## **HOUSE BILL No. 4593**

April 5, 2007, Introduced by Rep. Melton and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 1980 PA 300, entitled
"The public school employees retirement act of 1979,"
by amending section 61 (MCL 38.1361), as amended by 2006 PA 158.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 61. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, if
  a retirant is receiving a retirement allowance other than a
  disability allowance payable under this act or under former 1945 PA
  136, on account of either age or years of personal service
  performed, or both, and becomes employed by a reporting unit, the
  following shall take place:

  (a) The retirant shall not be entitled to a new final average
  - (a) The retirant shall not be entitled to a new final average compensation or additional service credit under this retirement system unless additional service is performed equivalent to 5 or more years of service credit or, if the retirant has contributed to

- 1 the member investment plan, the equivalent of 3 or more years of
- 2 service credit. The retirant may elect to have the retirement
- 3 allowance recomputed based on the added credit or the final average
- 4 compensation resulting from the added service, or both. A
- 5 retirement allowance shall not be recomputed until the retirant
- 6 pays into the retirement system an amount equal to the retirant's
- 7 new final average compensation multiplied by the percentage
- 8 determined under section 41(2) for normal cost and unfunded
- 9 actuarial accrued liabilities, not including the percentage
- 10 required for the funding of health benefits, multiplied by the
- 11 total service credit in the period in which the retirant's
- 12 additional service was performed.
- 13 (b) The retirant's retirement allowance shall be reduced by
- 14 the lesser of the amount that the earnings in a calendar year
- 15 exceed the amount permitted without a reduction of benefits under
- 16 the social security act, chapter 531, 49 Stat. 620, or 1/3 of the
- 17 retirant's final average compensation. For purposes of computing
- 18 allowable earnings under this subdivision, the final average
- 19 compensation shall be increased by 5% for each full year of
- 20 retirement.
- 21 (2) The retirement system may offset retirement benefits
- 22 payable under this act against amounts owed to the retirement
- 23 system by a retirant or retirement allowance beneficiary.
- 24 (3) Subsection (1) does not apply to a retirant if all of the
- 25 following circumstances exist:
- 26 (a) The retirant is a former teacher or administrator employed
- 27 in a teaching or research capacity by a university that is

- 1 considered a reporting unit for the limited purpose described in
- $\mathbf{2}$  section 7(3).
- 3 (b) The retirant is not eligible to use any service or
- 4 compensation attributable to the employment described in
- 5 subdivision (a) for a recomputation of his or her retirement
- 6 allowance.
- 7 (c) A university that employs a retirant pursuant to this
- 8 subsection shall report such employment to the retirement system by
- 9 July 1 of each year. The report to be filed shall include the name
- 10 of the retirant, the capacity in which the retirant is employed,
- 11 and the total annual compensation paid to the retirant.
- 12 (4) Until July 1, 2011, subsection (1) does not apply to a
- 13 retirant if all of the following circumstances exist:
- 14 (a) The retirant is employed by a reporting unit that has an
- 15 approved emergency situation, not including a situation caused by a
- 16 labor dispute, that necessitates the hiring of a retirant in the
- 17 capacity of a teacher, principal, stationary engineer,
- 18 administrator, or other category as determined by the
- 19 superintendent of public instruction to prevent depriving students
- 20 of an education. The chief executive officer or superintendent of
- 21 the school district shall include with the written notification
- 22 documentation showing that more than 8% of all classes in the
- 23 district during the 1998-99 school year are taught by full-time
- 24 substitute teachers who are not certificated in the subjects or
- 25 grade levels which they teach. Within 30 days after receipt of the
- 26 notification and documentation under this subdivision, the
- 27 department of education shall notify the chief executive officer or

- 1 superintendent and the retirement system of its approval or
- 2 disapproval of the emergency situation. If disapproved by the
- 3 department of education, this subsection does not apply.
- 4 (b) The retirant is employed under an emergency situation
- 5 described in subdivision (a) for a period not to exceed 6-10 years.
- 6 (c) The retirant is not eligible to use any service or
- 7 compensation attributable to the employment described in
- 8 subdivision (a) for a recomputation of his or her retirement
- 9 allowance.
- 10 (5) On or before July 1, 1999, the state superintendent of
- 11 public instruction shall compile a listing of critical shortage
- 12 disciplines. This listing shall be updated annually.
- 13 (6) Until July 1, 2011, subsection (1) does not apply to a
- 14 retirant if all of the following circumstances exist:
- 15 (a) The retirant is employed by a reporting unit that has a
- 16 situation, not including a situation caused by a labor dispute,
- 17 that necessitates the hiring of a retirant in an area that has been
- 18 identified by the state superintendent of public instruction as a
- 19 critical shortage discipline pursuant to subsection (5).
- 20 (b) The retirant is employed under a situation described in
- 21 subdivision (a) for a period not to exceed 6-10 years.
- (c) The retirant is not eligible to use any service or
- 23 compensation attributable to the employment described in
- 24 subdivision (a) for a recomputation of his or her retirement
- 25 allowance.
- 26 (7) The provisions of subsections (4) and (6) shall only apply
- 27 for retirants who have been retired for at least 12 months before

1 becoming employed under this section.
