## HOUSE BILL No. 4181

February 7, 1991, Introduced by Rep. Alley and referred to the Committee on Conservation, Recreation and Environment.

A bill to amend section 2 of Act No. 346 of the Public Acts of 1972, entitled

"Inland lakes and streams act of 1972,"

being section 281.952 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Section 1. Section 2 of Act No. 346 of the Public Acts of
 2 1972, being section 281.952 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is
 3 amended to read as follows:

4 Sec. 2. As used in this act:

5 (a) "Bottomland" means the land area of an inland lake or 6 stream which lies below the ordinary high-water mark and which 7 may or may not be covered by water.

8 (b) "Bulkhead line" means a line which is established
9 pursuant to this act beyond which dredging, filling or
10 construction of any kind is not allowed without a permit.

(c) "Commission" means the <u>natural resources</u> commission OF
 2 CONSERVATION AND RECREATION.

3 (d) "Department" means the department of natural resources.
4 (e) "Impoundment" means water held back by a dam, dike,
5 floodgate or other barrier.

6 (f) "Inland lake or stream" means a natural or artificial 7 lake, pond or impoundment; a river, stream or creek which may or 8 may not be serving as a drain as defined by THE DRAIN CODE OF 9 1956, Act No. 40 of the Public Acts of 1956, as amended, being 10 sections 280.1 to -200.623 - 280.630 of the MICHIGAN Compiled 11 Laws; -of -1940; or any other body of water which has definite 12 banks, a bed and visible evidence of a continued flow or contin-13 ued occurrence of water, including the St. Marys, St. Clair and 14 Detroit rivers. -It- INLAND LAKE OR STREAM does not include the 15 Great Lakes, Lake St. Clair and a lake or pond which has a sur-16 face area of less than 5 acres.

17 (g) "Marina" means a facility which is owned or operated by 18 a person, extends into or over an inland lake or stream and 19 offers service to the public or members of the marina for dock-20 ing, loading or other servicing of recreational watercraft.

(h) "Ordinary high water mark" means the line between upland and bottomland which persists through successive changes in water levels, below which the presence and action of the water is so common or recurrent that the character of the land is marked distinctly from the upland and is apparent in the soil itself, the configuration of the surface of the soil and the vegetation. On an inland lake which has a level established by law, it means the

1 high established level. Where water returns to its natural level 2 as the result of the permanent removal or abandonment of a dam, 3 it means the natural ordinary high water mark.

4 (i) "Person" means any individual, partnership, corporation,
5 association, political subdivision of the state, the department
6 or other instrumentality or agency of the state, political subdi7 vision thereof or other legal entity.

8 (j) "Project" means an activity which requires a permit pur-9 suant to section 3.

10 (k) "Property owners' association" means any group of orga11 nized property owners publishing a directory of their membership,
12 the majority of which are riparian owners and are located on the
13 inland lake or stream which is affected by the proposed project.
14 (l) "Riparian owner" means a person who has riparian

15 rights.

16 (m) "Riparian rights" means those rights which are associ17 ated with the ownership of the bank or shore of an inland lake or
18 stream.

(n) "Seasonal structure" includes any type of dock, boat
hoist, ramp, raft or other recreational structure which is placed
into an inland lake or stream and removed at the end of the boating season.

23 (o) "Structure" includes a marina, wharf, dock, pier, dam,
24 weir, stream deflector, breakwater, groin, jetty, sewer, pipe25 line, cable and bridge.

(p) "Upland" means the land area which lies above theordinary high water mark.
