

HOUSE BILL No. 5739

April 16, 1996, Introduced by Rep. Bryant and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend section 1531 of Act No. 451 of the Public Acts of 1976, entitled as amended

"The revised school code,"

as amended by Act No. 289 of the Public Acts of 1995, being section 380.1531 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Section 1. Section 1531 of Act No. 451 of the Public Acts
- 2 of 1976, as amended by Act No. 289 of the Public Acts of 1995,
- 3 being section 380.1531 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended
- 4 to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 1531. (1) Except as provided in this act, the state
- 6 board shall determine the requirements for and issue all licenses
- 7 and certificates for teachers, including preprimary teachers, and
- 8 the requirements for an endorsement of teachers as qualified
- 9 counselors and an endorsement of teachers for teaching a foreign

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- I language in an elementary grade in the public schools of the 2 state.
- 3 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the state
- 4 board shall only issue a teaching certificate to a person who has
- 5 passed appropriate examinations as follows:
- 6 (a) For a secondary level teaching certificate, has passed
- 7 both the basic skills examination and the appropriate available
- 8 subject area examination for each subject area in which he or she
- 9 applies to be certified.
- (b) For an elementary level teaching certificate, has passed
- II the basic skills examination and, if it is available, the elemen-
- 12 tary certification examination, and has passed the appropriate
- 13 available subject area examination for each subject area, if any,
- 14 in which he or she applies to be certified.
- (3) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the state
- 16 board shall issue a Michigan teaching certificate to a person
- 17 holding a certificate from another state or a teaching degree
- 18 from an out-of-state teacher preparation institution who applies
- 19 for a Michigan teaching certificate only if the person passes
- 20 appropriate examinations as follows:
- (a) For a secondary level teaching certificate, pass both
- 22 the basic skills examination and the appropriate available
- 23 subject area examination for each subject area in which he or she
- 24 applies to be certified. The state board may accept passage of
- 25 an equivalent examination approved by the state board to meet 1
- 26 or both of these requirements.

- (b) For an elementary level teaching certificate, pass the 2 basic skills examination and, if it is available, the elementary 3 certification examination, and pass the appropriate available 4 subject area examination for each subject area, if any, in which 5 he or she applies to be certified. The state board may accept 6 passage of an equivalent examination approved by the state board 7 to meet 1 or more of these requirements.
- (4) Subject to subsection (6), if a person holding a teachg ing certificate from another state applies to the state board for
 the a Michigan teaching certificate and meets the requirements of
 this subsection, the state board shall issue to the person a
 Michigan professional education teaching certificate and applicable endorsements comparable to those the person holds in the
 other state, without requiring the person to pass a basic skills
 examination or the applicable subject area examination otherwise
 required under subsection (2) or (3). To be eligible to receive
 a Michigan professional education teaching certificate under this
 subsection, a person shall provide evidence satisfactory to the
 department that he or she meets all of the following
 requirements:
- 21 (a) Has taught successfully for at least 3 years in a posi-22 tion for which the person's teaching certification from the other 23 state was valid.
- (b) Has earned, after his or her initial certification in
 25 another state, at least 18 semester credit hours in a planned
 26 course of study at a state board approved institution of higher

- 1 education or has earned, at any time, a state board approved
 2 master's or doctoral degree.
- 3 (c) Has met the elementary or secondary, as applicable,
- 4 reading credit requirement established under state board rule.
- 5 (5) A person who receives a teaching certificate and
- 6 endorsement or endorsements under subsection (4) is eligible to
- 7 receive 1 or more additional endorsements comparable to endorse-
- 8 ments the person holds in another state only if the person passes
- 9 the appropriate subject area examinations required under
- 10 subsection (2) or (3).
- (6) The state board shall deny a Michigan teaching certifi-
- 12 cate to a person described in subsection (4) for fraud, material
- 13 misrepresentation, or concealment in the person's application for
- 14 a certificate or for a conviction for which a person's teaching
- 15 certificate may be revoked under section 1535a.
- (7) The department, based upon criteria recommended pursuant
- 17 to subsection (9), shall provide to state board approved teacher
- 18 education institutions state board approved guidelines and cri-
- 19 teria for use in the development or selection of a basic skills
- 20 examination and approved quidelines and criteria for use in the
- 21 development or selection of subject area examinations.
- (8) For the purposes of this section, the state board, based
- 23 upon criteria recommended pursuant to subsection (9), shall
- 24 develop, select, or develop and select 1 or more basic skills
- 25 examinations and subject area examinations. In addition, the
- 26 state board, based upon criteria recommended pursuant to

- 1 subsection (9), shall approve an elementary certification
 2 examination and a reading subject area examination.
- (9) The state board shall appoint an II-member teacher exam-3 ination advisory committee comprised of representatives of 5 approved teacher education institutions and Michigan education $oldsymbol{6}$ organizations and associations. Not more than 1/2 of the members I comprising this committee shall be certified teachers. 8 mittee shall recommend criteria to be used by the state board in 9 the development, selection, or development and selection of 1 or 10 more basic skills examinations, and criteria to be used by the 41 state board in the development, selection, or development and 12 selection of subject area examinations. In addition, the commit-13 tee shall recommend guidelines for the use and administration of 14 those examinations. The basic skills examinations referred to in 15 this subsection may be developed by the state board or selected 16 by the state board from commercially or university developed 17 examinations. In addition, an approved teacher education insti-18 tution, pursuant to quidelines and criteria described in subsection (7), may develop an examination at its own expense for 20 approval by the state board. An approved teacher education 21 institution that develops its own examination is liable for any
- (10) The state board shall appoint a 7-member standing tech24 nical advisory council comprised of persons who are experts in
 25 measurement and assessment. This council shall advise the state
 26 board and the teacher examination committee on the validity,
 27 reliability, and other technical standards of the examinations

- (II) Not later than November 30 of each year, the state 4 board shall submit in writing a report on the development or 5 selection and use of the basic skills examination, the elementary 6 certification examination, and the subject area examinations to I the house and senate education committees. The report shall also 8 contain a financial statement regarding revenue received from the 9 assessment of fees levied pursuant to subsection (13) and the 10 amount of and any purposes for which that revenue was expended. (12) The basic skills examination, the elementary certifica-1.1 12 tion examination, and the subject area examinations required by 13 this section may be taken at different times during an approved 14 teacher preparation program, but the basic skills examination 15 must be passed before a person is enrolled for student teaching 16 and the elementary certification examination and the subject area 17 examinations, as applicable, must be passed before a person is
- (13) The department, or if approved by the state board, a

 20 private testing service, may assess fees for taking the basic

 21 skills examination, elementary certification examination, and the

 22 subject area examinations. The fees, which shall be set by the

 23 state board, shall not exceed \$50.00 for a basic skills examina
 24 tion or \$75.00 for an elementary certification examination or a

 25 subject area examination. However, if a subject area examination

 26 for vocational education includes a performance examination, an

 27 additional fee may be assessed for taking the performance

- 12 issue a Michigan teaching certificate to the person after expira-

- (15) As used in this section:
- (a) "Basic skills examination" means an examination devel-
- 17 oped or selected by the state board or developed pursuant to sub-
- 18 section (9) by an approved teacher education institution for the
- 19 purpose of demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and under-
- 20 standing of basic language and mathematical skills and other
- 21 skills necessary for the certificate sought, and for determining
- 22 whether or not an applicant is eligible for a provisional
- 23 Michigan teaching certificate.
- 24 (b) "Elementary certification examination" means a compre-
- 25 hensive examination for elementary certification that has been
- 26 developed or selected by the state board for demonstrating the
- 27 applicant's knowledge and understanding of the core subjects

- I normally taught in elementary classrooms and for determining
- 2 whether or not an applicant is eligible for an elementary level
- 3 teaching certificate.
- 4 (c) "Subject area examination" means an examination related
- 5 to a specific area of certification, which examination has been
- 6 developed or selected by the state board for the purpose of
- 7 demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and understanding of the
- 8 subject matter and determining whether or not an applicant is
- 9 eligible for a Michigan teaching certificate.
- (16) The state board shall promulgate rules for the imple-
- (17) Notwithstanding any rule promulgated by the state board
- 13 to the contrary, the state board shall continue to issue state
- 14 elementary or secondary continuing education certificates pursu-
- 15 ant to R 390.1132(1) of the Michigan administrative code to per-
- 16 sons who completed the requirements of that rule by December 31,
- 17 1992 and who apply for that certificate not later than March 15,
- 18 1994. If the state board has issued a state elementary or sec-
- 19 ondary professional education certificate to a person described
- 20 in this section, the state board shall consider the person to
- 21 have a state elementary or secondary, as applicable, continuing
- 22 education certificate.
