

# HOUSE BILL No. 5073

August 3, 2005, Introduced by Reps. Williams, Phillips, Gonzales and Alma Smith and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to protect and promote the health and welfare of infants; to provide for training of certain individuals regarding infant safety; and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state departments and agencies.

**THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:**

1           Sec. 1. As used in this act:

2           (a) "Child care organization", "child caring institution",  
3 "children's camp", "child care center", "day care center", "family  
4 day care home", and "group day care home" mean those terms as  
5 defined in section 1 of 1973 PA 116, MCL 722.111.

6           (b) "Department" means the department of community health.

7           (c) "Person who has significant interaction with children"  
8 means a person who is 1 or more of the following:

1 (i) A first-time parent.

2 (ii) A WIC program recipient.

3 (iii) A person who works in a child care organization, a child  
4 caring institution, a children's camp, a child or day care center,  
5 a family day care home, or a group day care home.

6 (d) "WIC program" means the special supplemental food program  
7 for women, infants, and children under the child nutrition act of  
8 1966, Public Law 89-642, 42 USC 1771 to 1776, 1777 to 1786, and  
9 1788 to 1791.

10 Sec. 2. The department shall include in a class or training  
11 program offered to a person who has significant contact with  
12 children a course in infant cardiopulmonary resuscitation approved  
13 by the department and offered or approved by the Red Cross,  
14 American heart association, a licensed hospital, or a comparable  
15 organization or institution.

16 Sec. 3. The department may contract with a private agency,  
17 corporation, or association in order to comply with this act.
