## SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 335

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending sections 710d and 710e (MCL 257.710d and 257.710e), section 710d as amended by 1990 PA 90 and section 710e as amended by 1991 PA 25.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 710d. (1) Except as provided in this section, or as
- 2 otherwise provided by law, a rule promulgated pursuant to the
- 3 administrative procedures act of 1969, Act No. 306 of the
- 4 Public Acts of 1969, as amended, being sections 24.201 to 24.328
- 5 of the Michigan Compiled Laws 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 TO 24.328,
- 6 or federal regulation, each driver transporting a child LESS THAN
- 7 4 YEARS OF AGE in a motor vehicle shall properly secure -each
- 8 THAT child in a child restraint system as follows: (a) Any
- 9 child less than 1 year of age in a child restraint system which

- 1 THAT meets the standards prescribed in 49 C.F.R. 571.213.
- 2 except as provided in subsection (6).
- 3 (b) Any child 1 year of age or more but less than 4 years of
- 4 age, when transported in the front seat, in a child restraint

- 6 571.213, except as provided in subsection (6).
- 7 (c) Any child 1 year of age or more but less than 4 years of
- 8 age, when transported in the rear seat, in a child restraint

- 10 unless the child is secured by a safety belt provided in the

- 19 (5) Points shall not be assessed under section 320a for a
- 20 violation of this section. An abstract required under section
- 21 732 shall not be submitted to the secretary of state regarding a

- 23 (6) The secretary of state may exempt by rules promulgated
- 24 pursuant to Act No. 306 of the Public Acts of 1969, as amended,
- 25 THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT OF 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL
- 26 24.201 TO 24.328, a class of children from the requirements of

- 5 Sec. 710e. (1) This section shall—DOES not apply to a
- 6 driver or passenger of ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 7 (a) A motor vehicle manufactured before January 1, 1965.
- 8 (b) A bus.
- **9** (c) A motorcycle.
- 10 (d) A moped.
- 11 (e) A motor vehicle if the driver or passenger possesses a
- 12 written verification from a physician that the driver or passen-
- 13 ger is unable to wear a safety belt for physical or medical
- 14 reasons.
- 15 (f) A motor vehicle which THAT is not required to be
- 16 equipped with safety belts under federal law.
- 17 (q) A commercial or United States postal service vehicle
- 18 -which THAT makes frequent stops for the purpose of pickup or

- 20 (h) A motor vehicle operated by a rural carrier of the
- 21 United States postal service while serving his or her rural
- 22 postal route.
- 23 (2) This section <del>shall</del> DOES not apply to a passenger of a
- 24 school bus.
- 25 (3) Each driver and front seat passenger of a motor vehi-
- 26 cle operated on a street or highway in this state shall wear a
- 27 properly adjusted and fastened safety belt, except that a child

- 1 less than 4 years of age shall be protected as required in
- 2 section 710d. IF THERE ARE MORE PASSENGERS THAN SAFETY BELTS
- 3 AVAILABLE FOR USE, AND ALL SAFETY BELTS IN THE MOTOR VEHICLE ARE
- 4 BEING UTILIZED IN COMPLIANCE WITH THIS SECTION, THE DRIVER OF THE
- 5 MOTOR VEHICLE IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH THIS SECTION.
- 6 (4) Each driver of a motor vehicle transporting a child
- 7 4 years of age or more but less than 16 years of age in a motor
- 8 vehicle shall secure the child in a properly adjusted and
- 9 fastened safety belt. If the motor vehicle is transporting more
- 10 children than there are safety belts available for use, all
- 11 safety belts available in the motor vehicle are being utilized in
- 12 compliance with this section, and the driver and all front seat
- 13 passengers comply with subsection (3), then the driver of a motor
- 14 vehicle transporting a child 4 years of age or more but less than
- 15 16 years of age for which there is not an available safety belt
- 16 is in compliance with this subsection, if that child is seated in
- 17 other than the front seat of the motor vehicle. However, if that
- 18 motor vehicle is a pickup truck without an extended cab or jump
- 19 seats, and all safety belts in the front seat are being used, the
- 20 driver may transport such a child in the front seat without a
- 21 safety belt.
- 22 (5) Enforcement IF AFTER DECEMBER 31, 2005 THE OFFICE OF
- 23 HIGHWAY SAFETY PLANNING CERTIFIES THAT THERE HAS BEEN LESS THAN
- 24 80% COMPLIANCE WITH THE SAFETY BELT REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION
- 25 DURING THE PRECEDING YEAR, THEN ENFORCEMENT of this section by
- 26 state or local law enforcement agencies shall be accomplished
- 27 only as a secondary action when a driver of a motor vehicle has

- 3 (6) Failure to wear a safety belt in violation of this sec-
- 4 tion may be considered evidence of negligence and may reduce the
- 5 recovery for damages arising out of the ownership, maintenance,
- 6 or operation of a motor vehicle. However, such negligence shall
- 7 not reduce the recovery for damages by more than 5%.
- **8** (7) A person who violates this section is responsible for a
- 9 civil infraction.
- 10 (8) A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY SHALL CONDUCT AN INVESTIGATION
- 11 FOR ALL REPORTS OF POLICE HARASSMENT THAT RESULT FROM THE
- 12 ENFORCEMENT OF THIS SECTION.
- 13 (9) THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL ENGAGE AN INDEPENDENT
- 14 ORGANIZATION TO CONDUCT A 3-YEAR STUDY TO DETERMINE THE EFFECT
- 15 THAT THE PRIMARY ENFORCEMENT OF THIS SECTION HAS ON THE NUMBER OF
- 16 INCIDENTS OF POLICE HARASSMENT OF DRIVERS. THE ORGANIZATION THAT
- 17 CONDUCTS THE STUDY SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE NOT
- 18 LATER THAN JUNE 30, 2001 AND AN ANNUAL REPORT NOT LATER THAN JUNE
- 19 30 EACH YEAR THEREAFTER.
- 20 (10) THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL PROMOTE COMPLIANCE WITH
- 21 THE SAFETY BELT REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION AT THE BRANCH
- 22 OFFICES AND THROUGH ANY PRINT OR VISUAL MEDIA DETERMINED APPRO-
- 23 PRIATE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE.
  - (11) THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL CONDUCT A STUDY WITH THE COOPERATION AND CONTRIBUTION OF THE DIRECTORS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE, THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY HEALTH, THE STATE TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT, AND THE INSURANCE BUREAU TO ANALYZE THE MONETARY SAVINGS, IF ANY, ARISING FROM THE ENACTMENT OF THE AMENDATORY ACT THAT ADDED THIS SUBSECTION. THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL REPORT THE FINDINGS OF THE STUDY TO THE SENATE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE AND THE SENATE FISCAL AGENCY NOT LATER THAN MAY 1, 2000.
- 24 (12) IT IS THE INTENT OF THE LEGISLATURE THAT THE ENFORCE-
- 25 MENT OF THIS SECTION BE CONDUCTED IN A MANNER CALCULATED TO SAVE
- 26 LIVES AND NOT IN A MANNER THAT RESULTS IN THE HARASSMENT OF THE
- 27 CITIZENS OF THIS STATE.
