



SENATE BILL No. 506

May 4, 1995, Introduced by Senators STEIL, GAST, GEAKE, DUNASKISS, GOUGEON, CARL, CISKY and NORTH and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend sections 102 and 106 of Act No. 268 of the Public Acts of 1986, entitled as amended "Legislative council act," being sections 4.1102 and 4.1106 of the Michigan Compiled Laws; and to add section 104a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Section 1. Sections 102 and 106 of Act No. 268 of the
2 Public Acts of 1986, being sections 4.1102 and 4.1106 of the
3 Michigan Compiled Laws, are amended and section 104a is added to
4 read as follows:

5 Sec. 102. As used in this act:

6 (A) "BUREAU" MEANS THE LEGISLATIVE SERVICE BUREAU.

7 (B) "COMMISSION" MEANS THE MICHIGAN LAW REVISION COMMISSION.

8 (C) ~~(a)~~ "Council" means the legislative council.

1 ~~(b) "Bureau" means the legislative service bureau.~~

2 ~~(c) "Commission" means the Michigan law revision~~
3 ~~commission.~~

4 (D) "COUNCIL ADMINISTRATOR" MEANS THE CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE
5 OFFICER OF ALL LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AGENCIES.

6 (E) "LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AGENCIES" MEANS THE BUREAU, COMMIS-
7 SION, AND ANY OTHER LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AGENCY DESIGNATED BY THE
8 COUNCIL.

9 SEC. 104A. THE COUNCIL SHALL APPOINT A COUNCIL ADMINISTRA-
10 TOR WHO SHALL BE THE CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER OF ALL LEGISLA-
11 TIVE COUNCIL AGENCIES. THE COUNCIL ADMINISTRATOR IS AN AT-WILL
12 EMPLOYEE AND SHALL SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF THE COUNCIL. THE
13 COUNCIL ADMINISTRATOR HAS ALL THE FOLLOWING DUTIES AND
14 RESPONSIBILITIES:

15 (A) TO PROVIDE GENERAL SUPERVISORY OVERSIGHT OVER ALL LEGIS-
16 LATIVE COUNCIL AGENCIES.

17 (B) TO PROVIDE PERSONNEL POLICY OVERSIGHT AND DEVELOPMENT
18 FOR ALL LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AGENCIES.

19 (C) TO DEVELOP, PREPARE, AND PRESENT LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
20 AGENCY BUDGETS.

21 (D) TO REVIEW QUARTERLY FINANCIAL STATEMENTS OF LEGISLATIVE
22 COUNCIL AGENCIES AND MONITOR BUDGETARY COMPLIANCE.

23 (E) TO ACT AS SECRETARY TO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, INCLUD-
24 ING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE FOLLOWING:

25 (i) SCHEDULING OF MEETINGS FOR THE COUNCIL AND
26 SUBCOMMITTEES.

1 (ii) KEEPING AND RECORDING OF MINUTES AND RECORDS OF
2 MEETINGS.

3 (F) TO PERFORM OTHER DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES AS DETER-
4 MINED AND ASSIGNED BY THE COUNCIL.

5 Sec. 106. The director OF THE BUREAU shall be the
6 ~~secretary of the council and~~ chief administrative officer of
7 the bureau. With the approval of the council, the director shall
8 employ such employees as may be necessary and fix their compensa-
9 tion within the appropriation made by the legislature for this
10 purpose. Persons employed by the director shall be nontenured,
11 at-will employees. The director may discipline, transfer,
12 demote, suspend, or summarily discharge an employee. The direc-
13 tor shall have charge of the routine management of the bureau and
14 may incur such expenses as may be necessary for carrying out the
15 provisions of this act, to be paid out of appropriations made by
16 the legislature for the operation of the bureau. The council
17 shall be responsible for the general program and policies of the
18 bureau and for the preparation and enforcement of rules and regu-
19 lations concerning the services to be rendered.
