A SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILL 4333 INTRODUCED 2-7-95

The Grain Dealers Act currently requires a person, before engaging in the business of receiving, buying, exchanging, selling, or storing farm produce, to be licensed as a grain dealer, and specifies that someone who engages in these activities without a license is guilty of a misdemeanor. The bill would amend the act to allow a person to act as a grain dealer without being licensed as long as he or she 1) operated on a cash basis, and 2) was not required to offer warehouse receipts, price-later agreements, or scale tickets. "Cash basis" would mean an operating method where a person receives, buys, exchanges, or sells farm produce from a producer or grower where "full payment at a price certain" is made when the goods are delivered and title to them passes from the producer or grower to the person or other legal entity.
