THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 12. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), a person,
 driver, owner, carrier, lessee, or lessor shall not transfer or
 allow to be transferred a hazardous material from a cargo tank,
 portable tank, or any other container to any cargo tank, portable
 tank, fuel tank, or any other container on a highway, road, street,
 or alley within this state.

7 (2) Subsection (1) does not apply to the following transfer8 situations:

(a) Fueling machinery or equipment for construction, farm, and

(b) Fueling emergency vehicles.

3 (c) Under emergency conditions, a transfer may be made
4 provided it is approved by the local fire chief, the <u>state fire</u>

6 PREVENTION CODE, 1941 PA 207, MCL 29.1B, or a hazardous materials
7 investigator of the motor carrier division of the department of
8 state police pursuant to their respective authority under the fire
9 prevention code, 1941 PA 207, MCL 29.1 to 29.34.

10 (3) A person shall not overfill a container, including a 11 storage tank, during a transfer of a hazardous material from or 12 into a vehicle, so that hazardous material is released from the 13 package or container.
