EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

Sec. 203. (1) In addition to the funds appropriated in section 101, there is appropriated an amount not to exceed \$3,500,000.00 for federal contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill pursuant to section 393(2) of the management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, being section 18.1393 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

(2) In addition to the funds appropriated in section 101, there is appropriated an amount not to exceed \$3,000,000.00 for state restricted contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill pursuant to section 393(2) of the management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, being section 18.1393 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

18 (3) In addition to the funds appropriated in section 101, there is 19 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$500,000.00 for local and private 20 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure until 21 they have been transferred to another line item in this bill pursuant 22 to section 393(2) of the management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the 23 Public Acts of 1984, being section 18.1393 of the Michigan Compiled 24 Laws.

Sec. 204. (1) Beginning October 1, 1996, there is a hiring freeze imposed on the state classified civil service. State departments and agencies are prohibited from hiring any new full-time state classified civil service employees or prohibited from filling any vacant state classified civil service positions. This hiring freeze does not apply to internal transfers of classified employees from 1 position to

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another within a department or to positions that are 80% or more
 federal or restricted funds.

(2)The director of the department of management and budget shall 3 grant exceptions to this hiring freeze when the director believes that 4 the hiring freeze will result in the state department or agency being 5 unable to deliver basic services. The director of the department of 6 management and budget shall report by the fifteenth of each month to 7 the chairpersons of the senate and house appropriations committees the 8 9 number of exclusions to the hiring freeze approved during the previous month and the justification for the exclusion. 10

Sec. 205. The department of civil service shall bill departments and/or agencies at the end of the first fiscal quarter for the 1% charges authorized by section 5 of article XI of the state constitution of 1963. Payments shall be made for the total amount of the billing by the end of the second fiscal quarter.

Sec. 206.(1) Departments and state agencies that receive funds under this bill may receive and expend federal funds for purposes allowed by the federal government and these funds are appropriated, if the funds are provided as block grants or other similar replacements for or consolidations of prior federal funding sources.

(2) Departments and state agencies may use the funds described in subsection (1) to continue existing programs and shall not establish new programs utilizing these funds unless the legislature has enacted modifications to the existing program or enacted a new program.

Sec. 208. Of the general fund/general purpose revenue appropriated 4 in section 101, \$13,057,600.00 represents a state spending increase 5 over the amount provided to the department of state police for the 6 7 fiscal year ending September 30, 1996, and may be used to meet state 8 match requirements of programs contained in the federal violent crime 9 control and law enforcement act of 1994, or successor grant programs, 10 so that any additional federal money received supplements funding provided to the department of state police in section 101. 11

12 DEPARTMENTWIDE APPROPRIATIONS

13 Sec. 301. Money shall not be expended by the department to hire or 14 train an applicant for employment by the department unless that 15 applicant agrees in writing to submit to a controlled substance test 16 that is supervised by the department.

17 CRIMINAL JUSTICE DATA CENTER

18 Sec. 501. The money appropriated in section 101 for computer 19 services shall be funded by LEIN user fees sufficient to pay 1/3 of the 20 service and contract maintenance costs.

Sec. 502. For the fiscal year ending September 30, 1996, the department, in conjunction with the departments of family independence agency, transportation, secretary of state, and management and budget, shall determine a cost of maintaining the traffic accident records program based on each department's respective use.

26 Sec. 503. (1) The money appropriated in section 101 includes money 27 for the purchase of AFIS equipment.

(2) Money expended by the department for the purchase of AFIS
equipment for local consortiums shall be on a per capita basis.

30 (3) State money shall not be used in the operation or maintenance

1 of AFIS equipment for local consortiums.

2 FORENSIC SCIENCES

3 Sec. 601. The grant to the city of Detroit under section 101 is 4 intended to supplement the city's appropriations for the Detroit crime 5 lab and for Detroit police special events.

6 LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS TRAINING COUNCIL

7 Sec. 701. (1) The money appropriated to the MLEOTC for maintenance 8 and delivery of training to locals is provided in accordance with a 9 state reimbursement policy in which 100% of the determined state 10 reimbursement rate shall be distributed upon certification by the 11 MLEOTC.

(2) Money shall not be expended by the MLEOTC for training a law 12 enforcement officer candidate, and a candidate shall not be certified 13 by the MLEOTC, unless the candidate tests negative on a test prescribed 14 15 by the MLEOTC that is designed to detect the illegal use of controlled 16 substances. A test shall be conducted before basic training and before application for certification. A candidate who tests positive or 17 18 refuses to submit to a test is not eligible for MLEOTC training or 19 certification until the expiration of 2 years after the positive test 20 or the refusal to submit to the test. Money shall not be expended to 21 employ, train, or certify a candidate who tests positive or who refuses a test, until the expiration of 2 years after the positive test or the 22 23 refusal to submit to the test.

24 EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

Sec. 801. (1) The state director of emergency management may expend money appropriated under this act to call upon any agency or department of the state or any resource of the state to protect life or property or to provide for the health or safety of the population in any area of the state in which the governor proclaims a state of emergency or state of disaster under Act No. 302 of the Public Acts of

1945, being sections 10.31 to 10.33 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, or 1 2 under the emergency management act, Act No. 390 of the Public Acts of 1976, being sections 30.401 to 30.420 of the Michigan Compiled Laws. 3 The state director of emergency management may expend the amounts the 4 director considers necessary to accomplish these purposes. The 5 director shall submit to the state budget director as soon as possible 6 a complete report of all actions taken under the authority of this 7 section. The report shall contain, as a separate item, a statement of 8 all money expended that is not reimbursable from federal money. 9 The 10 state budget director shall review the expenditures and submit recommendations to the legislature in regard to any possible need for a 11 supplemental appropriation. 12

13 (2) In addition to the money appropriated in section 101, the 14 department may receive and expend money from local, private, federal, 15 or state sources for the purpose of providing emergency management 16 training to local or private interests and for the purpose of 17 supporting emergency preparedness, response, recovery, and mitigation 18 activity.

19 UNIFORM SERVICES

Sec. 901. The department shall not expend any portion of the money appropriated in section 101, including any expenditure made under an executive order, to plan for or to implement a roadblock or check lane system that has as its primary objective the deterrence or detection of intoxicated drivers in this state.

25 Sec. 902. Upon service of proper notification by the department of 26 its intent to cancel the lease at any post that is subject to 27 consolidation, money appropriated in section 101 shall not be used for 28 rent expenses at that post beyond the minimum time required for 29 cancellation of the lease.

30 Sec. 903. State police enlisted personnel who are employed to

enforce traffic laws as provided in section 629e of the Michigan vehicle code, Act No. 300 of the Public Acts of 1949, being section 3 257.629e of the Michigan Compiled Laws, shall not be prohibited from 4 responding to crimes in progress or other emergency situations, and are 5 responsible for protecting every citizen of this state from harm.

6 SPECIAL OPERATIONS

Sec. 1001. Money appropriated under section 101 for the state
public safety communications system shall be expended upon approval of
an expenditure plan by the department of management and budget.

10 Sec. 1002. In addition to the money appropriated in section 101, 11 the department may receive and expend from local, private, federal, or 12 state sources to expand, enhance, or upgrade the 800 MH_z radio system.

13 CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS

Sec. 1101. (1) There is sufficient money appropriated in section 15 101 to criminal investigations to ensure that the citizens in a service 16 area of any state police post in the vicinity of a state prison do not 17 experience a downgrading of state police services in their area. 18 Criminal investigations shall be available by temporary or permanent 19 assignment of a detective when either a temporary or permanent prison 20 facility is opened.

(2) If the department is unable to comply with subsection (1) and
there is a prison scheduled to open, the department shall provide
troopers to serve as investigators on an interim basis.
