## HOUSE BILL No. 6146

September 25, 1996, Introduced by Reps. Pitoniak, Brewer, DeMars and Parks and referred to the Committee on Local Government.

A bill to amend section 1 of chapter XI of Act No. 215 of the Public Acts of 1895, entitled as amended "The fourth class city act," as amended by Act No. 19 of the Public Acts of 1994, being section 91.1 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of chapter XI of Act No. 215 of the 2 Public Acts of 1895, as amended by Act No. 19 of the Public Acts 3 of 1994, being section 91.1 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is 4 amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER XI
6 Sec. 1. (1) A city incorporated under the provisions of 7 this act has, and the council may pass ordinances relating to, 8 the following general powers:
(a) To restrain and prevent vice and immorality, gambling, 2 noise and disturbance, and indecent or disorderly conduct or 3 assemblages; to prevent and quell riots; to preserve peace and 4 good order; and to protect the property of the city or of persons 5 in the city.

6 (b) To prohibit vagrancy, truancy, begging, public drunken7 ness, disorderly conduct, or prostitution.

8 (c) To prevent injury or annoyance from anything dangerous, 9 offensive, or unhealthy; to prohibit and remove anything tending 10 to cause or promote disease; and to prevent and abate nuisances. 11 (d) To prohibit and suppress places of disorderly conduct, 12 immorality, or vice.

13 (e) To regulate or license the use of places of
14 entertainment.
15 (E) To prohibit and suppress gambling and to authorize the 16 seizure and destruction of instruments and devices used for 17 gambling.
$18(\mathrm{~g})$ To prohibit and prevent the selling or giving of alco19 holic liquor, as defined in section 2 of the Michigan liquor con20 trol act, Act No. 8 of the Public Acts of the Extra Session of 21 1933, being section 436.2 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
(h) To regulate, restrain, or prohibit sports, exhibitions, 23 caravans, and shows for which money or other reward is demanded 24 or received, except lectures on historic, literary, or scientific subjects.

(i) To prevent the violation of the Sabbath day, or the 27 disturbance of a religious meeting, congregation, or society or

I other public meeting assembled for a lawful purpose; and to
2 require businesses to be closed on the Sabbath day.
3 (j) po license, regulate, or prohibit auctionecra, auc
4 tions, and sales by public bids or offery by buyery or sellers in
5 the manner of auctions, and to regutate-the fees to be paid by
6 and to auctioneerg. However, a license-shall not be required in
7 ease of gales required by law to be made at auetion.
$8(J)(k)$ To license, regulate, or prohibit hawking and ped9 dling and to license pawnbroking.
$10(\mathrm{~K})$ (2) To license and regulate wharf boats and to regu11 late the use of boats in and about the harbor, if any, and within 12 the jurisdiction of the city.
$13(\ell)(\mathrm{m})$ To establish, authorize, license, and regulate 14 ferries to and from the city or a place in the city; and to regu15 late and prescribe the charges and prices for the transportation 16 of persons and property by ferry.

17 (M) (n) To regulate and license taverns, houses of public 18 entertainment, saloons, restaurants, and eating nouses; and to

19 regulate and prescribe the location of saloons. This subdivision 20 does not authorize the licensing of the sale of alcoholic liquor, 21 as defined in section 2 of Act No. 8 of the Public Acts of the

22 Extra Session of 1933.
$23(N)$ tot $T o l i c e n s e$ and regulate vehicles used for the 24 transportation of persons or property for hire in the city; and 25 to regulate or fix their stands on the streets and public places 26 and at wharves, boat landings, railroad station grounds, and 27 other places.
(O) Tp) To regulate and license toll bridges within the 2 city and to prescribe the rates and charges for passage over the 3 bridges.

4 (P) (प) To provide for and regulate the inspection of 5 food.

6 (Q) (T) To regulate the inspection, weighing, and measur7 ing of brick, lumber, firewood, coal, hay, and any article of 8 merchandise.

9 (R) (Y) To provide for the inspection and sealing of 10 weights and measures and to enforce the keeping añ use of proper II weights and measures by venders.
$12(\mathrm{~S})(\mathrm{t})$ To regulate the construction, repair, and use of 13 vaults, cisterns, areas, hydrants, pumps, sewers, and gutters. $14(T)$ (U) To prohibit and prevent indecent exposure of the 15 person; the show, sale, or exhibition for sale of indecent or 16 obscene pictures, drawings, engravings, paintings, books, or pam17 phlets; and indecent or obscene exhibitions and shows. $18(\mathrm{U})(\mathrm{T}$ To regulate or prohibit bathing in the city's

19 bodies of water.
$20(V)$ (ot provide for the clearing of driftwood and nox21 ious matter from the city's bodies of water; and to prohibit and 22 prevent the depositing in the city's bodies of water of matter 23 tending to render the water impure, unwholesome, or offensive.
(W) (x) To compel the owner or occupant of any grocery, 25 tallow chandler shop, soap or candy factory, butcher shop or

26 stall, slaughter house, stable, barn, privy, sewer, or other
27 offensive, nauseous, or unwholesome place to cleanse, remove, or

1 abate it when the council considers it necessary for the health, 2 comfort, or convenience of the inhabitants of the city.
$3(X)$ (yt To regulate the keeping, selling, and using of 4 dynamite, gunpowder, firecrackers and fireworks, and other explo5 sive or combustible materials; to regulate the exhibition of

6 fireworks and the discharge of firearms; and to restrain the 7 making of fires in the streets and other open spaces in the 8 city.
$9(\mathrm{Y})(\mathrm{T})$ To direct and regulate the construction of cel10 lars, slips, barns, private drains, sinks, and privies.
$11(Z)$ (aa) To prohibit, prevent, and suppress mock auctions
12 and fraudulent games, devices, and practices. Persons managing, 13 using, or practicing; attempting to manage, use, or practice; or 14 aiding in the management or practice of a mock auction or fraudu15 lent game, device, or practice may be subject to the provisions 16 of an ordinance under this subdivision.

17 (AA) (Wb) To prohibit, prevent, and suppress lotteries for 18 the drawing or disposing of money or other property. Persons 19 maintaining, directing, or managing such lotteries or aiding in 20 the maintenance, directing, or managing of such lotteries may be 21 subject to the provisions of an ordinance under this 22 subdivision.

23 (BB) f(CC) To license and regulate solicitors for passen24 gers or for baggage to and from a hotel, tavern, public house, 25 boat, or railroad and to provide the places where they may be 26 admitted to solicit or receive patronage; and to license and 27 regulate porters, runners, and drivers of vehicles used and

1 employed for hire, to provide the places where they be admitted
2 to solicit or receive patronage, and to fix and regulate the
3 amounts and rates of their compensation.
4 (CC) To provide for the protection and care of
5 paupers.
6 (DD) teet To provide for taking a census of the inhab7 itants of the city, whenever the council sees fit, and to direct 8 and regulate the census.

9 (EE) (ff) To provide for the issuing of licenses to the 10 owners and keepers of dogs and to require the owners and keepers 11 of dogs to pay for and obtain such licenses; and to regulate and 12 prevent the running at large of dogs, to require dogs to be muz13 zled, and to authorize the killing of dogs running at large or 14 not licensed in violation of an ordinance of the city.

15 (FF) (gg) To prohibit the possession or use of toy pis16 tols, slingshots, and other dangerous toys or implements within 17 the city.

18 (GG) (hmy To require horses, mules, or other animals 19 attached to vehicles or standing in the streets, lanes, or alleys 20 in the city to be securely fastened, hitched, watched, or held 21 and to regulate the placing and provide for the preservation of 22 hitching posts.
(HH) fif To provide for and regulate the numbering of 24 buildings upon the streets and alleys; to require the owners or 25 occupants of buildings to affix numbers on the buildings; and to 26 designate and change the names of public streets, alleys, and 27 parks.

1 (II) Tjj) To provide for, establish, regulate, and 2 preserve public fountains and reservoirs within the city, and 3 troughs and basins for watering animals.

4 (JJ) (kk- To prevent or provide for the construction and 5 operation of street railways, to regulate street railways, and to 6 determine and designate the route and grade of any street railway 7 to be laid or constructed in the city.

8 (KK) (í) To establish and maintain a public library, to 9 provide a suitable building for that public library, and to aid 10 in maintaining such other public libraries as may be established 11 within the city by private beneficence as the council considers 12 to be for the public good.

13 ( $\ell \ell$ ) (mm) To license transient traders. In the case of 14 transient traders who engage in the business of selling goods or 15 merchandise after the commencement of the fiscal year, the 16 license fee may be apportioned with relation to the part of the 17 fiscal year that has expired. If such traders continue in the 18 same business after the commencement of the next fiscal year, and 19 their goods or merchandise are assessed for taxes for the next 20 fiscal year, the traders shall not be required to take out a 21 second license upon the commencement of the next fiscal year.
(2) The council may enact ordinances and make regulations, 23 consistent with the laws and constitution of the state as they 24 may consider necessary for the safety, order, and good government 25 of the city and the general welfare of the inhabitants of the 26 city, but exclusive rights, privileges, or permits shall not be 27 granted by the council.

Section 2. This amendatory act shall not take effect unless 2 all of the following bills of the 88 th Legislature are enacted 3 into law:
