## **HOUSE BILL No. 6261**

June 19, 2008, Introduced by Reps. Donigan, Miller, Angerer, Vagnozzi, Coulouris, Simpson, Robert Jones, Valentine, Bennett, Constan, Ebli, Clack, Bauer, Leland, Polidori, Corriveau and Dean and referred to the Committee on Senior Health, Security, and Retirement.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled

"Public health code,"

by amending sections 21743, 21755, 21757, and 21782 (MCL 333.21743, 333.21755, 333.21757, and 333.21782) and by adding section 21714.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

SEC. 21714. (1) BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2008, A PERSON SHALL NOT ESTABLISH, OPERATE, OR MAINTAIN A NURSING HOME UNLESS PROOF OF LIABILITY INSURANCE COVERAGE ON THAT NURSING HOME IS MAINTAINED IN AN AMOUNT NOT LESS THAN \$1,000,000.00 PER OCCURRENCE. AN APPLICANT OR LICENSEE UNDER THIS PART SHALL INCLUDE PROOF OF LIABILITY INSURANCE COVERAGE AS REQUIRED IN THIS SECTION IN ITS APPLICATION FOR A LICENSE OR LICENSE RENEWAL UNDER SECTION 20142.

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(2) AS USED IN THIS SUBSECTION "LIABILITY INSURANCE" MEANS
 INSURANCE ON RISKS BASED UPON NEGLECT OF A RESIDENT FOR WHICH A
 LICENSEE IS OR MAY BE RESPONSIBLE.

Sec. 21743. (1) In addition to public records subject to
disclosure under section 20175, the following information is
subject to disclosure from the department of public COMMUNITY
health or the department of social HUMAN services:

8 (a) Ownership of nursing homes, ownership of buildings
9 occupied by nursing homes, and the names and addresses of suppliers
10 and the ownership of suppliers of goods and services to nursing
11 homes required to be reported under section 20142.

(b) Records of license and certification inspections, surveys,
and evaluations of nursing homes, other reports of inspections,
surveys, and evaluations of patient care, and reports concerning a
nursing home prepared pursuant to titles 18 XVIII and 19 XIX of the
social security act, 42 U.S.C. USC 1395 to 1396k 1396V.

17 (c) Cost and reimbursement reports submitted by a nursing
18 home, reports of audits of nursing homes, and other public records
19 concerning costs incurred by, revenues received by, and
20 reimbursement of nursing homes.

(d) Complaints filed against a nursing home and complaint investigation reports. A complaint or complaint investigation report shall not be disclosed to a person other than the complainant or complainant's representative before it is disclosed to a nursing home under section 21799a and a complainant's or patient's name shall not be disclosed except as provided in section 21799a.

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(E) PROOF OF LIABILITY INSURANCE COVERAGE AS REQUIRED IN
 SECTION 21714.

3 (2) The department of public COMMUNITY health, the department 4 of social HUMAN services, and the nursing home shall respect the confidentiality of a patient's clinical record as provided in 5 6 section 20175 and shall not divulge or disclose the contents of a record in a manner which THAT identifies a patient, except upon a 7 patient's death to a relative or guardian, or under judicial 8 proceedings. This subsection shall DOES not be construed to limit 9 10 the right of a patient or a patient's representative to inspect or 11 copy the patient's clinical record.

12 (3) Confidential medical, social, personal, or financial
13 information identifying a patient shall not be available for public
14 inspection in a manner which identifies a patient.

Sec. 21755. (1) The department may refuse to issue a license to establish or maintain and operate, or both, a nursing home to an applicant:

18 (a) Whose occupational, professional, or health agency license
19 has been revoked during the 5 years preceding the date of
20 application.

(b) Whom the department finds is not suitable to operate a
nursing home because of financial incapacity or a lack of good
moral character or appropriate business or professional experience.
As used in this subdivision, "good moral character" means that term
as defined in Act No. 381 of the Public Acts of 1974, as amended,
being sections 338.41 to 338.47 of the Michigan Compiled Laws
SECTION 1 OF 1974 PA 381, MCL 338.41.

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(2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REFUSE TO ISSUE A LICENSE TO
 ESTABLISH OR MAINTAIN AND OPERATE, OR BOTH, A NURSING HOME TO AN
 APPLICANT OR LICENSEE WHO DOES NOT MAINTAIN LIABILITY INSURANCE
 COVERAGE AS REQUIRED IN SECTION 21714.

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5 Sec. 21757. (1) The department may issue a 1-year provisional 6 license, renewable for not more than 1 additional year, to an 7 applicant whose services are needed in the community but who is 8 temporarily unable to comply with the rules related to the physical 9 plant of the facilities, excluding maintenance problems. At the 10 time a provisional license is granted, specific deadlines for the 11 correction of each physical plant violation shall be established.

12 (2) A THE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOT ISSUE A provisional license
 13 shall not be issued for IN ANY OF THE FOLLOWING CIRCUMSTANCES:

(A) FOR a nursing home constructed, established, or changing
corporate ownership or management after the effective date of this
section MARCH 30, 1979 unless it is shown that unusual hardship
would result to the public or to the applicant for the provisional
license and the nursing home was licensed and operating under a
prior licensing act for not less than 5 years.

20 (B) FOR A NURSING HOME THAT DOES NOT HAVE LIABILITY INSURANCE
21 COVERAGE AS REQUIRED IN SECTION 21714.

Sec. 21782. A licensee shall retain for public inspection:
(a) A complete copy of each inspection report of the nursing
home received from the department during the past 5 years.

(b) A copy of each notice of a hearing or order pertaining to
the nursing home issued by the department or a court under the
authority of this article or rules promulgated under this article

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after the effective date of this section. The copy of the notice or
 order shall be retained for not less than 3 years after its date of
 issuance or not less than 3 years after the date of the resolution
 of the subject matter of the notice or order, whichever is later.

5 (c) A description of the services provided by the nursing home
6 and the rates charged for those services and items for which a
7 patient may be separately charged.

8 (d) A list of the name, address, principal occupation, and
9 official position of each person who, as a stockholder or
10 otherwise, has a proprietary interest in the nursing home as
11 required by section 20142, of each officer and director of a
12 nursing home which is a corporation, and of each trustee or
13 beneficiary of a nursing home which is a trust.

14 (e) A list of licensed personnel employed or retained by the15 nursing home.

16 (f) A copy of the standard form contract utilized under 17 section 21766.

18 (G) A COPY OF THE PROOF OF LIABILITY INSURANCE COVERAGE AS
19 REQUIRED IN SECTION 21714.

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
