## **SENATE BILL No. 99**

January 25, 2007, Introduced by Senator GILBERT and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1972 PA 222, entitled

"An act to provide for an official personal identification card; to provide for its form, issuance and use; to regulate the use and disclosure of information obtained from the card; to prescribe the powers and duties of the secretary of state; to prescribe fees; to prescribe certain penalties for violations; and to provide an appropriation for certain purposes,"

by amending sections 1 and 2 (MCL 28.291 and 28.292), as amended by 2005 PA 143.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. (1) A person who is a resident of this state may apply
- f 2 to the department of state for an official state personal
- **3** identification card. Upon application, the applicant shall supply <del>a</del>
  - BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING:
    - (A) DOCUMENTS SUFFICIENT TO ESTABLISH THAT THE APPLICANT IS A
- 6 CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES OR A RESIDENT ALIEN LAWFULLY ADMITTED

## 1 TO THE UNITED STATES.

- 2 (B) A birth certificate attesting to his or her age or other
- 3 sufficient documents or identification as the secretary of state
- 4 may require. An application for a state personal identification
- 5 card shall be made in a manner prescribed by the secretary of state
- 6 and shall contain the applicant's full name, date of birth,
- 7 residence address, height, sex, eye color, signature, and,
- 8 beginning January 1, 2007, intent to be an organ donor, and other
- 9 information required or permitted on the official state personal
- 10 identification card. The applicant may provide a mailing address if
- 11 the applicant receives mail at an address different from his or her
- 12 residence address.
- 13 (2) The secretary of state shall not issue an official state
- 14 personal identification card to a person who holds an operator's or
- 15 chauffeur's license issued under the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA
- 16 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923, unless the license has been suspended,
- 17 revoked, or restricted.
- 18 Sec. 2. (1) The official state personal identification card
- 19 shall contain the following:
- 20 (a) An identification number permanently assigned to the
- 21 person.
- (b) The full name, date of birth, sex, residential address,
- 23 height, weight, eye color, image, and signature of the person to
- 24 whom the identification card is issued.
- 25 (c) An indication that the identification card contains 1 or
- 26 more of the following:
- 27 (i) The blood type of the person.

- 1 (ii) Immunization data of the person.
- 2 (iii) Medication data of the person.
- (iv) A statement that the person is deaf.
- 4 (v) Until January 1, 2007, a statement that the person is an
- 5 organ and tissue donor under part 101 of the public health code,
- 6 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10109. If the identification card
- 7 contains such a statement, the statement shall include the
- 8 signature of the person, along with the signature of at least 1
- 9 witness.
- 10 (vi) Emergency contact information of the person.
- 11 (vii) A sticker or decal as specified by the secretary of state
- 12 to indicate that the holder of the official state personal
- 13 identification card has designated 1 or more patient advocates in
- 14 accordance with section 5506 of the estates and protected
- 15 individuals code, 1998 PA 386, MCL 700.5506, or a statement that he
- 16 or she carries an emergency medical information card, as described
- in subsection (5).
- 18 (d) In the case of a person who is less than 18 years of age
- 19 at the time of issuance of the identification card, the dates on
- 20 which the person will become 18 years of age and 21 years of age.
- 21 (e) In the case of a person who is not less than 18 years of
- 22 age but less than 21 years of age at the time of issuance of the
- 23 identification card, the date on which the person will become 21
- 24 years of age.
- 25 (f) Beginning January 1, 2007, in the case of a holder of an
- 26 official state personal identification card who has indicated his
- 27 or her wish to participate in the organ and tissue donor registry

- 1 under part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL
- 2 333.10101 to 333.10109, a heart insignia on the front of the
- 3 official state personal identification card.
- 4 (2) In conjunction with the application for or, until January
- 5 1, 2007, the issuance of an official state personal identification
- 6 card, the secretary of state shall do all of the following:
- 7 (a) Provide the applicant with all of the following:
- 8 (i) Information explaining the applicant's right to make an
- 9 anatomical gift in the event of death under part 101 of the public
- 10 health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10109, and in
- 11 accordance with this section.
- 12 (ii) Information describing the organ, tissue, and eye donor
- 13 registry program maintained by Michigan's federally designated
- 14 organ procurement organization or its successor organization. The
- 15 information required under this subparagraph includes the address
- 16 and telephone number of Michigan's federally designated organ
- 17 procurement organization or its successor organization.
- 18 (iii) Information giving the applicant the opportunity to have
- 19 his or her name placed on the registry described in subparagraph
- 20 (ii).
- 21 (b) Provide the applicant with the opportunity to specify on
- 22 his or her official state personal identification card that he or
- 23 she is willing to make an anatomical gift in the event of death
- 24 pursuant to UNDER part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368,
- 25 MCL 333.10101 to 333.10109, and in accordance with this section.
- 26 (c) Inform the applicant that, if he or she indicates to the
- 27 secretary of state under this section a willingness to have his or

- 1 her name placed on the registry described in subdivision (a) (ii),
- 2 the secretary of state will mark the applicant's record for the
- 3 registry.
- 4 (3) The secretary of state may fulfill the requirements of
- 5 subsection (2) by 1 or more of the following methods:
- 6 (a) Providing printed material enclosed with a mailed notice
- 7 for the issuance or renewal of an official state personal
- 8 identification card.
- 9 (b) Providing printed material to an applicant who personally
- 10 appears at a secretary of state branch office.
- 11 (c) Through electronic information transmittals for
- 12 applications processed by electronic means.
- 13 (4) Until January 1, 2007, if an applicant indicates a
- 14 willingness under this section to have his or her name placed on
- 15 the registry described in subsection (2)(a)(ii), the secretary of
- 16 state shall within 10 days forward the applicant's name, address,
- 17 and date of birth to the organ donor registry maintained by
- 18 Michigan's federally designated organ procurement organization or
- 19 its successor organization. The secretary of state may forward
- 20 information under this subsection by mail or by electronic means.
- 21 The secretary of state shall not maintain a record of the name or
- 22 address of an individual who indicates a willingness to have his or
- 23 her name placed on the organ donor registry after forwarding that
- 24 information to the organ donor registry under this subsection.
- 25 Information about an applicant's indication of a willingness to
- 26 have his or her name placed on the organ donor registry obtained by
- 27 the secretary of state under subsection (2) and forwarded under

- 1 this subsection is exempt from disclosure under section 13(1)(d) of
- 2 the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.243.
- 3 (5) The secretary of state shall prescribe the form of the
- 4 identification card. The secretary of state shall designate on the
- 5 identification card a space where the applicant may place a sticker
- 6 or decal of the uniform size as the secretary may specify to
- 7 indicate that the cardholder carries a separate emergency medical
- 8 information card. The sticker or decal may be provided by any
- 9 person, hospital, school, medical group, or association interested
- 10 in assisting in implementing the emergency medical information
- 11 card, but shall meet the specifications of the secretary of state.
- 12 The sticker or decal also may be used to indicate that the
- 13 cardholder has designated 1 or more patient advocates in accordance
- 14 with section 5506 of the estates and protected individuals code,
- 15 1998 PA 386, MCL 700.5506. The emergency medical information card,
- 16 carried separately by the cardholder, may contain the information
- 17 described in subsection (2)(c), information concerning the
- 18 cardholder's patient advocate designation, other emergency medical
- 19 information, or an indication as to where the cardholder has stored
- 20 or registered emergency medical information. An original
- 21 identification card or the renewal of an existing identification
- 22 card issued to a person less than 21 years of age shall be portrait
- 23 or vertical in form and an identification card issued to a person
- 24 21 years of age or over shall be landscape or horizontal in form.
- 25 Except as otherwise required in this act, other information
- 26 required on the identification card under this act may appear on
- 27 the identification card in a form prescribed by the secretary of

- 1 state.
- 2 (6) The identification card shall not contain a fingerprint or
- 3 finger image of the applicant.
- 4 (7) Except as provided in this subsection, the secretary of
- 5 state may retain and use a person's image and signature described
- 6 in subsection (1)(b) only for programs administered by the
- 7 secretary of state. Except as provided in this subsection, the
- 8 secretary of state shall not use a person's image unless written
- 9 permission for that purpose is granted by the person to the
- 10 secretary of state or specific enabling legislation permitting the
- 11 use is enacted into law. A law enforcement agency of this state
- 12 shall have access to any information retained by the secretary of
- 13 state under this subsection. The information may be utilized for
- 14 any law enforcement purpose unless otherwise prohibited by law. The
- 15 department of state police shall provide to the secretary of state
- 16 updated lists of persons required under section 5a of the sex
- 17 offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.725a, to maintain a
- 18 valid operator's or chauffeur's license or an official state
- 19 personal identification card and the secretary of state shall make
- 20 images of those persons available to the department of state police
- 21 as provided in the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL
- 22 28.721 to <del>28.732</del> **28.736**.
- 23 (8) If a person presents evidence of statutory blindness as
- 24 provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368, and is issued or
- 25 is the holder of an official state personal identification card,
- 26 the secretary of state shall mark the person's identification card
- 27 in a manner that clearly indicates that the cardholder is legally

- 1 blind.
- 2 (9) Beginning January 1, 2007, the secretary of state shall
- 3 maintain a record of an individual who indicates a willingness to
- 4 have his or her name placed on the registry described in subsection
- 5 (2)(a)(ii). Information about a person's indication of a willingness
- 6 to have his or her name placed on the registry that is obtained by
- 7 the secretary of state and forwarded under this section is exempt
- 8 from disclosure under section 13(1)(d) of the freedom of
- 9 information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.243. The secretary of state
- 10 shall establish and maintain the organ, tissue, and eye donor
- 11 registry in a manner that provides electronic access, including,
- 12 but not limited to, the transfer of data to this state's federally
- 13 designated organ procurement organizations, their successor
- 14 organizations, and tissue and eye banks with limitations on the use
- 15 of and access to the donor registry as determined by the secretary
- 16 of state.
- 17 (10) An official state personal identification card may
- 18 contain an identifier for voter registration purposes. An official
- 19 state personal identification card may contain information
- 20 appearing in electronic or machine readable codes needed to conduct
- 21 a transaction with the secretary of state. The information shall be
- 22 limited to the person's identification card number, birth date,
- 23 expiration date, and other information necessary for use with
- 24 electronic devices, machine readers, or automatic teller machines
- 25 and shall not contain the person's name, address, driving record,
- 26 or other personal identifier. The identification card shall
- 27 identify the encoded information.

- 1 (11) An official state personal identification card shall be
- 2 issued only upon authorization of the secretary of state, and shall
- 3 be manufactured in a manner to prohibit as nearly as possible the
- 4 ability to reproduce, alter, counterfeit, forge, or duplicate the
- 5 identification card without ready detection.
- 6 (12) Except as otherwise provided in this act, an applicant
- 7 shall pay a fee of \$10.00 to the secretary of state for each
- 8 original or renewal identification card issued.
- 9 The department of treasury shall deposit the fees received and
- 10 collected under this section in the state treasury to the credit of
- 11 the general fund. The legislature shall appropriate the fees
- 12 credited to the general fund under this act to the secretary of
- 13 state for the administration of this act. Appropriations from the
- 14 Michigan transportation fund created under section 10 of 1951 PA
- 15 51, MCL 247.660, shall not be used to compensate the secretary of
- 16 state for costs incurred and services performed under this section.
- 17 (13) An original or renewal official state personal
- 18 identification card expires on the birthday of the person to whom
- 19 it is issued in the fourth year following the date of issuance. AN
- 20 ORIGINAL OR RENEWAL OFFICIAL STATE PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION CARD
- 21 ISSUED TO A PERSON WHO IS NOT A UNITED STATES CITIZEN EXPIRES ON
- 22 THE DATE HIS OR HER PRESENCE IN THE UNITED STATES BECOMES UNLAWFUL.
- 23 The secretary of state shall not issue an official state personal
- 24 identification card under this act for a period greater than 4
- 25 years. Except as provided in this subsection, a person may apply
- 26 for a renewal of an official state personal identification card by
- 27 mail or by other methods prescribed by the secretary of state. The

- 1 secretary of state shall require renewal in person by a person
- 2 required under section 5a of the sex offenders registration act,
- 3 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.725a, to maintain a valid operator's or
- 4 chauffeur's license or official state personal identification card.
- 5 (14) The secretary of state shall waive the fee under this
- 6 section if the applicant is any of the following:
- 7 (a) A person 65 years of age or older.
- 8 (b) A person who has had his or her operator's or chauffeur's
- 9 license suspended, revoked, or denied under the Michigan vehicle
- 10 code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923, because of a mental or
- 11 physical infirmity or disability.
- 12 (c) A person who presents evidence of statutory blindness as
- 13 provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368.
- 14 (d) A person who presents other good cause for a fee waiver.
- 15 (e) Beginning January 1, 2007, a person who wishes to add or
- 16 remove a heart insignia described in subsection (1)(f).
- 17 (15) A person who has been issued an official state personal
- 18 identification card shall apply for a renewal official state
- 19 personal identification card if the person changes his or her name.
- 20 (16) A person who has been issued an official state personal
- 21 identification card shall apply for a corrected identification card
- 22 if he or she changes his or her residential address. The secretary
- 23 of state may correct the address on an identification card by a
- 24 method prescribed by the secretary of state. A fee shall not be
- 25 charged for a change of residential address.
- 26 (17) Except as otherwise provided in subsections (15) and
- 27 (16), a person who has been issued an official state personal

- 1 identification card may apply for a renewal official state personal
- 2 identification card for 1 or more of the following reasons:
- 3 (a) The person wants to change any information on the
- 4 identification card.
- 5 (b) An identification card issued under this act is lost,
- 6 destroyed, or mutilated, or becomes illegible.
- 7 (18) A person may indicate on an official state personal
- 8 identification card in a place designated by the secretary of state
- 9 his or her blood type, emergency contact information, immunization
- 10 data, medication data, a statement that the person is deaf, or,
- 11 until January 1, 2007, a statement that the person has made an
- 12 anatomical gift under part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA
- 13 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10109.
- 14 (19) If an applicant provides proof to the secretary of state
- 15 that he or she is a minor who has been emancipated under 1968 PA
- 16 293, MCL 722.1 to 722.6, the official state personal identification
- 17 card shall bear the designation of the individual's emancipated
- 18 status in a manner prescribed by the secretary of state.
- 19 (20) Beginning January 1, 2007, the secretary of state shall
- 20 inquire of each person who applies for or who holds an official
- 21 state personal identification card, in person or by mail, whether
- 22 he or she agrees to participate in the organ, tissue, and eye donor
- 23 registry under part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL
- 24 333.10101 to 333.10109. A person who has agreed to participate in
- 25 that registry shall not be considered to have revoked that
- 26 agreement solely because the person's official state personal
- 27 identification card has expired. Enrollment in the organ, tissue,

- 1 and eye donor registry constitutes a legal agreement that remains
- 2 binding and in effect after the donor's death regardless of the
- 3 expressed desires of the deceased donor's next of kin who may
- 4 oppose the donor's organ, tissue, or eye donation.
- 5 (21) A valid official state personal identification card
- 6 presented by the person to whom the card is issued shall be
- 7 considered the same as a valid state of Michigan driver license
- 8 when identification is requested except as otherwise specifically
- 9 provided by law.

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
