A SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILLS 4043 AND 4356 AS INTRODUCED

The bills would impose a penalty of life in prison without parole for arson that caused a death. House Bill 4356 could not take effect unless House Bill 4043 was enacted. House Bill 4043, however, is tie-barred to House Bill 4044, which is virtually identical to House Bill 4356 and is in the House Committee on Corrections.

<u>House Bill 4043</u> would amend the Michigan Penal Code (MCL 750.73a) to specify that a person who willfully or maliciously burned a building or other real property, causing the death of a person, would be guilty of a felony to be punished by life in prison without parole. The prison term could not be suspended.

<u>House Bill 4356</u> would amend the corrections code (MCL 791.234) to make it consistent with House Bill 4043 and exempt prisoners sentenced under House Bill 4043 from provisions on parole.
