A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code,"

by amending section 1531 (MCL 380.1531), as amended by 2000 PA 497.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1531. (1) Except as provided in this act, the
 superintendent of public instruction shall determine the
 requirements for and issue all licenses and certificates for
 teachers, including preprimary teachers, and the requirements for
 an endorsement of teachers as qualified counselors and an
 endorsement of teachers for teaching a foreign language in an
 elementary grade in the public schools of the state.
 - (2) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the superintendent of public instruction shall only issue a teaching certificate to a person who has passed appropriate examinations as

- 1 follows:
- 2 (a) For a secondary level teaching certificate, has passed
- 3 both the basic skills examination and the appropriate available
- 4 subject area examination for each subject area in which he or she
- 5 applies to be certified.
- 6 (b) For an elementary level teaching certificate, has passed
- 7 the basic skills examination and, if it is available, the
- 8 elementary certification examination, and has passed the
- 9 appropriate available subject area examination for each subject
- 10 area, if any, in which he or she applies to be certified.
- 11 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the
- 12 superintendent of public instruction shall issue a Michigan
- 13 teaching certificate to a person holding a certificate from another
- 14 state or a teaching degree from an out-of-state teacher preparation
- 15 institution who applies for a Michigan teaching certificate only if
- 16 the person passes appropriate examinations as follows:
- 17 (a) For a secondary level teaching certificate, pass both the
- 18 basic skills examination and the appropriate available subject area
- 19 examination for each subject area in which he or she applies to be
- 20 certified. The superintendent of public instruction may accept
- 21 passage of an equivalent examination approved by the superintendent
- 22 of public instruction to meet 1 or both of these requirements.
- 23 (b) For an elementary level teaching certificate, pass the
- 24 basic skills examination and, if it is available, the elementary
- 25 certification examination, and pass the appropriate available
- 26 subject area examination for each subject area, if any, in which he
- 27 or she applies to be certified. The superintendent of public

- 1 instruction may accept passage of an equivalent examination
- 2 approved by the superintendent of public instruction to meet 1 or
- 3 more of these requirements.
- 4 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the
- 5 superintendent of public instruction shall only issue a teaching
- 6 certificate to a person who has met the elementary or secondary, as
- 7 applicable, reading credit requirements established under
- 8 superintendent of public instruction rule. HOWEVER, BEGINNING JULY
- 9 1, 2006, NOTWITHSTANDING ANY RULE TO THE CONTRARY, THE
- 10 SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION SHALL ONLY ISSUE A TEACHING
- 11 CERTIFICATE TO A PERSON WHO HAS COMPLETED ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 12 (A) FOR AN ELEMENTARY LEVEL TEACHING CERTIFICATE, AT LEAST 9
- 13 CREDITS IN THE TEACHING OF READING AND, FOR A SECONDARY LEVEL
- 14 TEACHING CERTIFICATE, AT LEAST 6 CREDITS IN THE TEACHING OF
- 15 READING.
- 16 (B) FIELD WORK AT A SCHOOL IN WHICH THE PERCENTAGE OF PUPILS
- 17 WITH A LEARNING DISABILITY EXCEEDS THE STATEWIDE PERCENTAGE OF
- 18 PUPILS WITH A LEARNING DISABILITY AND THAT HAS AN EARLY
- 19 INTERVENTION PROGRAM DESIGNED TO REDUCE THE NUMBER OF PUPILS WITH A
- 20 LEARNING DISABILITY.
- 21 (C) TRAINING IN 1-ON-1 EARLY INTERVENTION DESIGNED TO REDUCE
- 22 THE NEED FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION PLACEMENT, IN A PROGRAM SIMILAR TO
- 23 THE PROGRAMS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 34 OF THE STATE SCHOOL AID ACT OF
- 24 1979, MCL 388.1734.
- 25 (5) Not later than 1 year after the effective date of the
- 26 amendatory act that added this subsection JANUARY 11, 2002, the
- 27 superintendent of public instruction, in cooperation with

- 1 appropriate curriculum specialists and teacher educators, shall
- 2 revise existing reading standards to recognize reading disorders
- 3 and to enable teachers to make referrals for instruction and
- 4 support for pupils with reading disorders.
- 5 (6) $\frac{(5)}{(5)}$ Subject to subsection $\frac{(7)}{(8)}$, if a person holding a
- 6 teaching certificate from another state applies to the
- 7 superintendent of public instruction for a Michigan teaching
- 8 certificate and meets the requirements of this subsection, the
- 9 superintendent of public instruction shall issue to the person a
- 10 Michigan professional education teaching certificate and applicable
- 11 endorsements comparable to those the person holds in the other
- 12 state, without requiring the person to pass a basic skills
- 13 examination or the applicable subject area examination otherwise
- 14 required under subsection (2) or (3). To be eligible to receive a
- 15 Michigan professional education teaching certificate under this
- 16 subsection, a person shall provide evidence satisfactory to the
- 17 department that he or she meets all of the following requirements:
- 18 (a) Has taught successfully for at least 3 years in a position
- 19 for which the person's teaching certification from the other state
- 20 was valid.
- 21 (b) Has earned, after his or her initial certification in
- 22 another state, at least 18 semester credit hours in a planned
- 23 course of study at an institution of higher education approved by
- 24 the superintendent of public instruction or has earned, at any
- 25 time, a master's or doctoral degree approved by the superintendent
- 26 of public instruction.
- (c) Has met the elementary or secondary, as applicable,

- 1 reading credit requirement established under superintendent of
- 2 public instruction rule.
- (7) (6) A person who receives a teaching certificate and
- 4 endorsement or endorsements under subsection (5) (6) is eligible to
- 5 receive 1 or more additional endorsements comparable to
- 6 endorsements the person holds in another state only if the person
- 7 passes the appropriate subject area examinations required under
- **8** subsection (2) or (3).
- 9 (8) -(7) The superintendent of public instruction shall deny
- 10 a Michigan teaching certificate to a person described in subsection
- 11 (5) (6) for fraud, material misrepresentation, or concealment in
- 12 the person's application for a certificate or for a conviction for
- which a person's teaching certificate may be revoked under section
- **14** 1535a.
- 15 (9) -(8)— The department, based upon criteria recommended
- 16 pursuant to subsection (10) (11), shall provide to approved teacher
- 17 education institutions guidelines and criteria approved by the
- 18 superintendent of public instruction for use in the development or
- 19 selection of a basic skills examination and approved guidelines and
- 20 criteria for use in the development or selection of subject area
- 21 examinations.
- 22 (10) -(9) For the purposes of this section, the
- 23 superintendent of public instruction, based upon criteria
- 24 recommended pursuant to subsection (10) (11), shall develop,
- 25 select, or develop and select 1 or more basic skills examinations
- 26 and subject area examinations. In addition, the superintendent of
- 27 public instruction, based upon criteria recommended pursuant to

- 1 subsection (10) (11), shall approve an elementary certification
- 2 examination and a reading subject area examination.
- 3 (11) $\frac{(10)}{(10)}$ The superintendent of public instruction shall
- 4 appoint an 11-member teacher examination advisory committee
- 5 comprised of representatives of approved teacher education
- 6 institutions and Michigan education organizations and associations.
- 7 Not more than 1/2 of the members comprising this committee shall be
- 8 certified teachers. This committee shall recommend criteria to be
- 9 used by the superintendent of public instruction in the
- 10 development, selection, or development and selection of 1 or more
- 11 basic skills examinations, and criteria to be used by the
- 12 superintendent of public instruction in the development, selection,
- 13 or development and selection of subject area examinations. In
- 14 addition, the committee shall recommend guidelines for the use and
- 15 administration of those examinations. The basic skills examinations

- 23 instruction. An approved teacher education institution that
- 24 develops its own examination is liable for any litigation that
- 25 results from the use of its examination.
- 26 (12) -(11) The superintendent of public instruction shall
- 27 appoint a 7-member standing technical advisory council comprised of

- 1 persons who are experts in measurement and assessment. This council
- 2 shall advise the superintendent of public instruction and the
- 3 teacher examination committee on the validity, reliability, and
- 4 other technical standards of the examinations that will be used or
- 5 are being used and of the administration and use of those
- 6 examinations.
- 7 (13) -(12) Not later than November 30 of each year, the
- 8 superintendent of public instruction shall submit in writing a
- 9 report on the development or selection and use of the basic skills
- 10 examination, the elementary certification examination, and the
- 11 subject area examinations to the house and senate education
- 12 committees. The report shall also contain a financial statement
- 13 regarding revenue received from the assessment of fees levied
- 14 pursuant to subsection (14) (15) and the amount of and any purposes
- 15 for which that revenue was expended.
- 16 (14) $\frac{(13)}{(13)}$ The basic skills examination, the elementary
- 17 certification examination, and the subject area examinations
- 18 required by this section may be taken at different times during an
- 19 approved teacher preparation program, but the basic skills
- 20 examination must be passed before a person is enrolled for student
- 21 teaching and the elementary certification examination and the
- 22 subject area examinations, as applicable, must be passed before a
- 23 person is recommended for certification.
- 24 (15) -(14) The department, or if approved by the
- 25 superintendent of public instruction, a private testing service,
- 26 may assess fees for taking the basic skills examination, elementary
- 27 certification examination, and the subject area examinations. The

- 1 fees, which shall be set by the superintendent of public
- 2 instruction, shall not exceed \$50.00 for a basic skills examination
- 3 or \$75.00 for an elementary certification examination or a subject
- 4 area examination. However, if a subject area examination for
- 5 vocational education includes a performance examination, an
- 6 additional fee may be assessed for taking the performance
- 7 examination, not to exceed the actual cost of administering the
- 8 performance examination. Fees received by the department shall be
- 9 expended solely for administrative expenses that it incurs in
- 10 implementing this section.
- 11 (16) -(15)— If a person holding a teaching certificate from
- 12 another state applies for a Michigan teaching certificate and meets
- 13 all requirements for the Michigan teaching certificate except
- 14 passage of the appropriate examinations under subsection (3), the
- 15 superintendent of public instruction shall issue a nonrenewable
- 16 temporary teaching certificate, good for 1 year, to the person. The
- 17 superintendent of public instruction shall not issue a Michigan
- 18 teaching certificate to the person after expiration of the
- 19 temporary teaching certificate unless the person passes appropriate
- 20 examinations as described in subsection (3).
- 21 (17) $\overline{(16)}$ As used in this section:
- 22 (a) "Basic skills examination" means an examination developed
- 23 or selected by the superintendent of public instruction or
- 24 developed pursuant to subsection (10) (11) by an approved teacher
- 25 education institution for the purpose of demonstrating the
- 26 applicant's knowledge and understanding of basic language and
- 27 mathematical skills and other skills necessary for the certificate

- 1 sought, and for determining whether or not an applicant is eligible
- 2 for a provisional Michigan teaching certificate.
- 3 (b) "Elementary certification examination" means a
- 4 comprehensive examination for elementary certification that has
- 5 been developed or selected by the superintendent of public
- 6 instruction for demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and
- 7 understanding of the core subjects normally taught in elementary
- 8 classrooms and for determining whether or not an applicant is
- 9 eligible for an elementary level teaching certificate.
- 10 (c) "Subject area examination" means an examination related to
- 11 a specific area of certification, which examination has been
- 12 developed or selected by the superintendent of public instruction
- 13 for the purpose of demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and
- 14 understanding of the subject matter and determining whether or not
- 15 an applicant is eligible for a Michigan teaching certificate.
- 16 (18) $\frac{(17)}{}$ The superintendent of public instruction shall
- 17 promulgate rules for the implementation of this section.
- 18 (19) $\frac{}{}$ (18) Notwithstanding any rule to the contrary, the
- 19 superintendent of public instruction shall continue to issue state
- 20 elementary or secondary continuing education certificates pursuant
- 21 to R 390.1132(1) of the Michigan administrative code to persons who
- 22 completed the requirements of that rule by December 31, 1992 and
- 23 who apply for that certificate not later than March 15, 1994. If
- 24 the superintendent of public instruction has issued a state
- 25 elementary or secondary professional education certificate to a
- 26 person described in this section, the superintendent of public
- 27 instruction shall consider the person to have a state elementary or

1 secondary, as applicable, continuing education certificate.
