SUBSTITUTE FOR

HOUSE BILL NO. 5860

A bill to amend 1966 PA 291, entitled

"Fire fighters training council act of 1966,"

by amending the title and sections 1, 2, 3, 9, 11, 13, and 14 (MCL 29.361, 29.362, 29.363, 29.369, 29.371, 29.373, and 29.374), the title and sections 2 and 3 as amended by 1987 PA 196 and section 9 as amended by 1988 PA 458.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

TITLE

An act to provide for the creation of a CREATE THE fire 2 fighters training council; to -provide for - PRESCRIBE the powers 3 and duties of the council, THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL, and certain fire 4 departments -or AND other organizations; to -provide for the 5 6 establishment of CREATE the fire fighters training council fund 7 and TO PROVIDE FOR allocations - therefrom- FROM THE FUND to local 8 agencies of government participating in a -fire fighters 9 FIREFIGHTERS training program; and to make an appropriation.

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Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the <u>"fire</u>
 fighters "FIREFIGHTERS training council act". of 1966".

Sec. 2. As used in this act:

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4 (a) "Council" means the <u>fire fighters</u> FIREFIGHTERS training
5 council.

6 (b) "Executive secretary" means the executive secretary of the7 council.

8 9 volunteer members and members paid on call, of -a AN ORGANIZED 10 fire department - or other organization of a city, county, township, 11 or village who is responsible for, or is in a capacity which 12 THAT includes responsibility for, the extinguishment of fires, the 13 directing of the extinguishment of fires, the prevention and 14 detection of fires, and the enforcement of the general fire laws of 15 this state. This definition shall not apply to FIREFIGHTER DOES 16 NOT INCLUDE a person whose job description, duties, or 17 responsibilities do not include direct involvement in fire 18 suppression.

19 (d) <u>"Fire department or other organization" means an</u> 20 organization or department which provides fire suppression and 21 other fire-related services within a city, village, township, or county. "ORGANIZED FIRE DEPARTMENT" MEANS THAT TERM AS DEFINED IN 22 23 SECTION 1 OF THE FIRE PREVENTION CODE, 1941 PA 207, MCL 29.1. 24 (E) "FIREFIGHTER TRAINING" MEANS EDUCATION OR TRAINING DESIGNED AND INTENDED TO ENHANCE THE ABILITY OF AN ORGANIZED FIRE 25 DEPARTMENT OR THE PERSONNEL OF AN ORGANIZED FIRE DEPARTMENT TO 26 27 SAFEGUARD LIFE AND PROPERTY FROM DAMAGE FROM EXPLOSION, FIRE, OR

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DISASTER, AND TO DELIVER FIRE SUPPRESSION AND OTHER RELATED FIRE
 SERVICES.

3 Sec. 3. (1) The <u>fire fighters</u> FIREFIGHTERS training council
4 is <u>hereby</u> created <u>within</u> IN THE BUREAU OF FIRE SERVICES IN the
5 department of <u>state police</u> LABOR AND ECONOMIC GROWTH and shall
6 consist of 7 members selected as follows:

7 (a) The <u>director of state police</u> STATE FIRE MARSHAL, or his
8 or her designated representative, shall be ex-officio a member.

9 (b) Two members appointed to the council by the governor from
10 a list of 5 <u>active</u> OR MORE members submitted by the Michigan
11 ASSOCIATION OF fire <u>chief's association</u> CHIEFS.

12 (c) One member appointed to the council by the governor from a 13 list of 3 <u>active fire fighters</u> OR MORE MEMBERS submitted by the 14 Michigan <u>state fire fighter's association</u> PROFESSIONAL FIRE

15 FIGHTERS UNION.

16 (d) One member appointed to the council by the governor from a 17 list of 3 OR MORE names submitted by the Michigan state firemen's 18 association.

(e) One member appointed to the council by the governor from a
list of 3 OR MORE names submitted by the <u>metropolitan club of</u>

21 America, incorporated MICHIGAN FIRE SERVICE INSTRUCTORS

22 ASSOCIATION.

(f) One member appointed to the council by the governor from a
list of 2 OR MORE names submitted by the Michigan townships
association and 2 OR MORE names submitted by the Michigan municipal
league.

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(2) All appointments made by the governor shall be with the

Sec. 9. (1) The STATE FIRE MARSHAL, [WITH THE APPROVAL OF] THE
council, shall prepare and publish standards with due consideration
to varying factors and special requirements of ORGANIZED fire
departments <u>or other organizations</u> in the following areas:

6 (a) Advisory standards of physical, educational, mental and
7 moral fitness, which shall govern the recruitment, selection, and
8 appointment of <u>fire fighters</u> FIREFIGHTERS.

9 (b) The approval by the council of <u>fire fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER
10 training schools. The standards shall address, at least, the
11 following issues:

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(i) The qualification and certification of instructors.

13 (*ii*) The courses of study, attendance, record-keeping14 requirements, equipment, and facilities.

15 (*iii*) The visitation and evaluation of instructors and schools.
16 by the council.

17 (c) The establishment of subordinate regional training centers
18 in strategic geographic locations in order to serve the greatest
19 number of ORGANIZED fire departments that are unable to support
20 their own training programs.

(2) Each ORGANIZED fire department <u>or other organization</u>
shall file a statement with the council designating at least 1
training officer or training coordinator for the fire department.
by November 30, 1988. If a training officer or training
coordinator is changed, the ORGANIZED fire department, <u>or other</u>
organization, within 7 days of the change, shall file a statement
notifying the council of the change.

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House Bill No. 5860 (H-1) as amended March 30, 2006 1 (3) The council shall develop and provide to each ORGANIZED 2 fire department, or other organization, upon request of the 3 **ORGANIZED** fire department - or other organization - and at no charge, a videotape, DIGITAL VIDEO DISC, OR OTHER ELECTRONIC FORM OF VIDEO 4 5 DISPLAY to be used in training <u>fire fighters</u> FIREFIGHTERS. The videotape, DIGITAL VIDEO DISC, OR OTHER ELECTRONIC FORM OF VIDEO 6 7 DISPLAY shall not include training that requires a practical demonstration. The videotape, DIGITAL VIDEO DISC, OR OTHER 8 ELECTRONIC FORM OF VIDEO DISPLAY shall be based on the -fire 9 fighters I and II standards FOR FIRE FIGHTER I AND FIRE FIGHTER II 10 11 set forth in -the- "STANDARD FOR fire fighter professional 12 qualifications", national fire protection association - pamphlet 13 STANDARD no. 1001, 1987 2002 edition. The council may impose a 14 reasonable fee for loss, damage, or late return of a videotape, 15 DIGITAL VIDEO DISC, OR OTHER ELECTRONIC FORM OF VIDEO DISPLAY provided to -a AN ORGANIZED fire department -or other organization 16 17 under this subsection.

(4) The STATE FIRE MARSHAL, [WITH THE APPROVAL OF] THE council, 18 shall develop and administer an examination, which shall include a 19 20 practical demonstration, a written or oral test, or a combination 21 thereof, to determine a person's competency in regard to the 22 knowledge and skill requirements set forth in fire fighter I and II standards of the STANDARDS FOR FIRE FIGHTER I AND FIRE FIGHTER 23 **II SET FORTH IN "STANDARD FOR** fire fighter professional 24 qualifications", national fire protection association - pamphlet 25 26 STANDARD no. 1001, -1987- 2002 edition. The council, upon the 27 request of -a AN ORGANIZED fire department, -or other

House Bill No. 5860 (H-1) as amended March 30, 2006 organization, shall administer the examination in each county at least once every year. The examination shall be administered in 2 parts. Part 1 shall test the knowledge and skill requirements set forth in fire fighter I, and part 2 shall test the knowledge and skill requirements set forth in fire fighter II. The examination may be retaken, as necessary, upon request from <u>a</u> AN ORGANIZED fire department. <u>or other organization</u>.

8 (5) Within 12 months after a person's hiring date as a full9 time <u>fire fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER, the person must pass both part 1
10 and part 2 of the examination to be eligible for continued or
11 permanent full-time employment as a <u>fire fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER.

12 (6) Within 24 months after a person's appointment date as a
13 volunteer or paid on-call <u>fire fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER, a person must
14 pass part 1 of the examination to be eligible for continued
15 volunteer or paid on-call service as a <u>fire fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER.

16 (7) The examination described in this section shall not apply
17 to a person who is employed or under appointment as a <u>fire fighter</u>
18 FIREFIGHTER on October 1, 1988, unless <u>a</u> THE person subsequently
19 changes his or her status from a volunteer or paid on-call <u>fire</u>
20 <u>fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER to a full-time <u>fire fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER.

(8) The STATE FIRE MARSHAL, [WITH THE APPROVAL OF] THE council,
shall review and monitor the state and federal standards relating
to live fire training exercises in structures and make
recommendations to the general industry safety standards commission
for any new or modified standards <u>which in their opinion are</u>
necessary for the protection of <u>fire fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER
trainees.

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Sec. 11. The STATE FIRE MARSHAL OR THE council may:

2 (a) Visit and inspect any <u>fire fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER training
3 school, or examine the curriculum or training procedures, for which
4 application for approval has been made.

- 5 (b) Issue certificates to <u>fire fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER training
 6 schools qualifying under the regulations <u>of the council</u>
- 7 PROMULGATED UNDER THIS ACT.

8 (c) Authorize the issuance of certificates of graduation or
 9 diplomas by approved <u>fire fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER training schools to
 10 <u>fire fighters</u> FIREFIGHTERS who have satisfactorily completed
 11 minimum courses of study.

(d) Cooperate with state, federal, AND local fire agencies in establishing and conducting local or area schools —, or regional training centers for instruction and training of <u>fire fighters</u> FIREFIGHTERS of this state —, AND its cities, counties, townships, and villages.

17 (e) Make recommendations to THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL, THE
18 GOVERNOR, AND the legislature on matters pertaining to
19 qualification and training of <u>fire fighters</u> FIREFIGHTERS.

20 Sec. 13. There is created in the state treasury <u>a fire</u> 21 fighters THE FIREFIGHTERS training fund from which the legislature 22 shall appropriate <u>such sums as are</u> AN AMOUNT OF MONEY deemed 23 necessary for the purposes of this act but <u>in no case shall such</u> 24 appropriations <u>be in excess of</u> FROM THE FIREFIGHTERS TRAINING 25 FUND SHALL NOT EXCEED 75% of <u>the amounts</u> MONEY paid into the 26 fund.

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Sec. 14. The amounts annually appropriated by the legislature

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shall be paid by the state treasurer in accordance with the 1 2 accounting laws of the state upon certification of the executive secretary of the council for the purpose of reimbursing the city, 3 county, township or village for regular fire fighters in the fire 4 5 department in an amount not to exceed 1/2 of the salary paid to 6 each fire fighter meeting the recruitment standards and participating in training meeting the standard prescribed pursuant 7 to this act during the period covered by the allocation, plus \$8.00 8 9 of the necessary living expenses incurred by such fire fighter 10 which are necessitated by training requiring that he be away from 11 his residence overnight. The amounts annually appropriated by the 12 legislature shall be paid by the state treasurer in accordance with 13 the accounting laws of the state upon certification of the executive secretary of the council for the purpose of reimbursing 14 15 the city, county, township or village for volunteer fire fighters 16 in an amount not to exceed \$12.50 for lost wages, to be matched by 17 the local municipality for each fire fighter meeting the 18 recruitment standards and participating in training meeting the 19 standard prescribed pursuant to this act during the period covered 20 by the allocation, plus \$8.00 of the necessary living expenses, to 21 be matched by the local municipality, incurred by such fire fighter 22 which are necessitated by training requiring that he be away from 23 his residence overnight. If the moneys in the fire fighter training 24 fund to be appropriated by the legislature for such salary and expense reimbursement are insufficient to allocate such amount to 25 each participating city, county, township or village, the amount 26 27 allocated to each shall be reduced proportionately. In no event

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shall any allocations be made to any city, county, township or
 village which has not, throughout the period covered by the
 allocation, adhered to the standards established by the council as
 applicable to personnel recruited or trained by such city, county,
 township or village during such period.

6 (1) FROM THE AMOUNT ANNUALLY APPROPRIATED BY LAW FOR THE
7 COUNCIL, THE COUNCIL MAY REQUEST AND THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL MAY
8 APPROVE ANNUAL TRAINING EXPENDITURES FOR THE PURPOSES OF PAYMENTS
9 TO COUNTIES TO REIMBURSE ORGANIZED FIRE DEPARTMENTS FOR FIREFIGHTER
10 TRAINING AND OTHER ACTIVITIES REQUIRED UNDER THIS ACT.

(2) THE MONEY APPROVED UNDER SUBSECTION (1) SHALL BE DISBURSED
TO COUNTIES USING A FORMULA COMPOSED 70% OF COUNTY POPULATION AND
30% OF SQUARE MILES WITHIN THE COUNTY. A MINIMUM DISBURSEMENT TO
EACH COUNTY MAY BE REQUESTED BY THE COUNCIL AND APPROVED BY THE
STATE FIRE MARSHAL.

(3) THE CHAIRPERSON OF A FIREFIGHTER TRAINING COMMITTEE 16 ESTABLISHED IN EACH COUNTY SHALL SURVEY THE TRAINING NEEDS OF 17 ORGANIZED FIRE DEPARTMENTS IN THE COUNTY AND SHALL DISTRIBUTE THE 18 19 MONEY RECEIVED BY THE COUNTY UNDER THIS SECTION AS PRIORITIZED BY 20 THE ORGANIZED FIRE DEPARTMENTS IN THE COUNTY. IF MONEY DISTRIBUTED 21 TO A COUNTY UNDER THIS SECTION FOR A FISCAL YEAR IS NOT DESIGNATED 22 BY THE CHAIRPERSON FOR DISTRIBUTION TO ORGANIZED FIRE DEPARTMENTS 23 IN THE COUNTY BY JANUARY 1 OF THE FISCAL YEAR, THE UNDESIGNATED 24 MONEY SHALL BE RETURNED TO THE COUNCIL FOR REDISTRIBUTION USING THE 25 FORMULA UNDER SUBSECTION (2).

26 (4) MONEY SHALL BE DISTRIBUTED UNDER THIS SECTION ONLY TO AN
27 ORGANIZED FIRE DEPARTMENT THAT HAS ADHERED TO THE STANDARDS

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ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS ACT FOR PERSONNEL RECRUITED OR TRAINED BY
 THE ORGANIZED FIRE DEPARTMENT DURING THE CURRENT AND PRIOR FISCAL
 YEARS.
