# HOUSE BILL No. 5653

February 8, 2006, Introduced by Reps. Taub, Marleau, Stahl, Vander Veen, Elsenheimer, Newell, Nofs, Hildenbrand, Stakoe, Sheen, Stewart, Hune, Moore, Pastor, Brandenburg, LaJoy, Drolet, Huizenga, Garfield, Shaffer, Amos, Gaffney and Acciavatti and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled

"Public health code,"

by amending sections 2701, 5119, 16337, 17001, 17008, 17025, 17066, 17074, 17078, 17501, 17745a, 17745b, 18001, 18011, and 18021 (MCL 333.2701, 333.5119, 333.16337, 333.17001, 333.17008, 333.17025, 333.17066, 333.17074, 333.17078, 333.17501, 333.17745a, 333.17745b, 333.18001, 333.18011, and 333.18021), section 2701 as added by 1990 PA 16, section 5119 as amended by 2000 PA 209, section 16337 as added by 1993 PA 79, sections 17001 and 17501 as amended by 2005 PA 264, section 17025 as amended by 1980 PA 146, sections 17066, 17074, and 17078 as amended by 1990 PA 247, section 17745a as amended by 1999 PA 190, section 17745b as added by 1993 PA 306, and section 18021 as amended by 1993 PA 79, and by adding sections

18048, 18049, 18050, 18054, and 18056; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

#### THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 2701. As used in this part:

2 (a) "Board certified" means certified to practice in a
3 particular medical <u>speciality</u> SPECIALTY by a national board
4 recognized by the American board of medical specialties or the
5 American osteopathic association.

6 (b) "Certified nurse midwife" means an individual licensed as
7 a registered professional nurse under part 172 who has been issued
8 a specialty certification in the practice of nurse midwifery by the
9 board of nursing under section 17210.

10 (c) "Certified nurse practitioner" means an individual 11 licensed as a registered professional nurse under part 172 who has 12 been issued a specialty certification as a nurse practitioner by 13 the board of nursing under section 17210.

14 (d) "Designated nurse" means a certified nurse midwife or15 certified nurse practitioner.

16 (e) "Designated physician" means a physician qualified in 1 of17 the physician specialty areas identified in section 2711.

18 (f) "Designated professional" means a designated physician,19 designated nurse, or physician's assistant.

(g) "Health resource shortage area" means a geographic area,
population group, or health facility designated by the department
under section 2717.

23 (h) "Medicaid" means benefits under the program of medical24 assistance established under title XIX of the social security act,

42 U.S.C. 1396 to 1396d, 1396f to 1396g, and 1396i to 1396s 42 USC
 1396 TO 1396V, and administered by the department of <u>social</u> HUMAN
 services under the social welfare act, <u>Act No. 280 of the Public</u>
 Acts of 1939, being sections 400.1 to 400.121 of the Michigan
 Compiled Laws 1939 PA 280, MCL 400.1 TO 400.119B.

6 (i) "Medical school" means an accredited program for the7 training of individuals to become physicians.

8 (j) "Medicare" means benefits under the federal medicare
9 program established under title XVIII of the social security act,
10 42 U.S.C. 1395 to 1395b, 1395b-2 to 1395i, 1395i-1a to 1395i-2,
11 1395j to 1395dd, 1395ff to 1395mm, and 1395oo to 1395ccc 42 USC
12 1395 TO 1395HHH.

13 (k) "National health service corps" means the agency
14 established under section 331 of title III of the public health
15 service act, 42 U.S.C. USC 254d.

16 (l) "Nurse" means an individual licensed to engage in the17 practice of nursing under part 172.

18 (m) "Nursing program" means an accredited program for the19 training of individuals to become nurses.

20 (n) "Physician" means an individual licensed as a physician
21 under part 170 or an osteopathic physician under part 175.

22 (o) "Physician's assistant" means an individual licensed as a
23 physician's assistant under part 170. or part 175.

(p) "Physician's assistant program" means an accredited
program for the training of individuals to become physician's
assistants.

(q) "Service obligation" means the contractual obligation

undertaken by an individual under section 2705 or section 2707 to
 provide health care services for a determinable time period at a
 site designated by the department.

4 Sec. 5119. (1) An individual applying for a marriage license 5 shall be advised through the distribution of written educational 6 materials by the county clerk regarding prenatal care and the transmission and prevention of venereal disease and HIV infection. 7 The written educational materials shall describe the availability 8 9 to the applicant of tests for both venereal disease and HIV infection. The information shall include a list of locations where 10 11 HIV counseling and testing services funded by the department are 12 available. The written educational materials shall be approved or 13 prepared by the department.

14 (2) A county clerk shall not issue a marriage license to an 15 applicant who fails to sign and file with the county clerk an application for a marriage license that includes a statement with a 16 17 check-off box indicating that the applicant has received the 18 educational materials regarding the transmission and prevention of 19 both venereal disease and HIV infection and has been advised of 20 testing for both venereal disease and HIV infection, pursuant to 21 subsection (1).

(3) If either applicant for a marriage license undergoes a test for HIV or an antibody to HIV, and if the test results indicate that an applicant is HIV infected, the physician or a designee of the physician, the physician's assistant, the certified nurse midwife, or the certified nurse practitioner or the local health officer or designee of the local health officer

administering the test immediately shall inform both applicants of
 the test results, and shall counsel both applicants regarding the
 modes of HIV transmission, the potential for HIV transmission to a
 fetus, and protective measures.

(4) As used in this section:

6 (a) "Certified nurse midwife" means an individual licensed as
7 a registered professional nurse under part 172 who has been issued
8 a specialty certification in the practice of nurse midwifery by the
9 board of nursing under section 17210.

(b) "Certified nurse practitioner" means an individual
licensed as a registered professional nurse under part 172 who has
been issued a specialty certification as a nurse practitioner by
the board of nursing under section 17210.

14 (c) "Physician" means an individual licensed as a physician15 under part 170 or an osteopathic physician under part 175.

16 (d) "Physician's assistant" means an individual licensed as a
17 physician's assistant under part 170. or part 175.

Sec. 16337. Fees for a person licensed or seeking licensure
UNDER PART 170 to engage in practice as a physician's assistant
under <u>either</u> part 170, <u>or</u> part 175, OR PART 180 are as follows:

27 (i) A medical school approved by the board.

(*ii*) A hospital licensed under article 17 that meets all of the
 following requirements:

3 (A) Was the sole sponsor or a co-sponsor, if each other co-4 sponsor is either a medical school approved by the board or a 5 hospital owned by the federal government and directly operated by the United States department of veterans' affairs, of not less than 6 4 postgraduate education residency programs approved by the board 7 under section 17031(1) for not less than the 3 years immediately 8 9 preceding the date of an application for a limited license under 10 section 16182(2)(c) or an application for a full license under 11 section 17031(2), provided that at least 1 of the residency 12 programs is in the specialty area of medical practice, or in a 13 specialty area that includes the subspecialty of medical practice, 14 in which the applicant for a limited license proposes to practice or in which the applicant for a full license has practiced for the 15 16 hospital.

(B) Has spent not less than \$2,000,000.00 for medical 17 18 education during each of the 3 years immediately preceding the date 19 of an application for a limited license under section 16182(2)(c) 20 or an application for a full license under section 17031(2). As 21 used in this subparagraph, "medical education" means the education 22 of physicians and candidates for degrees or licenses to become 23 physicians, including, but not limited to, physician staff, 24 residents, interns, and medical students.

(b) "Electrodiagnostic studies" means the testing of
neuromuscular functions utilizing nerve conduction tests and needle
electromyography. It does not include the use of surface

2 (c) "Medical care services" means those services within the
3 scope of practice of physicians licensed by the board, except those

7 (d) "Physician" means an individual licensed under this8 article to engage in the practice of medicine.

9 (E) "PODIATRIST" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL LICENSED UNDER THIS
10 ARTICLE TO ENGAGE IN THE PRACTICE OF PODIATRIC MEDICINE AND
11 SURGERY.

(F) (e) "Practice of medicine" means the diagnosis, treatment, prevention, cure, or relieving of a human disease, ailment, defect, complaint, or other physical or mental condition, by attendance, advice, device, diagnostic test, or other means, or offering, undertaking, attempting to do, or holding oneself out as able to do, any of these acts.

(G) (f) "Practice as a physician's assistant" means the
 practice of medicine, or osteopathic medicine and surgery, OR
 PODIATRIC MEDICINE AND SURGERY performed under the supervision of a
 physician or physicians PODIATRIST licensed under this part or
 part 175 ARTICLE.

(H) (g) "Supervision" means that term as defined in section
16109, except that it also includes the existence of a
predetermined plan for emergency situations, including, but not
limited to, the designation of a physician to supervise a
physician's assistant in the absence of the primary supervising

2 (I) (h) "Task force" means the joint task force created in

8 Sec. 17008. Practice as a physician's assistant is a health
9 profession subfield of the practice of medicine, <u>and</u> osteopathic
10 medicine and surgery, AND PODIATRIC MEDICINE AND SURGERY.

11 Sec. 17025. (1) A joint task force is created for the health 12 profession subfields licensed under this part. - and part 175. The 13 task force shall consist of the following -9-10 members, who shall 14 meet the requirements of part 161: 1 member each from the board of 15 THE BOARD OF PODIATRIC MEDICINE AND SURGERY holding a license other 16 17 than a health profession subfield license, 5 physician's assistants, and 2 public members. 18

19 (2) The requirement of section 16135(d) that a task force
20 member shall have practiced that profession for 2 years immediately

 assistant.

Sec. 17074. (1) A physician's assistant shall not undertake or
represent that he or she is qualified to undertake provision of a
medical care service that he or she knows or reasonably should know
to be outside his or her competence or is prohibited by law.

(2) A physician's assistant shall not:

9 (a) Perform acts, tasks, or functions to determine the
10 refractive state of a human eye or to treat refractive anomalies of
11 the human eye, or both.

(b) Determine the spectacle or contact lens prescription
specifications required to treat refractive anomalies of the human
eye, or determine modification of spectacle or contact lens
prescription specifications, or both.

16 (3) A physician's assistant may perform routine visual 17 screening or testing, postoperative care, or assistance in the care 18 of medical diseases of the eye under the supervision of a 19 physician.

20 (4) A PHYSICIAN'S ASSISTANT ACTING UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A
21 PODIATRIST SHALL ONLY PERFORM THOSE DUTIES INCLUDED WITHIN THE
22 SCOPE OF PRACTICE OF THAT SUPERVISING PODIATRIST.

Sec. 17078. (1) A physician's assistant is the agent of the
supervising physician OR SUPERVISING PODIATRIST. A communication
made to a physician's assistant that would be a privileged
communication if made to the supervising physician OR SUPERVISING
PODIATRIST is a privileged communication to the physician's

1 assistant and the supervising physician OR SUPERVISING PODIATRIST

2 to the same extent as if the communication were made to the

3 supervising physician OR SUPERVISING PODIATRIST.

4 (2) A physician's assistant shall conform to minimal standards
5 of acceptable and prevailing practice for the supervising physician
6 OR SUPERVISING PODIATRIST.

Sec. 17501. (1) As used in this part:

8 (a) "Electrodiagnostic studies" means the testing of
9 neuromuscular functions utilizing nerve conduction tests and needle
10 electromyography. It does not include the use of surface
11 electromyography.

(b) "Medical care services" means those services within the scope of practice of physicians licensed and approved by the board, except those services that the board determines shall not be delegated by a physician without endangering the health and safety of patients as provided for in section 17548(3).

17 (c) "Physician" means an individual licensed under this
18 article to engage in the practice of osteopathic medicine and
19 surgery.

20 (d) "Practice of osteopathic medicine and surgery" means a 21 separate, complete, and independent school of medicine and surgery 22 utilizing full methods of diagnosis and treatment in physical and 23 mental health and disease, including the prescription and 24 administration of drugs and biologicals, operative surgery, 25 obstetrics, radiological and other electromagnetic emissions, and placing special emphasis on the interrelationship of the 26 27 musculoskeletal system to other body systems.

(e) "Practice as a physician's assistant" means the practice
 of MEDICINE, osteopathic medicine AND SURGERY, AND PODIATRIC
 MEDICINE AND SURGERY performed under the supervision of a physician
 OR PODIATRIST licensed under this <u>part or part 170</u> ARTICLE.

(f) "Supervision" has the meaning ascribed to it in section
16109 except that it includes the existence of a predetermined plan
for emergency situations, including, but not limited to, the
designation of a physician to supervise a physician's assistant in
the absence of the primary supervising physician.

10 (g) "Task force" means the joint task force created in 11 sections SECTION 17025. and 17525.

(2) In addition to the definitions in this part, article 1
contains general definitions and principles of construction
applicable to all articles in the code and part 161 contains
definitions applicable to this part.

16 Sec. 17745a. (1) As used in this section:

17 (a) "Medicaid" means the program of medical assistance
18 established under title XIX of the social security act, -chapter
19 531, 49 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. 1396 to 1396f, 1396g-1 to 1396r-6, and
20 1396r-8 42 USC 1396 to 1396v.

(b) "Medicare" means the federal medicare program established
under title XVIII of the social security act, <u>chapter 531, 49</u>
Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. 1395 to 1395b, 1395b-2, 1395b-6 to 1395b-7,
1395c to 1395i, 1395i-2 to 1395i-5, 1395j to 1395t, 1395u to 1395w,

7 independence agency DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES as a provider

9 400.119b, and verified by the department of community health.

(4) Before dispensing a prescription drug to a patient in an industrial clinic or other prescriber practice location without an on-site pharmacy, a dispensing prescriber who intends to charge for dispensing the drug shall give a written prescription to the patient and shall instruct the patient that he or she may elect to have the prescription filled by the dispensing prescriber or the patient's pharmacy of choice.

The dispensing prescriber also shall list the charge for dispensing the prescription drug as a separate item on the patient's bill.

9 Sec. 18011. A person shall not engage in the practice of
10 podiatric medicine and surgery OR PRACTICE AS A PHYSICIAN'S
11 ASSISTANT unless licensed or otherwise authorized by this article.
12 Sec. 18021. (1) The Michigan board of podiatric medicine and
13 surgery is created in the department and shall consist of the
14 following 9 voting members who shall meet the requirements of part
15 161: 5 podiatrists and 4 public members.

16 (2) THE BOARD OF PODIATRIC MEDICINE AND SURGERY DOES NOT HAVE

4 (3) THE DEPARTMENT MAY PROMULGATE RULES FOR THE APPROPRIATE 5 DELEGATION AND UTILIZATION OF A PHYSICIAN'S ASSISTANT BY A 6 PODIATRIST, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, RULES TO PROHIBIT OR 7 OTHERWISE RESTRICT THE DELEGATION OF CERTAIN PODIATRIC SERVICES OR 8 REQUIRE HIGHER LEVELS OF SUPERVISION IF THE BOARD DETERMINES THAT 9 SUCH SERVICES REQUIRE EXTENSIVE TRAINING, EDUCATION, OR ABILITY OR 10 POSE SERIOUS RISKS TO THE HEALTH OR SAFETY OF PATIENTS.

18 (2) SUBJECT TO SECTION 18048, A PODIATRIST WHO SUPERVISES A 19 PHYSICIAN'S ASSISTANT MAY ONLY DELEGATE TO THE PHYSICIAN'S 20 ASSISTANT THE PERFORMANCE OF PODIATRIC SERVICES FOR A PATIENT WHO 21 IS UNDER THE CASE MANAGEMENT RESPONSIBILITY OF THE PODIATRIST, IF 22 THE DELEGATION IS CONSISTENT WITH THE PHYSICIAN'S ASSISTANT'S 23 TRAINING.
