## SUBSTITUTE FOR

## HOUSE BILL NO. 4607

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 627a (MCL 257.627a), as amended by 2000 PA 110.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

**1** Sec. 627a. (1) As used in this section and section 629:

2 (a) "Regularly scheduled school session" means that part of a
3 day of student instruction that is followed by a break for lunch or
4 by a final dismissal of the student body for that day.

5 (b) "School" means an educational institution operated by a
6 local school district or by a private, denominational, or parochial
7 organization. School does not include an educational institution
8 that the department of education determines has its entire student
9 population in residence at the institution.

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(c) "School zone" means school property on which a school

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building is located and the area adjacent to the school property
 that is designated by the signs required under subsection (2).
 Except as otherwise provided in subsection (5), the school zone
 extends not more than 1,000 feet from the property line of the
 school in each direction.

6 (2) Except as provided in subsection (4), the prima facie speed limit in a school zone, which shall be in force not less than 7 30 minutes but not more than 1 hour before the first regularly 8 9 scheduled school session until school commences and from dismissal 10 until not less than 30 minutes but not more than 1 hour after the 11 last regularly scheduled school session, and during a lunch period 12 when students are permitted to leave the school, shall be 25 miles 13 an hour, if permanent signs designating the school zone and the 14 speed limit in the school zone are posted at the request of the 15 school superintendent. The signs shall conform to the Michigan manual of uniform traffic control devices. 16

17 (3) This section does not apply to a limited access highway or 18 to that portion of a street or highway over which a pedestrian 19 overhead walkway is erected, if the walkway is adjacent to school 20 property and is designed and located so as to be used, and is being 21 used, as the principal means by which students of a school that has 22 property adjacent to the walkway travel to and from the school.

23 (4) Local authorities may increase or decrease the prima facie
24 speed limit within a school zone under their jurisdiction pursuant
25 to section 629.

26 (5) Notwithstanding the requirements for a school zone as
27 defined in subsection (1)(c), if a school is located in an area

that requires school children to cross a state trunk line highway 1 2 or county highway that has a speed limit of 35 miles per hour or more to attend that school, the school superintendent may submit a 3 4 request to the state transportation commission, county road 5 commission, or local authority having jurisdiction over the roadway, as applicable, for a school crossing as permitted under 6 section 613a. If, based on the traffic engineering studies, the 7 road authority determines the need for a lower speed limit, the 8 9 road authority may designate the crossing as a school zone. Before 10 submitting a request, the school superintendent shall have 11 completed a school route plan as prescribed by section 7A-1 of the 12 Michigan manual of uniform traffic control devices.

(6) Notwithstanding the 25-mile-per-hour prima facie speed 13 limit established by subsection (2), the prima facie speed limit 14 15 for any street in a school zone that has sidewalks along at least 1 side of the street, which shall be in force during the same periods 16 17 that a 25-mile-per-hour speed limit provided by subsection (2) would otherwise be effective, shall be set at the limit requested 18 19 by the superintendent of schools with jurisdiction over the school 20 within the school zone, but this limit shall neither be more than 15 miles per hour below the regularly posted speed limit for that 21 street nor less than 25 miles per hour. Permanent signs designating 22 the school zone and the speed limit in the school zone shall be 23 24 posted. These signs shall conform to the Michigan manual of uniform traffic control devices. 25

26 (7) IF APPROPRIATE, THE SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT MAY REQUEST THAT27 A SIGN BE ERECTED IN THE SCHOOL ZONE INDICATING THAT A SCHOOL IS IN

SESSION YEAR-ROUND. A SIGN ERECTED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE 1 2 POSTED IN CLOSE PROXIMITY TO THE SCHOOL ZONE SIGN OR SPEED LIMIT 3 SIGN WITHIN THE SCHOOL ZONE, OR BOTH. THE SIGN SHALL READ "YEAR-ROUND SCHOOL" AND SHALL CONFORM TO THE MICHIGAN MANUAL OF UNIFORM 4 5 TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES.
