SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR

HOUSE BILL NO. 5860

A bill to amend 1966 PA 291, entitled "Fire fighters training council act of 1966," by amending the title and sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, 11, 13, and 14 (MCL 29.361, 29.362, 29.363, 29.364, 29.365, 29.368, 29.369, 29.371, 29.373, and 29.374), the title and sections 2, 3, and 5 as amended by 1987 PA 196 and section 9 as amended by 1988 PA 458.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

TITLE

An act to <u>provide for the creation of a fire fighters</u> CREATE THE FIREFIGHTERS training council; to <u>provide for</u> PRESCRIBE the powers and duties of the council, THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL, and certain fire departments <u>or</u> AND other organizations; to <u>provide</u> for the establishment of the fire fighters CREATE THE FIREFIGHTERS training council fund and TO PROVIDE FOR allocations <u>therefrom</u>

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FROM THE FUND to local agencies of government participating in a
 fire fighters FIREFIGHTERS training program; and to make an
 appropriation.

Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the <u>"fire</u>
fighters "FIREFIGHTERS training council act". of 1966".

6 Sec. 2. As used in this act:

7 (a) "Council" means the <u>fire fighters</u> FIREFIGHTERS training
8 council.

9 (b) "Executive secretary" means the executive secretary of the10 council.

11 volunteer members and members paid on call, of -a- AN ORGANIZED 12 13 fire department - or other organization of a city, county, township, or village who is responsible for, or is in a capacity which 14 THAT includes responsibility for, the extinguishment of fires, the 15 directing of the extinguishment of fires, the prevention and 16 17 detection of fires, and the enforcement of the general fire laws of this state. This definition shall not apply to FIREFIGHTER DOES 18 19 NOT INCLUDE a person whose job description, duties, or 20 responsibilities do not include direct involvement in fire 21 suppression.

(d) "Fire department or other organization" means an
 organization or department which provides fire suppression and
 other fire-related services within a city, village, township, or
 county. "ORGANIZED FIRE DEPARTMENT" MEANS THAT TERM AS DEFINED IN
 SECTION 1 OF THE FIRE PREVENTION CODE, 1941 PA 207, MCL 29.1.
 (E) "FIREFIGHTER TRAINING" MEANS EDUCATION OR TRAINING

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DESIGNED AND INTENDED TO ENHANCE THE ABILITY OF AN ORGANIZED FIRE
 DEPARTMENT OR THE PERSONNEL OF AN ORGANIZED FIRE DEPARTMENT TO
 SAFEGUARD LIFE AND PROPERTY FROM DAMAGE FROM EXPLOSION, FIRE, OR
 DISASTER, AND TO DELIVER FIRE SUPPRESSION AND OTHER RELATED FIRE
 SERVICES.

6 Sec. 3. (1) The <u>fire fighters</u> FIREFIGHTERS training council 7 is <u>hereby</u> created <u>within</u> IN THE BUREAU OF FIRE SERVICES IN the 8 department of <u>state police</u> LABOR AND ECONOMIC GROWTH and shall 9 consist of 7 members selected as follows:

10 (a) The <u>director of state police</u> STATE FIRE MARSHAL, or his
11 or her designated representative, shall be ex-officio a member.

12 (b) Two members appointed to the council by the governor from
13 a list of 5 <u>active</u> OR MORE members submitted by the Michigan
14 ASSOCIATION OF fire <u>chief's association</u> CHIEFS.

15 (c) One member appointed to the council by the governor from a 16 list of 3 <u>active fire fighters</u> OR MORE MEMBERS submitted by the 17 Michigan <u>state fire fighter's association</u> PROFESSIONAL FIRE 18 FIGHTERS UNION.

19 (d) One member appointed to the council by the governor from a
20 list of 3 OR MORE names submitted by the Michigan state firemen's
21 association.

(e) One member appointed to the council by the governor from a
 list of 3 OR MORE names submitted by the <u>metropolitan club of</u>
 America, incorporated <u>MICHIGAN FIRE SERVICE INSTRUCTORS</u>

25 ASSOCIATION.

26 (f) One member appointed to the council by the governor from a27 list of 2 OR MORE names submitted by the Michigan townships

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association and 2 OR MORE names submitted by the Michigan municipal
 league.

3 (2) All appointments made by the governor shall be with the4 advice and consent of the senate.

5 Sec. 4. <u>Members</u> A MEMBER of the council APPOINTED BEFORE 6 JANUARY 1, 2007 shall -hold office BE APPOINTED for a term of 3 years. -, except that of the members first appointed from nominees 7 submitted by the Michigan state fire chief's association, 1 shall 8 9 be appointed for 3 years and 1 for 2 years. A MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL APPOINTED AFTER DECEMBER 31, 2006 SHALL BE APPOINTED FOR A 10 11 TERM OF 4 YEARS. A vacancy created other than by expiration of a 12 term shall be appointed for the unexpired term of the member who is 13 to succeed in the same manner as the original appointment. Any 14 member may be reappointed for additional terms.

Sec. 5. The GOVERNOR MAY DESIGNATE A MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL TO 15 SERVE AS CHAIRPERSON OF THE COUNCIL AT THE PLEASURE OF THE 16 17 GOVERNOR. THE council - shall MAY designate - from among its members 18 a chairperson and a MEMBER AS vice-chairperson -who shall TO 19 serve for 1 year. - and who- THE VICE-CHAIRPERSON may be reelected. 20 Membership on the council -shall- DOES not constitute holding a 21 public office. Members of the council -shall ARE not -be- required 22 to take and file oaths of office before serving on the council. The 23 council shall not have the right to exercise any portion of the 24 sovereign power of -the- THIS state. -No- A member of the council 25 shall be IS NOT disqualified from holding any public office or 26 employment by reason of his or her appointment to membership on the 27 council, nor shall he or she forfeit any such office or employment

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, by reason of his or her appointment, notwithstanding the
 provisions of any general, special, or local laws or ordinances or
 city charters.

Sec. 8. The members of the council shall serve without
compensation, but shall be entitled to their actual expenses in
attending meetings and in the performance of their duties, SUBJECT
TO AVAILABLE APPROPRIATIONS.

8 Sec. 9. (1) The STATE FIRE MARSHAL, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE 9 council, shall prepare and publish standards with due consideration 10 to varying factors and special requirements of ORGANIZED fire 11 departments <u>or other organizations</u> in the following areas:

(a) Advisory standards of physical, educational, mental and
moral fitness, which shall govern the recruitment, selection, and
appointment of <u>fire fighters</u> FIREFIGHTERS.

(b) The approval by the council of <u>fire fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER training schools. The standards shall address, at least, the following issues:

18 (*i*) The qualification and certification of instructors.

19 (*ii*) The courses of study, attendance, record-keeping20 requirements, equipment, and facilities.

21 (*iii*) The visitation and evaluation of instructors and schools.
22 by the council.

(c) The establishment of subordinate regional training centers
in strategic geographic locations in order to serve the greatest
number of ORGANIZED fire departments that are unable to support
their own training programs.

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(2) Each ORGANIZED fire department - or other organization

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shall file a statement with the council designating at least 1
 training officer or training coordinator for the fire department.
 by November 30, 1988. If a training officer or training
 coordinator is changed, the ORGANIZED fire department, <u>or other</u>
 organization, within 7 days of the change, shall file a statement
 notifying the council of the change.

7 (3) The council shall develop and provide to each ORGANIZED fire department, - or other organization, - upon request of the 8 9 ORGANIZED fire department - or other organization and at no charge, a videotape, DIGITAL VIDEO DISC, OR OTHER ELECTRONIC FORM OF VIDEO 10 11 DISPLAY to be used in training fire fighters FIREFIGHTERS. The 12 videotape, DIGITAL VIDEO DISC, OR OTHER ELECTRONIC FORM OF VIDEO 13 DISPLAY shall not include training that requires a practical 14 demonstration. The videotape, DIGITAL VIDEO DISC, OR OTHER ELECTRONIC FORM OF VIDEO DISPLAY shall be based on the -fire 15 fighters I and II standards FOR FIRE FIGHTER I AND FIRE FIGHTER II 16 17 set forth in -the- "STANDARD FOR fire fighter professional 18 qualifications", national fire protection association -pamphlet 19 STANDARD no. 1001, -1987 2002 edition. The council may impose a 20 reasonable fee for loss, damage, or late return of a videotape, DIGITAL VIDEO DISC, OR OTHER ELECTRONIC FORM OF VIDEO DISPLAY 21 22 provided to -a AN ORGANIZED fire department -or other organization 23 under this subsection.

(4) The STATE FIRE MARSHAL, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE council,
shall develop and administer an examination, which shall include a
practical demonstration, a written or oral test, or a combination
thereof, to determine a person's competency in regard to the

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1 knowledge and skill requirements set forth in fire fighter I and 2 II standards of the STANDARDS FOR FIRE FIGHTER I AND FIRE FIGHTER II SET FORTH IN "STANDARD FOR fire fighter professional 3 4 qualifications", national fire protection association - pamphlet 5 STANDARD no. 1001, -1987- 2002 edition. The council, upon the 6 request of -a AN ORGANIZED fire department, -or other organization, shall administer the examination in each county at 7 least once every year. The examination shall be administered in 2 8 9 parts. Part 1 shall test the knowledge and skill requirements set 10 forth in fire fighter I, and part 2 shall test the knowledge and 11 skill requirements set forth in fire fighter II. The examination 12 may be retaken, as necessary, upon request from -a AN ORGANIZED 13 fire department. - or other organization.

14 (5) Within 12 months after a person's hiring date as a full15 time <u>fire fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER, the person must pass both part 1
16 and part 2 of the examination to be eligible for continued or
17 permanent full-time employment as a <u>fire fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER.

18 (6) Within 24 months after a person's appointment date as a 19 volunteer or paid on-call <u>fire fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER, a person must 20 pass part 1 of the examination to be eligible for continued 21 volunteer or paid on-call service as a <u>fire fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER. 22 (7) The examination described in this section shall not apply 23 to a person who is employed or under appointment as a <u>fire fighter</u> 24 FIREFIGHTER on October 1, 1988, unless -a THE person subsequently 25 changes his or her status from a volunteer or paid on-call -fire 26 fighter FIREFIGHTER to a full-time -fire fighter - FIREFIGHTER. (8) The STATE FIRE MARSHAL, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE council, 27

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1 shall review and monitor the state and federal standards relating 2 to live fire training exercises in structures and make 3 recommendations to the general industry safety standards commission 4 for any new or modified standards <u>which in their opinion are</u> 5 necessary for the protection of <u>fire fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER 6 trainees.

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Sec. 11. The STATE FIRE MARSHAL OR THE council may:

8 (a) Visit and inspect any <u>fire fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER training
9 school, or examine the curriculum or training procedures, for which
10 application for approval has been made.

(b) Issue certificates to <u>fire fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER training
 schools qualifying under the regulations <u>of the council</u>

13 PROMULGATED UNDER THIS ACT.

14 (c) Authorize the issuance of certificates of graduation or 15 diplomas by approved <u>fire fighter</u> FIREFIGHTER training schools to 16 <u>fire fighters</u> FIREFIGHTERS who have satisfactorily completed 17 minimum courses of study.

(d) Cooperate with state, federal, AND local fire agencies in establishing and conducting local or area schools —, or regional training centers for instruction and training of <u>fire fighters</u> FIREFIGHTERS of this state —, AND its cities, counties, townships, and villages.

23 (e) Make recommendations to THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL, THE
24 GOVERNOR, AND the legislature on matters pertaining to
25 qualification and training of <u>fire fighters</u> FIREFIGHTERS.
26 Sec. 13. There is created in the state treasury <u>a fire</u>

27 fighters THE FIREFIGHTERS training fund from which the legislature

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1 shall appropriate <u>such sums as are</u> AN AMOUNT OF MONEY deemed 2 necessary for the purposes of this act but <u>in no case shall such</u> 3 appropriations <u>be in excess of</u> FROM THE FIREFIGHTERS TRAINING 4 FUND SHALL NOT EXCEED 75% of <u>the amounts</u> MONEY paid into the 5 fund.

6 Sec. 14. The amounts annually appropriated by the legislature shall be paid by the state treasurer in accordance with the 7 accounting laws of the state upon certification of the executive 8 9 secretary of the council for the purpose of reimbursing the city, county, township or village for regular fire fighters in the fire 10 11 department in an amount not to exceed 1/2 of the salary paid to 12 each fire fighter meeting the recruitment standards and 13 participating in training meeting the standard prescribed pursuant 14 to this act during the period covered by the allocation, plus \$8.00 of the necessary living expenses incurred by such fire fighter 15 which are necessitated by training requiring that he be away from 16 his residence overnight. The amounts annually appropriated by the 17 legislature shall be paid by the state treasurer in accordance with 18 19 the accounting laws of the state upon certification of the executive secretary of the council for the purpose of reimbursing 20 the city, county, township or village for volunteer fire fighters 21 in an amount not to exceed \$12.50 for lost wages, to be matched by 22 23 the local municipality for each fire fighter meeting the 24 recruitment standards and participating in training meeting the 25 standard prescribed pursuant to this act during the period covered 26 by the allocation, plus \$8.00 of the necessary living expenses, to 27 be matched by the local municipality, incurred by such fire fighter

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which are necessitated by training requiring that he be away from 1 2 his residence overnight. If the moneys in the fire fighter training 3 fund to be appropriated by the legislature for such salary and 4 expense reimbursement are insufficient to allocate such amount to each participating city, county, township or village, the amount 5 6 allocated to each shall be reduced proportionately. In no event 7 shall any allocations be made to any city, county, township or village which has not, throughout the period covered by the 8 9 allocation, adhered to the standards established by the council as 10 applicable to personnel recruited or trained by such city, county, 11 township or village during such period.

(1) FROM THE AMOUNT ANNUALLY APPROPRIATED BY LAW FOR THE
COUNCIL, THE COUNCIL MAY REQUEST AND THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL MAY
APPROVE ANNUAL TRAINING EXPENDITURES FOR THE PURPOSES OF PAYMENTS
TO COUNTIES TO REIMBURSE ORGANIZED FIRE DEPARTMENTS FOR FIREFIGHTER
TRAINING AND OTHER ACTIVITIES REQUIRED UNDER THIS ACT.

17 (2) THE MONEY APPROVED UNDER SUBSECTION (1) SHALL BE DISBURSED
18 TO COUNTIES USING A FORMULA COMPOSED 70% OF COUNTY POPULATION AND
19 30% OF SQUARE MILES WITHIN THE COUNTY. A MINIMUM DISBURSEMENT TO
20 EACH COUNTY MAY BE REQUESTED BY THE COUNCIL AND APPROVED BY THE
21 STATE FIRE MARSHAL.

(3) THE CHAIRPERSON OF A FIREFIGHTER TRAINING COMMITTEE
ESTABLISHED IN EACH COUNTY SHALL SURVEY THE TRAINING NEEDS OF
ORGANIZED FIRE DEPARTMENTS IN THE COUNTY AND SHALL DISTRIBUTE THE
MONEY RECEIVED BY THE COUNTY UNDER THIS SECTION AS PRIORITIZED BY
THE ORGANIZED FIRE DEPARTMENTS IN THE COUNTY. IF MONEY DISTRIBUTED
TO A COUNTY UNDER THIS SECTION FOR A FISCAL YEAR IS NOT DESIGNATED

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BY THE CHAIRPERSON FOR DISTRIBUTION TO ORGANIZED FIRE DEPARTMENTS
 IN THE COUNTY BY JANUARY 1 OF THE FISCAL YEAR, THE UNDESIGNATED
 MONEY SHALL BE RETURNED TO THE COUNCIL FOR REDISTRIBUTION USING THE
 FORMULA UNDER SUBSECTION (2).

5 (4) MONEY SHALL BE DISTRIBUTED UNDER THIS SECTION ONLY TO AN 6 ORGANIZED FIRE DEPARTMENT THAT HAS ADHERED TO THE STANDARDS 7 ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS ACT FOR PERSONNEL RECRUITED OR TRAINED BY 8 THE ORGANIZED FIRE DEPARTMENT DURING THE CURRENT AND PRIOR FISCAL 9 YEARS.

10 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
11 unless Senate Bill No. 1133 of the 93rd Legislature is enacted into
12 law.
