Sec. 20965. (1) Unless an act or omission is the result of gross negligence or willful misconduct, the acts or omissions of a medical first responder, emergency medical technician, emergency medical technician specialist, paramedic, or medical director of a medical control authority or his or her designee while providing services to a patient outside a hospital, or in a hospital before transferring patient care to hospital personnel, that are consistent with the individual's licensure or additional training required by the local medical control authority, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, SERVICES DESCRIBED IN

1 SUBSECTION (2), do not impose liability in the treatment of a

3 (a) The authorizing physician or physician's designee.

(3) (2) Subsection (1) does not limit immunity from
22 liability otherwise provided by law for any of the persons listed
23 in subsection (1).
