SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 180

(As Passed the Senate October 28, 1999)

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending sections 43902 and 43905 (MCL 324.43902 and 324.43905), as added by 1995 PA 57.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 43902. (1) The nongame fish and wildlife trust fund is
- 2 created in the state treasury. The trust fund shall consist of
- 3 all money credited to the trust fund pursuant to section 439 of
- 4 the income tax act of 1967, Act No. 281 of the Public Acts of
- 5 1967, being section 206.439 of the Michigan Compiled Laws 1967
- 6 PA 281, MCL 206.439, AND SECTION 8111 OF THE MICHIGAN VEHICLE
- 7 CODE, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.8111, and any interest and earnings
- 8 accruing from the saving and investment of that money.
- 9 (2) The trust fund may receive appropriations, money, or10 other things of value.
