

## **SENATE BILL No. 453**

April 19, 1995, Introduced by Senators MC MANUS and GAST and referred to the Committee on Agriculture and Forestry.

A bill to amend section 6 of Act No. 189 of the Public Acts of 1931, entitled as amended
"The insect pest and plant disease act,"

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Section 1. Section 6 of Act No. 189 of the Public Acts of
- 2 1931, being section 286.206 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is

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- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 6. (1) The director shall cause to be inspected at
- 5 least once each year during the growing season all nurseries in
- 6 the state to ascertain whether they are infested with insect
- 7 pests or infected with plant diseases. The director shall cause
- 8 to be inspected all nursery stock which will be stored or offered
- 9 for sale or which is stored in cellars, heeling-in grounds or
- 10 warehouses to ascertain whether it is infested with insect pests

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- I or infected with plant diseases and assess the usual AN
- 2 inspection -fees based upon the cost of making the various
- 3 inspections required from time to time FEE.
- 4 (2) If upon the inspection of any nursery stock as above
- 5 provided. it shall appear IS DETERMINED that such THE nurs-
- 6 ery stock or nursery and its premises are apparently free from
- 7 insect pests and plant diseases, and if the necessary inspection
- 8 fees which shall be assessed on the basis of the costs involved
- 9 in making the said inspection have been paid, the director shall
- 10 give or send to the owner of each nursery or OF THE nursery stock
- II or TO the person in charge of the -same NURSERY OR NURSERY STOCK
- 12 a certificate executed by the director setting forth the fact of
- 13 -such THE inspection. If any inspections are requested by any
- 14 nursery after September 1, the nursery or applicant shall pay, in
- 15 addition to the -above charges INSPECTION FEE, the expense of
- 16 -such THE inspector and mileage at the prevailing rate per mile,
- 17 as established by the state administrative board, in going to and
- 18 returning from -such THE inspection, either from Lansing or the
- 19 location of the nearest inspector.
- 20 (3) Certificates of inspection -shall expire on September
- 21 +5, +96+, and on October 31 of each year thereafter, and they
- 22 shall be ARE valid from November 1 in one 1 year to October 31
- 23 of the following year. It shall be unlawful for any
- 24 (4) A person <del>to</del> SHALL NOT sell or <del>to</del> offer for sale or
- 25 to remove or ship from a nursery or other premises any nursery
- 26 stock until -such THE NURSERY stock has been officially
- 27 inspected and a certificate or permit covering it has been

- 1 granted by the director, except that nursery stock may be shipped
- 2 to the director without -such- AN inspection and certification.
- 3 -It shall be unlawful for the director to-
- 4 (5) THE DIRECTOR SHALL NOT grant a certificate of inspection
- 5 to private landowners who are about to sell or remove trees or
- 6 plants originally supplied from the state or federal or state and
- 7 federal nurseries or by any political subdivision or its
- 8 agencies.
- 9 (6) THE DIRECTOR SHALL CHARGE AN INSPECTION FEE BASED UPON
- 10 THE COST TO THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE OF MAKING THE INSPEC-
- II TION, INCLUDING THE COSTS OF SALARIES ATTRIBUTED TO OR CONNECTED
- 12 WITH THE INSPECTIONS.
- 13 (7) THE DIRECTOR SHALL ADJUST THE SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR THE
- 14 COSTS OF MAKING THE VARIOUS INSPECTIONS OF NURSERY STOCK, PLANTS,
- 15 AND PLANT MATERIALS AS REQUIRED BY THIS ACT AND PROVIDE THAT EACH
- 16 TYPE OF FEE CHARGED IS SUFFICIENT TO COVER THE COST OF THE
- 17 INSPECTION. THE DIRECTOR SHALL REVIEW AND ADJUST ITS SCHEDULE OF
- 18 FEES FOR THE INSPECTIONS AT THE END OF EACH FISCAL YEAR. THE
- 19 DIRECTOR SHALL APPROVE ALL ADJUSTMENTS TO THE FEES BEFORE THEY
- 20 ARE ADOPTED.
