prior to the release of funds, the Michigan ACE Initiative  
29 shall provide a strategic plan to the department of health and



1 human services that identifies how the funds will be used over a  
 2 12-month period. The strategic plan must include all of the  
 3 following components:

4 (a) The targeted school districts and amounts that will be  
 5 used to provide the awareness efforts to instructional, service,  
 6 and administrative staff along with the intended collaborating  
 7 partners.

8 (b) The focus and amounts to be used for any demonstration  
 9 projects and the intended collaborating partners.

10 (c) The amount to be targeted to establish a center for  
 11 adverse childhood experiences and resilience and the names of  
 12 collaborating partners.

13 (d) The amount to be targeted to Michigan's Child Abuse  
 14 Councils to assist in work on adverse childhood experiences  
 15 awareness and prevention.

16 (3) Within 30 days of the receipt of the strategic plan  
 17 required in subsection (2), the department of health and human  
 18 services shall submit the strategic plan to the senate and house  
 19 appropriations subcommittees on the department budget, the senate  
 20 and house fiscal agencies, and the state budget office.

21 (4) Funds appropriated for adverse childhood experiences  
 22 awareness program shall be considered work project funds and shall  
 23 not lapse at the close of the fiscal year and shall be available  
 24 for expenditures for projects under this section until the projects  
 25 have been completed. The following is in compliance with section  
 26 451a(1) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL  
 27 18.1451a:

28 (a) The purpose of the work project is to support the Michigan  
 29 ACE Initiative.





1 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants to the  
2 Michigan ACE Initiative.

3 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
4 \$3,500,000.00.

5 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

6 Sec. 304. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
7 behavioral health provider recruitment, the department of health  
8 and human services shall make 1-time payments to health care  
9 providers of up to \$250,000.00 to cover the costs of hiring new  
10 positions in the behavioral health field.

11 (2) Funds appropriated for behavioral health provider  
12 recruitment shall be considered work project funds and shall not  
13 lapse at the close of the fiscal year and shall be available for  
14 expenditures for projects under this section until the projects  
15 have been completed. The following is in compliance with section  
16 451a(1) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL  
17 18.1451a:

18 (a) The purpose of the work project is to provide funding for  
19 grants to reimburse hiring costs for health care providers for new  
20 behavioral health provider staff.

21 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants to health care  
22 providers.

23 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
24 \$15,000,000.00.

25 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

26 Sec. 305. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for child  
27 and adolescent psychiatric emergency department, the department of  
28 health and human services shall allocate \$6,000,000.00 to a  
29 hospital to expand its adolescent and children's emergency



1 psychiatry unit through the creation of a dedicated emergency room  
2 for children and adolescents. In order to be eligible to receive  
3 funding, the hospital must be associated with a 4-year medical  
4 school located in a city with a population between 110,000 and  
5 114,000, according to the 2010 federal decennial census.

6 (2) Funds appropriated for child and adolescent psychiatric  
7 emergency department shall be considered work project funds and  
8 shall not lapse at the close of the fiscal year and shall be  
9 available for expenditures for projects under this section until  
10 the projects have been completed. The following is in compliance  
11 with section 451a(1) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,  
12 MCL 18.1451a:

13 (a) The purpose of the work project is to create a dedicated  
14 child and adolescent psychiatric emergency department.

15 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants to a hospital  
16 associated with a medical school.

17 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
18 \$6,000,000.00.

19 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

20 Sec. 306. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
21 clinical integration fund, the department of health and human  
22 services shall issue grants to facilities and providers that wish  
23 to clinically integrate their setting with physical and behavioral  
24 health services and providers.

25 (2) Funds appropriated for clinical integration fund shall be  
26 considered work project funds and shall not lapse at the close of  
27 the fiscal year and shall be available for expenditures for  
28 projects under this section until the projects have been completed.  
29 The following is in compliance with section 451a(1) of the



1 management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

2 (a) The purpose of the work project is to provide funding for  
3 grants to help cover costs to facilities and providers that wish to  
4 clinically integrate their setting with physical and behavioral  
5 health services and providers.

6 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants to health care  
7 providers and facilities.

8 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
9 \$25,000,000.00.

10 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

11 (3) The funds appropriated in part 1 for clinical integration  
12 fund must not be spent or otherwise distributed unless all of the  
13 following bills of the 101st Legislature are enacted into law:

14 (a) Senate Bill No. 597.

15 (b) Senate Bill No. 598.

16 Sec. 307. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
17 community-based care project, the department of health and human  
18 services shall appropriate \$750,000.00 to a nonprofit organization  
19 organized under the laws of this state that is exempt from federal  
20 income tax under section 501(c) (3) of the internal revenue code of  
21 1986, 26 USC 501, located in a city with a population between  
22 97,000 and 109,000 according to the 2010 federal decennial census  
23 to implement a community-based care project to support the entire  
24 family while they are in contact with the child welfare system. To  
25 be eligible for the funding, the entity must have been established  
26 in 1978 and have a stated mission of: with the support of the  
27 community, we preserve families when possible and create new  
28 families when necessary.

29 (2) Funds appropriated for community-based care project shall



1 be considered work project funds and shall not lapse at the close  
2 of the fiscal year and shall be available for expenditures for  
3 projects under this section until the projects have been completed.  
4 The following is in compliance with section 451a(1) of the  
5 management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

6 (a) The purpose of the work project is to establish a  
7 community-based care project for child welfare.

8 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants to a nonprofit  
9 that works with abused and neglected children.

10 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
11 \$750,000.00.

12 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

13 Sec. 308. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
14 community mental health services programs integration readiness,  
15 the department of health and human services shall provide 1-time  
16 funding to support community mental health services programs'  
17 efforts to make system, information technology, staffing, and  
18 administrative improvements for integration readiness.

19 (2) Funds appropriated for community mental health services  
20 programs integration readiness shall be considered work project  
21 funds and shall not lapse at the close of the fiscal year and shall  
22 be available for expenditures for projects under this section until  
23 the projects have been completed. The following is in compliance  
24 with section 451a(1) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,  
25 MCL 18.1451a:

26 (a) The purpose of the work project is to provide funding to  
27 community mental health services programs to make improvements for  
28 integration readiness.

29 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants provided to



1 community mental health services programs.

2 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
3 \$50,000,000.00.

4 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

5 (3) The funds appropriated in part 1 for community mental  
6 health services programs integration readiness must not be spent or  
7 otherwise distributed unless all of the following bills of the  
8 101st Legislature are enacted into law:

9 (a) Senate Bill No. 597.

10 (b) Senate Bill No. 598.

11 Sec. 309. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
12 community substance use disorder prevention, education, and  
13 treatment grants, the department of health and human services shall  
14 provide funding, pursuant to federal laws, rules, and regulations,  
15 including awards to private entities that have contracts to provide  
16 community-based substance use disorder services.

17 (2) Funds appropriated for community substance use disorder  
18 prevention, education, and treatment grants shall be considered  
19 work project funds and shall not lapse at the close of the fiscal  
20 year and shall be available for expenditures for projects under  
21 this section until the projects have been completed. The following  
22 is in compliance with section 451a(1) of the management and budget  
23 act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

24 (a) The purpose of the work project is to provide funding to  
25 private entities that have contracts to provide community-based  
26 substance use disorder services.

27 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants to eligible  
28 providers.

29 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is



1 \$10,000,000.00.

2 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

3 Sec. 310. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for crisis  
4 stabilization units, the department of health and human services  
5 shall create a 1-time grant pool for entities interested in  
6 establishing crisis stabilization units as described in chapter 9A  
7 of the mental health code, 1974 PA 258, MCL 330.1971 to 330.1979.  
8 Any qualified provider in this state shall be eligible to apply for  
9 a portion of the funding.

10 (2) Funds appropriated for crisis stabilization units shall be  
11 considered work project funds and shall not lapse at the close of  
12 the fiscal year and shall be available for expenditures for  
13 projects under this section until the projects have been completed.  
14 The following is in compliance with section 451a(1) of the  
15 management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

16 (a) The purpose of the work project is to provide funding to  
17 establish crisis stabilization units.

18 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants to eligible  
19 providers.

20 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
21 \$25,000,000.00.

22 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

23 (3) As used in this section, "crisis stabilization unit" means  
24 that term as defined in section 100a of the mental health code,  
25 1974 PA 258, MCL 330.1100a.

26 Sec. 311. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
27 department of health and human services integration readiness, the  
28 department of health and human services shall make 1-time  
29 investments to support implementation of Senate Bill No. 597 of the



1 101st Legislature and Senate Bill No. 598 of the 101st Legislature.  
2 The funding appropriated in part 1 shall be used to harness  
3 external support for study and plan development, project  
4 management, information technology system enhancements, and  
5 administrative investments.

6 (2) Funds appropriated for department of health and human  
7 services integration readiness shall be considered work project  
8 funds and shall not lapse at the close of the fiscal year and shall  
9 be available for expenditures for projects under this section until  
10 the projects have been completed. The following is in compliance  
11 with section 451a(1) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,  
12 MCL 18.1451a:

13 (a) The purpose of the work project is to provide funding to  
14 the department of health and human services to make improvements  
15 for integration readiness.

16 (b) The projects will be accomplished by utilizing state  
17 employees or contracts with service providers, or both.

18 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
19 \$10,000,000.00.

20 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

21 (3) The funds appropriated in part 1 for department of health  
22 and human services integration readiness must not be spent or  
23 otherwise distributed unless all of the following bills of the  
24 101st Legislature are enacted into law:

25 (a) Senate Bill No. 597.

26 (b) Senate Bill No. 598.

27 Sec. 312. The funds appropriated in part 1 for Hawthorn Center  
28 expansion shall be used to support capital improvements to expand  
29 capacity at the Hawthorn Center. This funding shall be used to



1 increase both staffing and bed capacity.

2       Sec. 313. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
3 hospital infrastructure enhancements, funding shall be used to  
4 create a 1-time grant pool. Hospitals shall be allowed to apply for  
5 grants from the fund to be used to invest in infrastructure  
6 necessary to improve care for behavioral health patients who enter  
7 through the hospital's emergency department. Grants may be used for  
8 initiatives such as providing emergency department entrances and  
9 emergency department rooms for behavioral health patients that are  
10 separate from the emergency department entrances and emergency  
11 department rooms for the general patient population.

12       (2) Funds appropriated for the hospital infrastructure  
13 enhancements shall be considered work project funds and shall not  
14 lapse at the close of the fiscal year and shall be available for  
15 expenditures for projects under this section until the projects  
16 have been completed. The following is in compliance with section  
17 451a(1) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL  
18 18.1451a:

19       (a) The purpose of the work project is to provide funding for  
20 grants to hospitals to invest in infrastructure necessary to  
21 improve care for behavioral health patients who enter through the  
22 hospital's emergency department.

23       (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants to hospitals.

24       (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
25 \$20,000,000.00.

26       (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

27       Sec. 314. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
28 infrastructure grants to enhance pediatric inpatient services,  
29 funding shall be used to create a competitive grant program for





1 health care providers to increase the number of slots in long-term  
2 pediatric psychiatric inpatient hospitals, centers, or psychiatric  
3 residential treatment facilities by a total of at least 120 slots  
4 statewide. Grant applicants must identify 20% matching funds as  
5 part of the grant application. A single facility shall not receive  
6 more than \$25,000,000.00 of the funding appropriated in part 1, and  
7 the grants must be made to different geographic regions of this  
8 state.

9 (2) The department of health and human services shall  
10 determine and publish the evidence-based treatment care and  
11 services program for the population to be served by the slots  
12 described in subsection (1) not later than 6 months after the  
13 effective date of this act.

14 (3) Funds appropriated for infrastructure grants to enhance  
15 pediatric inpatient services shall be considered work project funds  
16 and shall not lapse at the close of the fiscal year and shall be  
17 available for expenditures for projects under this section until  
18 the projects have been completed. The following is in compliance  
19 with section 451a(1) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,  
20 MCL 18.1451a:

21 (a) The purpose of the work project is to implement a  
22 competitive grant funding program for health care providers to  
23 increase the number of long-term pediatric psychiatric inpatient  
24 slots online across this state.

25 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants to health care  
26 facilities.

27 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
28 \$100,000,000.00.

29 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.



1 (4) As used in this section, "health care provider" means an  
2 entity that is licensed under part 215 of the public health code,  
3 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.21501 to 333.21571, or section 137 of the  
4 mental health code, 1974 PA 258, MCL 330.1137.

5 Sec. 315. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
6 integrated care center, the department of health and human services  
7 shall allocate \$15,000,000.00 to a PIHP operating in a county with  
8 a population greater than 1,300,000, according to the 2010 federal  
9 decennial census, to implement a centrally located integrated  
10 service center to offer separate child and adult units to provide  
11 physical and mental health services. These services must include,  
12 but are not limited to:

- 13 (a) Crisis residential services.
- 14 (b) Sober living services.
- 15 (c) 24-hour crisis walk-in services.
- 16 (d) Peer supports services.
- 17 (e) Mobile crisis stabilization services.
- 18 (f) Transportation.
- 19 (g) Psychiatric assessments.

20 (2) Funds appropriated for integrated care center shall be  
21 considered work project funds and shall not lapse at the close of  
22 the fiscal year and shall be available for expenditures for  
23 projects under this section until the projects have been completed.  
24 The following is in compliance with section 451a(1) of the  
25 management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

- 26 (a) The purpose of the work project is to implement an  
27 integrated service center in PIHP region 7.
- 28 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants to a PIHP.
- 29 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is



1 \$15,000,000.00.

2 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

3 (3) The funds appropriated in part 1 for integrated care
