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1 (i) "Unemployed" means an individual who is without a job
2 and who wants and is available for work. The determination of
3 whether an individual is without a job shall be made in accord4 ance with the criteria used by the bureau of labor statistics of
5 the United States department of labor in defining individuals as
6 unemployed.

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
