by amending section 1 (MCL 456.251), as amended by 1982 PA 112.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 1. (1) That any 5 FIVE or more persons desirous to organize an association for the purpose of preserving and protecting bodies of deceased persons before burial, may execute under their hands and acknowledge before some person authorized to take the acknowledgment of deeds, the duplicate articles of agreement, as hereinafter specified, 1 copy whereof shall be filed with the corporation and securities bureau OF COMMERCIAL SERVICES of the department of commerce LABOR AND ECONOMIC GROWTH, and upon the execution and acknowledgment of such articles and the filing

thereof, the signers thereof, and those who may hereafter become
associated with them, shall become a body politic and corporate for
the purpose set forth in said articles.

4 (2) A CORPORATION FORMED FOR THE PURPOSE DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (1) MAY BE FORMED UNDER THE BUSINESS CORPORATION ACT, 5 1972 PA 284, MCL 450.1101 TO 450.2098, INSTEAD OF UNDER THIS ACT. 6 7 (3) THE CEMETERY COMMISSIONER, AS FURTHER DESCRIBED IN THE CEMETERY REGULATION ACT, 1968 PA 251, MCL 456.521 TO 456.543, HAS 8 AUTHORITY TO INVESTIGATE A CORPORATION FORMED UNDER THIS ACT FOR 9 10 VIOLATIONS OF THIS ACT REGARDING THE TRUSTING OR ESCROWING OF MONEY 11 UNDER THIS ACT FOR ANY PURPOSE.

12 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect 13 unless Senate Bill No.____ or House Bill No. 6033(request no. 14 03313'07 **) of the 94th Legislature is enacted into law.
