SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5869

A bill to create certain prescription programs relating to the elderly; to enhance access to prescription drugs to certain elderly residents of the state; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state departments and agencies; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 2 "elder prescription insurance coverage act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Department" means the department of community health.
- 5 (b) "EPIC" means the elder prescription insurance coverage
- 6 program created in section 3.
- 7 (c) "Medicaid" means the program for medical assistance
- 8 established under title XIX of the social security act, chapter
- 9 531, 49 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. 1396 to 1396f, 1396g-1 to 1396r-6,

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- 1 and 1396r-8 to 1396v, and administered by the department under
- 2 the social welfare act, 1939 PA 280, MCL 400.1 to 400.119b.
- 3 (d) "Michigan resident" means a person who resides in a set-
- 4 tled or permanent home or domicile within the state, except for a
- 5 temporary absence, with the intention of remaining in this
- 6 state.
- 7 (e) "Prescription" and "prescription drug" mean those terms
- 8 as defined in section 17708 of the public health code, 1978 PA
- **9** 368, MCL 333.17708.
- 10 Sec. 3. (1) The elder prescription insurance coverage pro-
- 11 gram is created within the department of community health.
- 12 (2) The EPIC program shall provide prescription drug cover-
- 13 age, including related supplies, to each person to whom all of
- 14 the following apply:
- 15 (a) The person is a Michigan resident 65 years of age or
- 16 older.
- 17 (b) The person has a household income at or below 200% of
- 18 the federal poverty level.
- 19 (c) The person is not eligible for medicaid.
- 20 (d) Excluding medicare supplemental insurance or a federal
- 21 program described in subsection (3), the person is not covered by
- 22 other insurance that provides prescription drug coverage.
- 23 (3) The EPIC program is a payer of last resort. If the fed-
- 24 eral government establishes a pharmaceutical assistance program
- 25 that covers EPIC eligible seniors under medicare or any other
- 26 program, the EPIC program shall cover only eligible costs not
- 27 covered by the federal program.

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- 1 (4) The Michigan emergency pharmaceutical program for
- 2 seniors shall be continued until the EPIC program is fully
- 3 implemented.
- 4 Sec. 4. The department may do all of the following:
- 5 (a) Enter into a contract with a private individual or
- 6 agency to manage the EPIC program created under this act. A con-
- 7 tract entered into under this section shall be awarded through a
- 8 competitive bidding process.
- 9 (b) Require a copayment on each prescription. No copayment
- 10 is required for a person who has a household income equal to or
- 11 less than 100% of the federal poverty level. For a person who
- 12 has a household income between 100% to 200% of the federal pov-
- 13 erty level, the department shall establish and implement a gradu-
- 14 ated annual copayment policy. The total annual copayment shall
- 15 not exceed 5% of the person's annual household income. No single
- 16 copayment shall exceed 20% of the cost of the prescription being
- 17 purchased.
- 18 (c) Require an annual enrollment fee that does not exceed
- 19 \$25.00 per person. This enrollment fee shall apply to the annual
- 20 copayment.
- 21 Sec. 5. To assist in determining the coverage appropriate
- 22 under the provisions of this act, the department shall establish
- 23 a steering committee. The committee shall consist of consumer
- 24 representatives and members with knowledge in the areas of phar-
- 25 macology, geriatrics, development and review of budgetary issues
- 26 and practice, and policy development. The committee shall meet
- 27 at least once each year.

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- 1 Sec. 6. (1) The department shall do all of the following:
- 2 (a) Give enrollment priority to a person who in the 12-month
- 3 period preceding the effective date of this act participated in
- 4 the Michigan emergency pharmaceutical program for seniors funded
- 5 in the annual appropriation for the department or who received a
- 6 senior prescription tax credit in former section 273 of the
- 7 income tax act of 1967, 1967 PA 281.
- 8 (b) The department shall make emergency pharmaceutical
- 9 assistance available to provide coverage for up to 90 days to
- 10 eligible persons as the department determines is necessary.
- 11 Eligibility requirements for emergency vouchers shall not be more
- 12 restrictive than the requirements established for the Michigan
- 13 emergency pharmaceutical program for seniors previously funded in
- 14 the annual appropriation for the department.
- 15 (c) Work with the office of services to the aging estab-
- 16 lished in section 5 of the older Michiganians act, 1981 PA 180,
- 17 MCL 400.585, to increase awareness of the EPIC program and assist
- 18 elderly persons in applying for the EPIC program.
- 19 (d) Establish an automated pharmacy claims adjudication and
- 20 prospective utilization review system. The EPIC program shall
- 21 not be implemented until after the department has complied with
- 22 this subsection.
- (e) Ensure that any pharmaceutical dispensing fee allowed
- 24 under EPIC is equal to the pharmaceutical dispensing fee allowed
- 25 under the medicaid program.
- 26 (2) The department shall establish an expedited enrollment
- 27 process or emergency pharmaceutical assistance if an otherwise

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- 1 eligible EPIC applicant immediately needs to obtain a medically
- 2 necessary prescription.
- Sec. 7. The EPIC program created in this act is not an 3
- 4 entitlement. The benefits of the EPIC program are limited to the
- 5 extent of the level of funding received for the program in the
- 6 annual appropriation from the department. The department may
- 7 limit the number of elderly persons enrolled in the EPIC program
- 8 to ensure that program expenditures do not exceed available
- 9 revenue.
- Sec. 8. The department shall provide quarterly reports to 10
- 11 the senate and house appropriations committees, and the senate
- 12 and house fiscal agencies, that include quantified data as to the
- 13 number of program applicants, enrollees, expenditures, and the
- 14 number of enrollees subsequently found eligible for medicaid.
- 15 Each report shall also contain an estimate of whether the current
- 16 rate of expenditures will exceed the existing amount of money
- 17 appropriated for the EPIC program in the current fiscal year.
- 18 Enacting section 1. Section 273 of the income tax act of
- 19 1967, 1967 PA 281, MCL 206.273, is repealed on January 1 of the
- 20 year immediately following the first year that the EPIC program
- 21 provides prescription drug coverage to a person under this act.
