

## **SENATE BILL No. 555**

March 31, 1993, Introduced by Senators BOUCHARD and GOUGEON and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend section 4701 of Act No. 236 of the Public Acts of 1961, entitled as amended "Revised judicature act of 1961,"

as added by Act No. 104 of the Public Acts of 1988, being section 600.4701 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Section 1. Section 4701 of Act No. 236 of the Public Acts
 of 1961, as added by Act No. 104 of the Public Acts of 1988,
 being section 600.4701 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended
 to read as follows:

Sec. 4701. As used in this chapter:

(vi) A violation of section 219a of THE MICHIGAN PENAL CODE,
 Act No. 328 of the Public Acts of 1931, being section 750.219a of
 the Michigan Compiled Laws, if the total value of the telephone
 service obtained is over \$100.00.

5 (vii) A VIOLATION OF SECTION 625(1) OF THE MICHIGAN VEHICLE
6 CODE, ACT NO. 300 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF 1949, BEING
7 SECTION 257.625 OF THE MICHIGAN COMPILED LAWS, THAT IS PUNISHABLE
8 UNDER SECTION 625(6)(D) OF ACT NO. 300 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF
9 1949.

(viii) A VIOLATION OF SECTION 625(3) OF THE MICHIGAN VEHICLE
11 CODE, ACT NO. 300 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF 1949, BEING SECTION
12 257.625 OF THE MICHIGAN COMPILED LAWS, THAT IS PUNISHABLE UNDER
13 SECTION 625(10)(C) OF ACT NO. 300 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF 1949.

14 (ix) A VIOLATION OF SECTION 625(4) OR (5) OF THE MICHIGAN
15 VEHICLE CODE, ACT NO. 300 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF 1949, BEING SEC16 TION 257.625 OF THE MICHIGAN COMPILED LAWS.

17 (x) -(vii) Conspiracy to commit an offense listed in sub-18 paragraphs (i) to -(vi) (ix).

(b) "Instrumentality of a crime" means any property, other
than real property, the use of which contributes directly and
materially to the commission of a crime.

(c) "Person" means an individual, corporation, partnership,
or other business entity, or an unincorporated or voluntary
association.

(d) "Proceeds of a crime" means any property obtained
through the commission of a crime, including any appreciation in
the value of the property.

(e) "Security interest" means any interest in real or
 personal property that secures payment or performance of an
 obligation.

4 (f) "Substituted proceeds of a crime" means any property
5 obtained or any gain realized by the sale or exchange of proceeds
6 of a crime.
