SUBSTITUTE FOR

HOUSE BILL NO. 4248

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled

"Natural resources and environmental protection act,"

by amending sections 80101, 80102, 80140, 80141, 80142, and 80146 (MCL 324.80101, 324.80102,

324.80140, 324.80141, 324.80142, and 324.80146), sections 80101, 80102, 80140, 80141, and 80146

as added by 1995 PA 58 and section 80142 as amended by 1996 PA 174, and by adding sections 80109a, 80140a, 80140b, 80140c, 80140d, 80140e, 80140f, 80140g, 80140h, and 80142a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 80101. As used in this part:

2 (a) "Anchored rafts" means all types of nonpowered rafts
3 used for recreational purposes that are anchored seasonally on
4 waters of this state.

5 (b) "Associated equipment" means any of the following that6 are not radio equipment:

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(i) An original system, part, or component of a boat at the
 time that boat was manufactured, or a similar part or component
 manufactured or sold for replacement.

4 (*ii*) Repair or improvement of an original or replacement5 system, part, or component.

6 (*iii*) An accessory or equipment for, or appurtenance to, a7 boat.

8 (*iv*) A marine safety article, accessory, or equipment9 intended for use by a person on board a boat.

10 (c) "Boat" means a vessel.

11 (d) "Boat livery" means a business that holds a vessel for12 renting, leasing, or chartering.

13 (E) "BOATING SAFETY CERTIFICATE" MEANS A DOCUMENT ISSUED
14 UNDER THIS PART THAT CERTIFIES THAT THE INDIVIDUAL NAMED IN THE
15 CERTIFICATE HAS SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED A BOATING SAFETY COURSE.

16 (F) "BOATING SAFETY COURSE" MEANS A COURSE APPROVED BY THE 17 DEPARTMENT THAT PROVIDES INSTRUCTION ON THE SAFE OPERATION OF A 18 VESSEL AND THAT MEETS OR EXCEEDS THE GUIDELINES ESTABLISHED BY 19 THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF STATE BOATING LAW ADMINISTRATORS 20 (OCTOBER, 1996).

(G) (e) "Controlled substance" means that term as defined
in section 7104 of the public health code, Act No. 368 of the
Public Acts of 1978, being section 333.7104 of the Michigan
Compiled Laws 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.7104.

25 (H) (f) "Conviction" means a final conviction, the payment
26 of a fine, a plea of guilty or nolo contendere if accepted by the
27 court, a finding of guilt, or a [probate FAMILY DIVISION OF CIRCUIT] court disposition on a

4 (a) "Dealer" means a person and an authorized representative
5 of that person who annually purchases from a manufacturer, or who
6 is engaged in selling or manufacturing, 6 or more vessels that
7 require certificates of number under this part.

8 (b) "Identification document" means any of the following:
9 (i) A valid Michigan operator's or chauffeur's license.

10 (*ii*) A valid driver's or chauffeur's license issued by an 11 agency, department, or bureau of the United States or another 12 state.

13 (*iii*) An official identification card issued by an agency,
14 department, or bureau of the United States, this state, or
15 another state.

16 (*iv*) An official identification card issued by a political17 subdivision of this state or another state.

18 (c) "Issuing authority" means the United States coast guard
19 or a state that has a numbering system approved by the United
20 States coast guard.

(d) "Law of another state" means a law or ordinance enacted
22 by another state or by a local unit of government in another
23 state.

(e) "Lifeboat" means a small boat designated and used solely
for lifesaving purposes, and does not include a dinghy, tender,
speedboat, or other type of craft that is not carried aboard a
vessel for lifesaving purposes.

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(f) "Long-term incapacitating injury" means an injury that
 causes serious impairment of a body function.

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3 (G) "RESIDENCY" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL HAS A SETTLED OR PER4 MANENT HOME OR DOMICILE WITHIN THIS STATE AND INTENDS TO REMAIN
5 IN THIS STATE.

6 SEC. 80109A. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY RULE PROMULGATED UNDER
7 THIS ACT, A VESSEL LESS THAN 40 FEET IN LENGTH IS NOT REQUIRED TO
8 BE EQUIPPED WITH A FOG BELL.

9 Sec. 80140. (1) In order to protect the public interest in 10 the prudent and equitable use of the waters of this state and to 11 enhance the enjoyment of pleasure boating and other recreational 12 water sports on the waters of the state, the department shall 13 establish and pursue comprehensive educational programs designed 14 to advance boating and general water safety.

15 (2) The department shall <u>put into effect</u> ESTABLISH a pro-16 gram to train <u>youthful</u> CERTAIN boat operators and shall issue a 17 boating safety certificate to those who satisfactorily complete 18 the program. For the purpose of <u>giving</u> PROVIDING the courses 19 of instruction and awarding boating safety certificates, the 20 department may designate as its agent any person it considers 21 qualified to act in this capacity. A <u>charge</u> FEE shall not be 22 <u>made</u> CHARGED for any instruction given or for the award of 23 boating safety certificates TO INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE LESS THAN 17 24 YEARS OF AGE.

25 (3) AS USED IN THIS SECTION AND SECTIONS 80140C AND 80140D,
26 "PERSON" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL, PARTNERSHIP, CORPORATION,
27 ASSOCIATION, GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY, OR OTHER LEGAL ENTITY.

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SEC. 80140A. (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SECTIONS 80140F AND
 80141, BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 1999, AN INDIVIDUAL BORN ON OR AFTER
 JANUARY 1, 1979 SHALL NOT OPERATE A VESSEL UPON THE WATERS OF
 THIS STATE UNLESS THAT INDIVIDUAL HAS IN HIS OR HER IMMEDIATE
 POSSESSION A BOATING SAFETY CERTIFICATE ISSUED IN ACCORDANCE WITH
 THIS PART.

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7 (2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE A BOATING SAFETY CERTIFICATE
8 TO AN INDIVIDUAL AFTER THE INDIVIDUAL HAS DONE 1 OF THE
9 FOLLOWING:

10 (A) SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETES A DEPARTMENT APPROVED BOATING
11 SAFETY COURSE AND PASSES AN EXAMINATION THAT IS ADMINISTERED IN
12 PERSON AND PROCTORED BY THE DEPARTMENT OR AN AGENT OF THE
13 DEPARTMENT.

14 (B) UNTIL DECEMBER 31, 2001, ESTABLISHES RESIDENCY IN THIS
15 STATE AND PRESENTS TO THE DEPARTMENT A VALID BOAT OPERATOR'S
16 LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE FROM ANOTHER STATE.

17 (3) A BOATING SAFETY CERTIFICATE ISSUED UNDER THIS PART IS
18 VALID FOR THE LIFE OF THE INDIVIDUAL WHO EARNED THE CERTIFICATE.
19 (4) BEGINNING ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE AMENDATORY ACT
20 THAT ADDED THIS SUBSECTION, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL CONSIDER THE
21 NUMBER OF EXAMINATIONS THAT ARE ADMINISTERED OR PROCTORED UNDER
22 THIS SECTION WHEN CALCULATING THE STATE AID TO COUNTIES UNDER
23 SECTION 80117.

24 SEC. 80140B. (1) A PERSON APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT UNDER
25 SECTION 80140(2) MAY OFFER A BOATING SAFETY COURSE THAT IS
26 APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT. SUBJECT TO SECTION 80140C, THE
27 COURSE MAY BE A HOME STUDY COURSE.

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(2) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS 17 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER MAY BE
 CHARGED A FEE FOR THE INSTRUCTION OR MATERIALS RECEIVED DURING A
 BOATING SAFETY COURSE.

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4 (3) A PERSON SHALL NOT ISSUE A BOATING SAFETY CERTIFICATE
5 BASED ON THE COMPLETION OF A HOME STUDY COURSE TO AN INDIVIDUAL
6 WHO IS LESS THAN 17 YEARS OF AGE.

7 SEC. 80140C. A PERSON WHO IS APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT
8 UNDER SECTION 80140(2) MAY OFFER A VIDEO OR HOME STUDY BOATING
9 SAFETY COURSE THAT IS APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

SEC. 80140D. (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 80140B(3), A
PERSON WHO OFFERS A BOATING SAFETY COURSE UNDER THIS PART SHALL
PROVIDE A BOATING SAFETY CERTIFICATE TO EACH INDIVIDUAL WHO SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETES THE COURSE.

14 (2) UNTIL DECEMBER 31, 2001, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE A
15 BOATING SAFETY CERTIFICATE TO A PERSON WHO ESTABLISHES RESIDENCY
16 IN THIS STATE AND WHO PRESENTS TO THE DEPARTMENT A VALID BOAT
17 OPERATOR'S LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE FROM ANOTHER STATE.

18 SEC. 80140E. (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SECTIONS 80140F AND
19 80141, BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 1999, AN INDIVIDUAL BORN ON OR AFTER
20 JANUARY 1, 1979 WHO OPERATES A VESSEL ON THE WATERS OF THIS STATE
21 SHALL DISPLAY HIS OR HER BOATING SAFETY CERTIFICATE UPON THE
22 DEMAND OF ANY PEACE OFFICER WHO IDENTIFIES HIMSELF OR HERSELF AS
23 A PEACE OFFICER.

24 (2) A PEACE OFFICER SHALL NOT STOP A VESSEL SOLELY FOR THE
25 PURPOSE OF DETERMINING WHETHER THE OPERATOR HAS IN HIS OR HER
26 POSSESSION A BOATING SAFETY CERTIFICATE.

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1 (3) A PEACE OFFICER MAY STOP A VESSEL IF THE PEACE OFFICER
2 HAS [] CAUSE TO BELIEVE THAT AN OFFENSE
3 INVOLVING THE VESSEL HAS BEEN OR IS BEING COMMITTED AND THE STOP4 PING OF THE VESSEL DOES NOT VIOLATE STATE OR FEDERAL CONSTITU5 TIONAL PROTECTIONS OF PERSONS AND PROPERTY. A PEACE OFFICER MAY
6 SEARCH A VESSEL PURSUANT TO A VALID SEARCH WARRANT, OR WITHOUT A
7 WARRANT IF CONDITIONS EXIST THAT FALL WITHIN AN EXCEPTION TO THE
8 WARRANT REQUIREMENT OR IF THE PEACE OFFICER WITNESSES A VIOLATION
9 OF THIS PART OR A LOCAL ORDINANCE CORRESPONDING TO THIS PART.

10 SEC. 80140F. THE FOLLOWING INDIVIDUALS ARE EXEMPT FROM THE 11 REQUIREMENTS OF SECTIONS 80140A AND 80140E:

12 (A) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HOLDS A VALID PILOT'S LICENSE AS THAT13 TERM IS DEFINED UNDER PART 445.

14 (B) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS OPERATING A VESSEL THAT IS EXEMPT15 FROM REGISTRATION UNDER THIS PART PURSUANT TO SECTION 80123.

16 (C) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS OPERATING A PERSONAL WATERCRAFT.
17 (D) UNTIL DECEMBER 31, 2001, AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS A VALID
18 BOAT OPERATOR'S LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE FROM HIS OR HER STATE OF
19 RESIDENCE.

20 (E) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS BETWEEN THE AGES OF 12 AND 18 AND
21 WHO HAS PASSED A BOATING SAFETY COURSE AND POSSESSES A BOATING
22 SAFETY CERTIFICATE.

23 SEC. 80140G. (1) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO VIOLATES SECTION 80133,
24 80141, 80145, 80147, 80152, 80176, OR 80196 SHALL PARTICIPATE IN
25 A BOATING SAFETY COURSE.

26 (2) PARTICIPATION IN A BOATING SAFETY COURSE IS IN ADDITION27 TO ANY OTHER PENALTIES IMPOSED BY THIS PART.

[SEC. 80140H. AS USED IN A RULE PROMULGATED UNDER THIS PART, "HIGH-SPEED BOATING" MEANS A SPEED AT OR ABOVE WHICH A MOTORBOAT REACHES A PLANING CONDITION.]

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1 Sec. 80141. (1) Except as otherwise provided in 2 -subsection (4) THIS PART, a person less than -12 14 years of 3 age shall not operate a motorboat on the waters of this state **4** unless all of the following conditions are met:

5 (A) HE OR SHE IS IN POSSESSION OF A BOATING SAFETY CERTIFI-6 CATE ISSUED IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 80140D.

7 (B) -(a) He or she is under the direct supervision of a 8 person on board the motorboat who is 16 years of age or older AND 9 WHO IS IN POSSESSION OF A BOATING SAFETY CERTIFICATE ISSUED IN 10 ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 80140D.

(C) -(b) The motorboat he or she operates is powered by a 11 **12** motor or motors totaling no more than 35 horsepower.

(2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (4), a person 13 **14** -12 14 through -15 17 years of age may operate a motorboat on 15 the waters of this state only if that person - complies with 16 either of the following: (a) He or she is accompanied by at 17 least 1 person 16 years of age or older. (b) He or she is in 18 possession of a boating safety certificate issued after he or she

19 has satisfactorily completed a department approved <u>course in</u> 20 boating safety COURSE.

(3) A person -12 14 through -15 17 years of age operating 21 **22** a motorboat pursuant to subsection -(2)(b) (2) shall present the 23 boating safety certificate issued to him or her upon the demand 24 of any peace officer.

(4) This section does not apply to the operation of a motor-25 26 boat that is powered by a motor or motors totaling no more than 6 **27** horsepower.

[Sec. 80142. (1) Except as provided in subsection (3), a person shall not operate a vessel on the waters of this state unless

person shall not operate a vessel on the waters of this state unless each person in an open deck area on board the vessel who is less than 6-12 years of age is wearing a type I or type II personal flotation device as described in R 281.1234 of the Michigan administrative code. (2) A parent or guardian of a child less than -6-12 years of age who accompanies that child on board a vessel that is not a charter boat described in subsection (3) shall ensure that the child is wearing a personal flotation device that complies with this section.

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either of the following:

(a) A valid certificate of inspection issued by the United States coast guard that verifies the charter boat's compliance with subchapter H or subchapter T of the code of federal regulations, 46 C.F.R. 70.01-1 to 80.40 and 175.01-1 to 185.30-30. (b) A valid certificate of inspection issued by the department

for a class C vessel that is greater than 45 feet in length. (4) As used in this section, "charter boat" and "class C vessel" mean those terms as defined in section 44501. (5) A person who violates this section is responsible for a state civil infraction and may be ordered to pay a civil fine of not more than \$100.00.]

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SEC. 80142A. (1) AN INDIVIDUAL SHALL NOT USE A VESSEL THAT
 IS OF A TYPE OR CONFIGURATION NOT DEFINED UNDER R 281.1240 TO
 R 281.1252 OF THE MICHIGAN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE ON THE WATERS OF
 THIS STATE UNLESS AT LEAST 1 TYPE I, TYPE II, TYPE III, OR TYPE
 IV PERSONAL FLOTATION DEVISE AS DESCRIBED IN R 281.1234 OF THE
 MICHIGAN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE IS ON BOARD THE VESSEL FOR EACH
 PERSON WHO IS USING THE VESSEL.

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8 (2) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS OPERATING A VESSEL SHALL NOT PERMIT
9 AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS LESS THAN 12 YEARS OF AGE TO TRAVEL ON BOARD
10 A VESSEL DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (1) ON THE WATERS OF THIS STATE
11 UNLESS THE INDIVIDUAL WHO IS LESS THAN 12 YEARS OF AGE IS WEARING
12 A TYPE I OR TYPE II FLOTATION DEVICE AS DESCRIBED IN R 281.1234
13 OF THE MICHIGAN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE.

Sec. 80146. (1) The department may promulgate rules to setablish maximum motorboat speed limits or to allow unlimited motorboat speed on the waters of this state.

(2) On waters of this state for which a motorboat speed limit is not established under subsection (1), on any waters for y which the department has not established an unlimited motorboat speed limit, or on any waters for which stricter speed restrictions are not established pursuant to an act, a maximum speed limit of 55 miles per hour is established, except in an emergency and except for <u>authorized</u> peace <u>and conservation</u> officers when engaged in official duties. The maximum speed limit of 55 miles per hour shall not apply to the Great Lakes and Lake St. Clair, except for an area within 1 mile of the shoreline measured at a right angle from the shoreline. Upon receipt of a

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1 resolution by the governing body of a local unit of government **2** having jurisdiction over waters of this state requesting a reduc-3 tion in the maximum speed limit on those waters, the department, 4 pursuant to sections 80108 to 80113, may establish a maximum 5 speed limit not to exceed 40 miles per hour on those waters.

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(3) A person AN INDIVIDUAL shall not operate a motorboat 6 7 on the waters of this state at a speed greater than slow--no wake 8 speed or the minimum speed necessary for the motorboat to main-9 tain forward movement when within 100 feet of the shoreline where **10** the water depth is less than 3 feet, as determined by vertical 11 measurement, except in navigable channels not otherwise posted. (4) A person operating a motorboat in violation of this sec-12

13 tion is guilty of reckless operation of a motorboat punishable as 14 provided in section 80171.

15 (5) The department may waive this section and section 80156 16 for marine events authorized by the department under section **17** 80164.

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
