

SENATE BILL No. 678

September 26, 1995, Introduced by Senators BENNETT and SHUGARS and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend section 274 of Act No. 281 of the Public Acts of 1967, entitled

"Income tax act of 1967,"

as added by Act No. 7 of the Public Acts of 1995, being section 206.274 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Section 1. Section 274 of Act No. 281 of the Public Acts of
- 2 1967, as added by Act No. 7 of the Public Acts of 1995, being
- 3 section 206.274 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended to read
- 4 as follows:
- 5 Sec. 274. (1) For the 1995 tax year and each tax year after
- 6 the 1995 tax year and subject to the limitations in this section,
- 7 a claimant who has household income of \$200,000.00 or less and
- 8 who is a resident of this state may claim a credit against the
- 9 tax due under this act for fees uniformly required to be paid by

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- 1 all students and tuition paid by the claimant on behalf of the
- 2 claimant or any other student to a qualified institution of
- 3 higher learning.
- 4 (2) A claimant may claim a credit under this section equal
- 5 to 4% of the sum of all fees -uniformly required to be paid by
- 6 all students and tuition paid, not to exceed \$250.00 for each
- 7 student for each tax year.
- 8 (3) A credit shall not be claimed under this section for
- 9 more than 4 tax years for any 1 student.
- 10 (4) The credit under this section shall be claimed on a
- 11 separate form exclusive of any other form required by this act.
- 12 (4) -(5) The department may require reasonable proof from
- 13 the claimant in support of the fees and tuition payments claimed
- 14 under this section.
- 15 (5) $\overline{}$ (6) The department may promulgate rules pursuant to
- 16 the administrative procedures act of 1969, Act No. 306 of the
- 17 Public Acts of 1969, being sections 24.201 to 24.328 of the
- 18 Michigan Compiled Laws, TO IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION.
- 19 (6) -(7) The total amount of credits claimed IN A TAX YEAR
- 20 for tuition and fees paid by or on behalf of any 1 student shall
- 21 not exceed the maximum amount allowable under subsection (2).
- 22 (7) THE CREDIT ALLOWED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL NOT BE
- 23 CLAIMED FOR FEES OR TUITION PAID IN THE TAX YEAR BY OR ON BEHALF
- 24 OF A STUDENT WHO WAS INCARCERATED AT ANY TIME DURING THE TAX
- 25 YEAR.
- 26 (8) As used in this section:

- 1 (A) "FEES" MEANS FEES REQUIRED OF AND UNIFORMLY PAID BY ALL
- 2 STUDENTS AND THAT HAVE BEEN PROMULGATED AND PUBLISHED IN THE
- 3 CATALOG OF THE INSTITUTION.
- 4 (B) "INCARCERATED" MEANS SERVING A TERM OF IMPRISONMENT IN A
- 5 STATE, COUNTY, OR CITY JAIL OR COMMITTED TO A JUVENILE FACILITY.
- 6 (C) "JUVENILE FACILITY" MEANS THAT TERM AS DEFINED IN SEC-
- 7 TION 2 OF THE JUVENILE FACILITIES ACT, ACT NO. 73 OF THE PUBLIC
- 8 ACTS OF 1988, BEING SECTION 803.222 OF THE MICHIGAN COMPILED
- 9 LAWS.
- 10 (D) -(a) "Qualified institution of higher learning" means
- 11 an institution that meets all of the following criteria:
- (i) The institution meets the criteria for an institution of
- 13 higher learning under section 260.
- 14 (ii) The institution is located in this state.
- 15 (iii) The instructional programs of the institution are not
- 16 comprised solely of sectarian instruction or religious worship.
- 17 (iv) The institution has provided a letter of notification
- 18 to the state treasurer before July 1 of the tax year that states
- 19 that the institution will not increase FEES AND tuition rates
- 20 during the ensuing academic year by more than the annual average
- 21 percentage increase in the United States consumer price index in
- 22 the immediately preceding tax year.
- 23 (E) -(b) "Tuition" means IN-STATE tuition LESS ANY REFUNDS
- 24 OF TUITION RECEIVED BY THE CLAIMANT OR STUDENT paid for -credits
- 25 1 OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 26 (i) CREDITS for an undergraduate degree program. or
- 27 credits

- 1 (ii) CREDITS granted by a community college OR A 2-YEAR
- 2 PRIVATE COLLEGE toward a degree program or granted for the pur-
- 3 pose of transferring those credits toward an undergraduate degree
- 4 program. less any refunds of tuition received by the claimant or
- 5 student.
- 6 (F) (c) "United States consumer price index" means the
- 7 United States consumer price index for all urban consumers as
- 8 defined and reported by the United States department of labor,
- 9 bureau of labor statistics, and as certified by the state
- 10 treasurer.
