SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5229

A bill to amend 1979 PA 94, entitled "The state school aid act of 1979," by amending section 104a (MCL 388.1704a), as amended by 1997 PA 24.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 104a. (1) In order to receive state aid under this
- 2 act, a district shall comply with this section and shall -award a
- 3 state-endorsed high school diploma to an eligible graduate as
- 4 provided in this section ADMINISTER STATE ASSESSMENTS TO HIGH
- 5 SCHOOL PUPILS IN THE SUBJECT AREAS OF COMMUNICATIONS SKILLS,
- 6 MATHEMATICS, SCIENCE, AND, BEGINNING WITH PUPILS SCHEDULED TO
- 7 GRADUATE IN 2000, SOCIAL STUDIES. THE DISTRICT SHALL INCLUDE ON
- 8 THE PUPIL'S HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPT ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:

- 1 (A) FOR EACH HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATE WHO HAS COMPLETED A
- 2 SUBJECT AREA ASSESSMENT UNDER THIS SECTION, THE PUPIL'S SCALED
- 3 SCORE ON THE ASSESSMENT.
- 4 (B) IF THE PUPIL'S SCALED SCORE ON A SUBJECT AREA ASSESSMENT
- 5 FALLS WITHIN THE RANGE REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (2) FOR A CATE-
- 6 GORY ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (2), AN INDICATION THAT THE
- 7 PUPIL HAS ACHIEVED STATE ENDORSEMENT FOR THAT SUBJECT AREA.
- 8 (C) THE NUMBER OF SCHOOL DAYS THE PUPIL WAS IN ATTENDANCE AT
- 9 SCHOOL EACH SCHOOL YEAR DURING HIGH SCHOOL AND THE TOTAL NUMBER
- 10 OF SCHOOL DAYS IN SESSION FOR EACH OF THOSE SCHOOL YEARS.
- 11 (2) For pupils scheduled to graduate in 1997, if a pupil
- 12 achieves the outcomes required by the state board, as measured by
- 13 an assessment developed under subsection (7), for a
- 14 state-endorsed high school diploma, or meets the requirements
- 15 described in former subsection (1)(c) for a state-endorsed high
- 16 school diploma, in 1 or more of the subject areas of communica-
- 17 tions skills, mathematics, and science, the pupil's district
- 18 shall award a state endorsement on the pupil's diploma in each of
- 19 the subject areas in which the pupil demonstrated the required
- 20 proficiency. Beginning with pupils scheduled to graduate in
- 21 1998, if a pupil achieves the objectives required by the state
- 22 board, as measured by an assessment instrument developed under
- 23 subsection (7), for a state-endorsed high school diploma in 1 or
- 24 more of the subject areas of communications skills, mathematics,
- 25 science, and, beginning with pupils scheduled to graduate in
- 26 2000, social studies, the pupil's district shall award a state
- 27 endorsement on the pupil's diploma in each of the subject areas

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- 1 in which the pupil demonstrated the required proficiency. A
- 2 district shall not award a state endorsement to a pupil unless
- 3 the pupil meets the applicable requirements for the endorsement,

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- 4 as described in this subsection. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP
- 5 SCALED SCORES FOR REPORTING SUBJECT AREA ASSESSMENT RESULTS FOR
- **6** EACH OF THE SUBJECT AREAS UNDER THIS SECTION. SUBJECT TO APPROVAL BY THE STATE BOARD, THE SUPERINTENDENT
- 7 OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION SHALL ESTABLISH 3 CATEGORIES FOR EACH
- 8 SUBJECT AREA INDICATING BASIC COMPETENCY, ABOVE AVERAGE, AND OUT-
- 9 STANDING, AND SHALL ESTABLISH THE SCALED SCORE RANGE REQUIRED FOR
- 10 EACH CATEGORY. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DESIGN AND DISTRIBUTE TO
- 11 DISTRICTS, INTERMEDIATE DISTRICTS, AND NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS A SIMPLE
- 12 AND CONCISE DOCUMENT THAT DESCRIBES THESE CATEGORIES IN EACH
- 13 SUBJECT AREA AND INDICATES THE SCALED SCORE RANGES FOR EACH CATE-
- 14 GORY IN EACH SUBJECT AREA. A school district may award a high
- 15 school diploma to a pupil who successfully completes local dis-
- 16 trict requirements established in accordance with state law for
- 17 high school graduation, regardless of whether the pupil is eligi-
- 18 ble for any state endorsement.
- 19 (3) THE ASSESSMENTS ADMINISTERED FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS
- 20 SECTION SHALL BE ADMINISTERED TO PUPILS DURING THE LAST 30 SCHOOL
- 21 DAYS OF GRADE 11. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ENSURE THAT THE ASSESS-
- 22 MENTS ARE SCORED AND THE SCORES ARE RETURNED TO PUPILS, THEIR
- 23 PARENTS OR LEGAL GUARDIANS, AND DISTRICTS NOT LATER THAN THE
- 24 BEGINNING OF THE PUPIL'S FIRST SEMESTER OF GRADE 12. NOT LATER
- 25 THAN FALL 1999, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ARRANGE FOR THOSE PORTIONS
- 26 OF A PUPIL'S ASSESSMENT THAT CANNOT BE SCORED MECHANICALLY TO BE
- 27 SCORED IN MICHIGAN BY PERSONS WHO ARE MICHIGAN TEACHERS, RETIRED

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- 1 MICHIGAN TEACHERS, OR MICHIGAN SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS AND WHO HAVE
- 2 BEEN TRAINED IN SCORING THE ASSESSMENTS. THE RETURNED SCORES
- 3 SHALL INDICATE THE PUPIL'S SCALED SCORE FOR EACH SUBJECT AREA
- 4 ASSESSMENT, THE RANGE OF SCALED SCORES FOR EACH SUBJECT AREA, AND
- 5 THE RANGE OF SCALED SCORES REQUIRED FOR EACH CATEGORY ESTABLISHED
- 6 UNDER SUBSECTION (2). IN REPORTING THE SCORES TO PUPILS, PAR-
- 7 ENTS, AND SCHOOLS, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE SPECIFIC, MEAN-
- 8 INGFUL, AND TIMELY FEEDBACK ON THE PUPIL'S PERFORMANCE ON THE
- 9 ASSESSMENT.
- 10 (4) (3) A pupil who does not achieve the requirements of
- 11 subsection (2) may be reevaluated each school year until the
- 12 pupil achieves an applicable requirement for a state-endorsed
- 13 diploma. In addition FOR EACH PUPIL WHO DOES NOT ACHIEVE STATE
- 14 ENDORSEMENT IN 1 OR MORE SUBJECT AREAS, the board of the district
- 15 in which the pupil is enrolled shall provide that there be at
- 16 least 1 meeting attended by at least the pupil and a member of
- 17 the district's staff or a local or intermediate district consul-
- 18 tant who is proficient in the measurement and evaluation of
- 19 pupils. The district may provide the meeting as a group meeting
- 20 for pupils in similar circumstances. If the pupil is a minor,
- 21 the district shall invite and encourage the pupil's parent, legal
- 22 guardian, or person in loco parentis to attend the meeting and
- 23 shall mail a notice of the meeting to the pupil's parent, legal
- 24 guardian, or person in loco parentis. The purpose of this meet-
- 25 ing and any subsequent meeting under this subsection shall be to
- 26 determine an educational program for the pupil designed to have
- 27 the pupil reach proficiency ACHIEVE STATE ENDORSEMENT in each

- 1 subject or skill area in which he or she was assessed by the
- 2 testing as not proficient DID NOT ACHIEVE STATE ENDORSEMENT. In

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- 3 addition, a district may provide for subsequent meetings with the
- 4 pupil conducted by a high school counselor or teacher designated
- 5 by the pupil's high school principal, and shall invite and
- 6 encourage the pupil's parent, legal guardian, or person in loco
- 7 parentis to attend the subsequent meetings. The district shall
- 8 provide special programs for the pupil or develop a program using
- 9 the educational programs regularly provided by the district
- 10 unless the board of the district decides otherwise and publishes
- 11 and explains its decision in a public justification report.
- 12 (5) A pupil may be reevaluated WHO WANTS TO REPEAT AN
- 13 ASSESSMENT ADMINISTERED UNDER THIS SECTION MAY REPEAT THE ASSESS-
- 14 MENT, WITHOUT CHARGE TO THE PUPIL, IN THE NEXT SCHOOL YEAR OR
- 15 AFTER GRADUATION. AN INDIVIDUAL MAY REPEAT AN ASSESSMENT at any
- 16 time the district administers an applicable assessment instrument
- 17 OR DURING A RETESTING PERIOD UNDER SUBSECTION (7).
- 18 (4) For a state-endorsed diploma, a pupil must achieve the
- 19 requirements of subsection (2) in addition to any other require-
- 20 ments established by law or by the board of a district for a high
- 21 school diploma. If the board of a district determines that a
- 22 pupil qualifies for a state-endorsed diploma, the board shall
- 23 indicate on the pupil's high school diploma and transcript that
- 24 the pupil achieved the proficiency necessary for receipt of a
- 25 state-endorsed diploma.
- 26 (6) (5) An individual may repeat any of the tests or
- 27 assessment instruments specified in subsection (2) at any time

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- 1 the district regularly offers the test or assessment. If an
- 2 individual described in this subsection achieves the requirements
- 3 of subsection (2) and completes all other applicable requirements
- 4 for a high school diploma, the individual shall be awarded a
- 5 state-endorsed diploma as otherwise provided in this section.
- 6 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ENSURE THAT THE LENGTH OF THE ASSESSMENTS
- 7 USED FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION AND THE COMBINED TOTAL TIME
- 8 NECESSARY TO ADMINISTER ALL OF THE ASSESSMENTS, INCLUDING SOCIAL
- 9 STUDIES, ARE THE SHORTEST POSSIBLE THAT WILL STILL MAINTAIN THE
- 10 DEGREE OF RELIABILITY AND VALIDITY OF THE ASSESSMENT RESULTS
- 11 DETERMINED NECESSARY BY THE DEPARTMENT. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL
- 12 ENSURE THAT THE MAXIMUM TOTAL COMBINED LENGTH OF TIME THAT
- 13 SCHOOLS ARE REQUIRED TO SET ASIDE FOR ADMINISTRATION OF ALL OF
- 14 THE ASSESSMENTS USED FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, INCLUDING
- 15 SOCIAL STUDIES, DOES NOT EXCEED 8 HOURS. HOWEVER, THIS SUBSEC-
- 16 TION DOES NOT LIMIT THE AMOUNT OF TIME THAT INDIVIDUALS MAY HAVE
- 17 TO COMPLETE THE ASSESSMENTS.
- 18 (7) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH, SCHEDULE, AND ARRANGE
- 19 PERIODIC RETESTING PERIODS THROUGHOUT THE YEAR FOR INDIVIDUALS
- 20 WHO DESIRE TO REPEAT AN ASSESSMENT UNDER THIS SECTION. THE
- 21 DEPARTMENT SHALL COORDINATE THE ARRANGEMENTS FOR ADMINISTERING
- 22 THE REPEAT ASSESSMENTS AND SHALL ENSURE THAT THE RETESTING IS
- 23 MADE AVAILABLE AT LEAST WITHIN EACH INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT AND, TO
- 24 THE EXTENT POSSIBLE, WITHIN EACH DISTRICT.
- 25 (8) $\frac{(6)}{(6)}$ A district shall provide accommodations to a pupil
- 26 with disabilities for the proficiency testing or assessment
- 27 ASSESSMENTS required under this section, as provided under

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- 1 section 504 of title V of the rehabilitation act of 1973, Public
- 2 Law 93-112, 29 U.S.C. 794; subtitle A of title II of the
- 3 Americans with disabilities act of 1990, Public Law 101-336, 42
- $\boldsymbol{4}$ U.S.C. 12131 to 12134; and the implementing regulations for those
- 5 statutes.
- (9) $\overline{(7)}$ For the purposes of this section, the state board
- 7 shall develop or select and approve assessment instruments to
- 8 determine pupil proficiency MEASURE PUPIL PERFORMANCE in commu-
- 9 nications skills, mathematics, social studies, and science. The
- 10 assessment instruments shall be based on the state board model
- 11 core academic content standards objectives.
- 12 (10) $\overline{(8)}$ Upon written request by the pupil's parent or
- 13 legal guardian stating that the request is being made for the
- 14 purpose of providing the pupil with an opportunity to qualify to
- 15 take 1 or more postsecondary courses as an eligible student under
- 16 the postsecondary enrollment options act, 1996 PA 160, MCL
- 17 388.511 to 388.524, the board of a district shall allow a pupil
- 18 who is in at least grade 10 to take a test or AN assessment
- 19 described in subsection (2) ADMINISTERED UNDER THIS SECTION
- 20 without charge at any time the district regularly administers the
- 21 test or assessment or administers a retest of the test or
- 22 assessment DURING A RETESTING PERIOD ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSEC-
- 23 TION (7). A district is not required to include in an annual
- 24 education report, or in any other report submitted to the depart-
- 25 ment for accreditation purposes, results of tests or assess-
- 26 ments taken under this subsection by a pupil in grade 10 11 or

- 1 lower UNTIL THE RESULTS OF THAT PUPIL'S GRADUATING CLASS ARE
- 2 OTHERWISE REPORTED.
- 3 (11) $\frac{(9)}{}$ All assessment instruments developed or selected
- 4 and approved by the state under any statute or rule for a purpose
- 5 related to K to 12 education shall be objective-oriented and con-
- 6 sistent with the state board model core academic content stan-
- 7 dards objectives.
- 8 (12) (10) Upon payment of a reasonable fee any person may,
- 9 after graduation from high school, retake the state-endorsed
- 10 diploma test and, upon demonstrating the required proficiency in
- 11 a subject area, have his or her high school diploma
- 12 state-endorsed for that subject area. A PERSON WHO HAS GRADUATED
- 13 FROM HIGH SCHOOL AFTER 1996 AND WHO HAS NOT PREVIOUSLY TAKEN AN
- 14 ASSESSMENT UNDER THIS SECTION MAY TAKE AN ASSESSMENT USED FOR THE
- 15 PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, WITHOUT CHARGE TO THE PERSON, AT THE
- 16 DISTRICT FROM WHICH HE OR SHE GRADUATED FROM HIGH SCHOOL AT ANY
- 17 TIME THAT DISTRICT ADMINISTERS THE ASSESSMENT OR DURING A RETEST-
- 18 ING PERIOD SCHEDULED UNDER SUBSECTION (7) AND HAVE HIS OR HER
- 19 SCALED SCORE ON THE ASSESSMENT INCLUDED ON HIS OR HER HIGH SCHOOL
- 20 TRANSCRIPT. IF THE PERSON'S SCALED SCORE ON A SUBJECT AREA
- 21 ASSESSMENT FALLS WITHIN THE RANGE REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (2)
- 22 FOR A CATEGORY ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (2), THE DISTRICT
- 23 SHALL ALSO INDICATE ON THE PERSON'S HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPT THAT
- 24 THE PERSON HAS ACHIEVED STATE ENDORSEMENT FOR THAT SUBJECT AREA.
- 25 (13) NOT LATER THAN JULY 1 OF EACH YEAR UNTIL 2000, THE
- 26 DEPARTMENT SHALL SUBMIT A COMPREHENSIVE REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE

- 1 ON THE STATUS OF THE ASSESSMENT PROGRAM UNDER THIS SECTION. THE
- 2 REPORT SHALL INCLUDE AT LEAST ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 3 (A) THE ANNUAL PUPIL ASSESSMENT DATA.
- 4 (B) A DESCRIPTION OF THE FEEDBACK PROVIDED TO PUPILS, PAR-
- 5 ENTS, AND SCHOOLS.
- 6 (C) A DESCRIPTION OF ANY SIGNIFICANT ALTERATIONS MADE IN THE
- 7 PROGRAM BY THE DEPARTMENT OR STATE BOARD DURING THE PERIOD COV-
- 8 ERED BY THE REPORT.
- 9 (D) ANY RECOMMENDATIONS BY THE DEPARTMENT OR STATE BOARD FOR
- 10 LEGISLATIVE CHANGES TO THE PROGRAM.
- 11 (E) AN UPDATE OF THE REPORTS OF THE ASSESSMENT ADVISORY COM-
- 12 MITTEES OF THE STATE BOARD.
- 13 (14) PUPILS SCHEDULED TO GRADUATE IN 1998 WHO TOOK THE
- 14 ASSESSMENTS USED FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION DURING THE
- 15 1996-97 SCHOOL YEAR MAY REPEAT 1 OR MORE OF THE ASSESSMENTS
- 16 DURING THE 1997-98 SCHOOL YEAR. THE DEPARTMENT, IN COOPERATION
- 17 WITH DISTRICTS, SHALL MAKE ARRANGEMENTS FOR REPEAT ASSESSMENTS TO
- 18 BE AVAILABLE FOR THESE PUPILS IN EACH DISTRICT THAT OPERATES A
- 19 HIGH SCHOOL DURING THE 1997-98 SCHOOL YEAR IN TIME FOR THESE
- 20 PUPILS TO REPEAT THE ASSESSMENTS BEFORE GRADUATION. THE REPEAT
- 21 ASSESSMENTS MAY BE ADMINISTERED AT TIMES OTHER THAN REGULAR
- 22 SCHOOL HOURS.
- 23 (15) A CHILD WHO IS A STUDENT IN A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL OR HOME
- 24 SCHOOL MAY TAKE AN ASSESSMENT UNDER THIS SECTION. TO TAKE AN
- 25 ASSESSMENT, A CHILD WHO IS A STUDENT IN A HOME SCHOOL SHALL CON-
- 26 TACT THE DISTRICT IN WHICH THE CHILD RESIDES, AND THAT DISTRICT
- 27 SHALL ADMINISTER THE ASSESSMENT, OR THE CHILD MAY TAKE THE

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- 1 ASSESSMENT AT A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL IF ALLOWED BY THE NONPUBLIC
- 2 SCHOOL. UPON REQUEST FROM A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL, THE DEPARTMENT
- 3 SHALL SUPPLY ASSESSMENTS AND THE NONPUBLIC SCHOOL MAY ADMINISTER
- 4 THE ASSESSMENT.
- 5 (16) THE PURPOSE OF THE ASSESSMENT UNDER THIS SECTION IS TO
- 6 ASSESS PUPIL PERFORMANCE IN MATHEMATICS, SCIENCE, SOCIAL STUDIES,
- 7 AND COMMUNICATION ARTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPROVING ACADEMIC
- 8 ACHIEVEMENT AND ESTABLISHING A STATEWIDE STANDARD OF COMPETENCY.
- 9 THE ASSESSMENT UNDER THIS SECTION PROVIDES A COMMON MEASURE OF
- 10 DATA THAT WILL CONTRIBUTE TO THE IMPROVEMENT OF MICHIGAN SCHOOLS'
- 11 CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION BY ENCOURAGING ALIGNMENT WITH
- 12 MICHIGAN'S CURRICULUM FRAMEWORK STANDARDS. THESE STANDARDS ARE
- 13 BASED UPON THE EXPECTATIONS OF WHAT PUPILS SHOULD KNOW AND BE
- 14 ABLE TO DO BY THE END OF GRADE 11.
- (17) AS USED IN THIS SECTION: 15
- 16 (A) "COMMUNICATIONS SKILLS" MEANS READING AND WRITING.
- (B) "SOCIAL STUDIES" MEANS GEOGRAPHY, HISTORY, ECONOMICS, 17
- 18 AND AMERICAN GOVERNMENT.
