## HOUSE BILL No. 4781

## May 28, 2003, Introduced by Rep. Rivet and referred to the Committee on Conservation and Outdoor Recreation.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending sections 81119 and 82107 (MCL 324.81119 and 324.82107), as added by 1995 PA 58.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 81119. (1) Not less than -40% of the revenue in the ORV trail improvement fund through March 31, 1996, and not 2 less than 50% beginning April 1, 1996, shall be distributed each 3 year in the form of grants for the purpose of planning, 4 5 improving, constructing, signing, and maintaining ORV trails, 6 areas, and routes and access to those trails, areas, and routes, the leasing of land, the acquisition of easements, permits, or 7 other agreements for the use of land for ORV trails, areas, and 8 9 routes, to public agencies and nonprofit incorporated clubs and 10 organizations.

1 (2) An application by a public agency or a nonprofit incorporated club or organization shall include a plan for 2 restoration of any of the natural resources of this state on 3 public land that are damaged due to ORV use. The public agencies 4 5 or nonprofit incorporated clubs or organizations shall indicate on their application that their use of grant money is consistent 6 with, and meets the requirements of, the plan developed by the 7 department pursuant to section 81123, and the trail, route, or 8 area is available to the public. The department shall not 9 approve a grant unless the application meets the requirements of 10 The department shall make application forms available 11 the plan. 12 and consider grant requests on a yearly basis in consultation 13 with the ORV trails advisory committee created in section 81125.

14 (3) A grant shall not be made for a trail, route, or area 15 unless the trail, route, or area is available for ORV use and is 16 approved by the department. A grant for the cost of leasing of 17 land and the acquisition of easements, permits, or other 18 agreements may equal 100% of incurred expense. Specifications 19 shall be prescribed by the department.

(4) Not less than -30% - 31-1/4% of the revenue in the fund
through March 31, 1996, and not less than 31-1/4% beginning
April 1, 1996, shall be used each year for enforcement of this
part or the purchase of any necessary equipment used for
enforcement of this part. Of this amount available for
enforcement, the department shall make -available - 24% of the
funds available for distribution in the form of grants by the
department to the county sheriffs' departments. -in the following

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1 percentage amounts: 60% of the funds available for the first 2 year of operation of the fund; 50% of the funds available in the 3 second year; 40% of the funds available through March 31, 1996; 4 and 24% of the funds beginning April 1, 1996 and thereafter. The 5 balance of the funds available shall be used by the department 6 for the enforcement of this part or for the purchase of any 7 necessary equipment used for the enforcement of this part. In 8 making grants available for distribution under this subsection, 9 the department shall consider the following factors:

10 (a) The number of miles of ORV trails, routes, or areas11 within the county.

12 (b) The number of sheriff's department employees available13 for enforcement of this part.

14 (c) The estimated number of ORVs within the county and that15 are brought into the county for ORV use.

16 (d) The estimated number of days that ORVs may be used within17 that county.

(e) Any other factors considered appropriate by the 18 department. The department shall also consider those counties 19 20 that do not have designated trails, routes, or areas but that 21 border or are adjacent to 1 of the Great Lakes, Saginaw bay, or 22 Lake St. Clair. The department shall require a county sheriff 23 receiving a grant under this subsection to maintain records and 24 submit an annual report to verify expenditure of grant money received. As used in this subdivision, "Great Lakes" means Lake 25 Superior, Lake Michigan, Lake Huron, and Lake Erie. 26 27 (5) Not less than -20% 12-1/2% of the revenue in the ORV

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1 trail improvement fund <u>through March 31, 1996, and not less than</u>
2 12-1/2% beginning April 1, 1996, shall be distributed each year
3 in the form of grants to public agencies and nonprofit
4 incorporated clubs and organizations for the restoration of
5 damage that is caused by ORV use to natural resources on public
6 land. A grant under this subsection may be in addition to a
7 grant under subsection (1). An application for a grant under
8 this subsection shall comply with subsection (2).

9 (6) Not more than 3-1/8% of the revenue in the fund in any
10 year shall be used for administration of this part. The
11 department may use revenue from the funds for personnel to
12 operate the program under this part.

13 (7) The remaining 3-1/8% of the revenue in the fund may be 14 used for the purposes described in subsections (1) and (4), 15 except that 25 cents of each fee for a license sold by a dealer 16 shall be retained by the dealer as a commission for services 17 rendered. If the remainder of the fund is used for the purposes 18 described in subsection (4), it shall be allocated as provided in 19 subsection (4).

(8) Grants under this section shall remain available until
expended once a contract or commitment has been entered into
under this section. A contract shall be for a period of not more
than 2 years. A grant not expended within the contract period
may be renewed by the department by entering into a new
contract.

26 Sec. 82107. (1) The annual budget request of the department27 shall include an amount for enforcement of this part, for

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snowmobile safety education and training programs, and for a
 state financial assistance program provided for under this
 section.

4 (2) Each county of the state shall be entitled to receive 5 financial assistance from the state as provided in this section. Each county in this state shall be encouraged to develop a 6 snowmobile safety education and training program based on the 7 criteria set forth in section 82108. A county board of 8 commissioners desiring to conduct a snowmobile program shall 9 submit to the department by November 30 of each year an estimate 10 of authorized expenditures for the following calendar year, in a 11 12 form and containing the information which the department The department shall review the entire request and may 13 requires. approve the county request for financial assistance. 14 The 15 department shall annually survey the state financial assistance 16 program to assist in determining the amount of financial assistance to be allocated to a county for its snowmobile 17 18 program. The department shall also consider those counties that do not have designated trails or areas but that border or are 19 20 adjacent to 1 of the Great Lakes, Saginaw bay, or Lake St. Clair. As used in this subsection, "Great Lakes" means Lake 21 22 Superior, Lake Michigan, Lake Huron, and Lake Erie. (3) The amount of financial assistance from the state to be 23

24 allocated to a county <u>pursuant to</u> under this section shall be 25 determined by the department. The department shall evaluate each 26 request from a county for financial assistance and may give 27 priority to counties where, in the determination of the

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1 department, a greater need for financial assistance exists. The department shall review the county's statement of authorized 2 expenditures actually incurred and if satisfied shall provide 3 financial assistance in an amount not to exceed 75% of the 4 5 county's estimated authorized expenditures for the past calendar year. If the county's authorized expenditures actually incurred 6 for the past calendar year exceeded the county's estimated 7 authorized expenditures, the department may provide financial 8 assistance in excess of 75% of the county's estimated authorized 9 expenditures but not in excess of 75% of the county's authorized 10 expenditures actually incurred. Financial assistance allocated 11 12 to a county under this section shall be used exclusively for the 13 conduct of the county snowmobile program as provided by this part and the rules promulgated under this part. Within 90 days after 14 the close of each calendar year, a county board of commissioners 15 shall submit to the department a statement of authorized 16 expenditures actually incurred, on a form and containing the 17 information the department requires. A county submitting a 18 statement or supplement to the statement that is received 19 20 subsequent to the 90-day period shall not be eligible for 21 financial assistance.

(4) The department of treasury shall periodically audit the county records pertaining to this program to assure the proper disposition of the money in accordance with this section and rules promulgated under this section. If the audit discloses a refund of state aid money is due the state, the county treasurer, within 30 days of after the completion of the audit, shall send

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to the department the amount of the refund due the state, which
 the department shall return to the state treasury.

3 (5) The department and the county sheriffs shall cooperate in
4 the conduct of the program. The county sheriffs shall maintain
5 records and submit reports in form and containing information as
6 the department may require.

7 (6) The department may promulgate rules to implement this8 section.

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
