A bill to amend section 9d of Act No. 307 of the Public Acts of 1982, entitled as amended

"The environmental response act,"

as added by Act No. 157 of the Public Acts of 1989, being section 299.609d of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Section 1. Section 9d of Act No. 307 of the Public Acts of
1982, as added by Act No. 157 of the Public Acts of 1989, being
section 299.609d of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended to
read as follows:

5 Sec. 9d. (1) Within 5 months after the effective date of 6 the amendatory act that added this section SUBSECTION (2), the 7 department of management and budget shall enter into a contract 8 for the preparation of a study that analyzes the public and 9 private costs associated with various levels of cleanup standards

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1 AND VARIOUS CLEANUP TECHNOLOGIES for response activities under 2 this act. The study shall also include, but is not limited to, 3 an analysis of how quickly various levels of cleanup have been 4 and can be accomplished. The contract shall provide for the 5 study to be completed within 6 months. Prior to entering into 6 the contract, the department of management and budget shall con-7 sult with the department of natural resources, the chairperson of 8 the house of representatives committee on conservation, recre-9 ation, and environment, and the chairperson of the senate commit-10 tee on natural resources and environmental affairs regarding the 11 design and the scope of the study. The study required under this 12 section may be conducted in conjunction with other related 13 studies. Upon completion of the study, the department of manage-14 ment and budget shall submit copies of the study to the legisla-15 ture AND TO THE TASK FORCE APPOINTED IN SUBSECTION (2). (2) THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT A TASK FORCE CONSISTING OF 15 16 17 INDIVIDUALS REPRESENTING SMALL BUSINESS, LARGE BUSINESS AND 18 INDUSTRY, ENVIRONMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS, AND STATE AGENCIES TO 19 REVIEW THE STUDY UNDER SUBSECTION (1), AND TO MAKE RECOMMENDA-20 TIONS TO THE LEGISLATURE, THE GOVERNOR, AND THE DEPARTMENT OF 21 NATURAL RESOURCES ON APPROPRIATE LEVELS OF CLEANUP STANDARDS AND 22 APPROPRIATE CLEANUP TECHNOLOGIES TO BE EMPLOYED IN UNDERTAKING

23 RESPONSE ACTIVITIES UNDER THIS ACT.

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
