HOUSE BILL No. 5158

September 5, 2007, Introduced by Rep. Sheen and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled

"Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 669 (MCL 257.669), as amended by 2002 PA 534.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 669. (1) Except as provided in subsections (2), (3), and
- 2 (4), the driver of a motor vehicle transporting 16 or more
- 3 passengers including the driver, a motor vehicle carrying
- 4 passengers for hire, or a motor vehicle that is required to be
- 5 marked or placarded under 49 C.F.R. CFR parts 100 to 180 before
- 6 crossing a railroad track at grade, shall activate the vehicle
- 7 hazard warning lights and stop the vehicle within 50 feet but not
 - less than 15 feet from the nearest rail. While stopped, the driver

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- 1 shall listen and look in both directions along the track for an
- 2 approaching train and for signals indicating the approach of a
- 3 train, and shall not proceed until the driver can do so safely.
- 4 After stopping as required in this subsection, and upon proceeding
- 5 when it is safe to do so, the driver of the vehicle shall cross
- 6 only in a gear of the vehicle that does not require changing gears
- 7 while traversing the crossing. The driver shall not shift gears
- 8 while crossing the track or tracks.
- 9 (2) A stop need not be made at a railroad track grade crossing
- 10 where a police officer or a traffic-control signal directs traffic
- 11 to proceed.
- 12 (3) A stop need not be made at an abandoned railroad track
- 13 grade crossing. As used in this subsection, "abandoned railroad
- 14 track" means a railroad track which meets all of the following
- 15 requirements:
- 16 (A) $\frac{(i)}{(i)}$ The track has been abandoned pursuant to federal law.
- 17 (B) $\frac{(ii)}{(ii)}$ The track has been covered or removed, HAS BEEN
- 18 PARTIALLY REMOVED AT OR ADJACENT TO THE RAILROAD TRACK GRADE
- 19 CROSSING, OR IS OTHERWISE UNUSABLE FOR RAIL TRANSPORTATION.
- 20 (C) (iii)—All signs, signals, and other warning devices are
- 21 removed.
- 22 (4) A stop shall not be made at an industrial or spur line
- 23 railroad grade crossing marked with a sign reading "exempt". Exempt
- 24 signs may be erected only by or with the consent of the state
- 25 transportation department after notice to and an opportunity to be
- 26 heard by all railroads operating over that industrial or spur line.
- 27 (5) A person who violates this section is responsible for a

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- 1 civil infraction.
- 2 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect

- 4 03450'07 a) of the 94th Legislature is enacted into law.

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
