A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled

"Natural resources and environmental protection act,"

by amending section 74104 (MCL 324.74104), as added by 1995 PA 58.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 74104. (1) The department shall establish an "adopt-a park" program that will allow volunteer groups to assist state park
 staff in maintaining and enhancing state parks.

4 (2) Subject to subsection (3), volunteer groups in the adopt5 a-park program may adopt any available state park and may choose
6 any 1 or more of the following volunteer activities:

(a) Spring cleanups.

(b) Environmental activities.

- (c) Accessibility projects.
- 2 (d) Special events.

6 (3) The department shall designate the activities to be
7 performed by a volunteer group in the adopt-a-park program. The
8 department may provide for more than 1 volunteer group to adopt a
9 state park.

10 (4) A volunteer group that wishes to participate in the adopt-11 a-park program shall submit an application to the department on a 12 form provided by the department. Additionally, volunteer groups 13 shall agree to the following:

14 (a) Volunteer groups shall participate in the program for at15 least a 2-year period.

16 (b) Volunteer groups shall consist of at least 6 people who 17 are 18 years of age or older, unless the volunteer group is a 18 school or scout organization, in which case the volunteers may be 19 under 18 years of age.

20 (c) Volunteer groups shall give a total of 400 hours over a 2-21 year period.

22 (d) Volunteer groups shall comply with other reasonable23 requirements of the department.

(5) A state park manager may issue to volunteers who are
actively working on adopt-a-park projects that last more than 1 day
free camping permits if campsites are available. A state park
manager may waive state park entry fees for volunteers entering

1 state parks to work on adopt-a-park projects.

2 (6) The department shall design and erect near the state park
3 headquarters of each state park in the adopt-a-park program an
4 adopt-a-park program sign with the name of the volunteer group's
5 sponsoring organization listed for each volunteer group that has
6 contributed at least 100 service hours by volunteers.

(7) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE A VOLUNTEER GROUP CONDUCTING 7 LITTER CLEANUP UNDER THE ADOPT-A-PARK PROGRAM WITH A METHOD FOR THE 8 VOLUNTEER GROUP TO RECORD A GENERAL CHARACTERIZATION OF THE TYPES 9 AND AMOUNT OF TRASH COLLECTED DURING THE GROUP'S CLEANUP EFFORT. 10 11 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REQUEST THE GROUP TO FORWARD THE INFORMATION 12 RECORDED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ON COMPLETION. 13 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect unless Senate Bill No. 767 14
