A bill to amend 1984 PA 431, entitled "The management and budget act,"

(MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594) by adding section 264a.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 SEC. 264A. (1) THE DEPARTMENT OR A STATE AGENCY SHALL NOT
- 2 AWARD A PROCUREMENT CONTRACT TO A VENDOR UNLESS THE VENDOR HAS
- 3 SUBMITTED A VERIFIED STATEMENT AFFIRMING ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
  - (A) WITHIN THE PAST 5 YEARS THE VENDOR OR AN OFFICER OF THE
- 5 VENDOR HAS NOT BEEN CONVICTED OF, OR BEEN HELD RESPONSIBLE IN AN
- 6 ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING OR OTHER CIVIL PROCEEDING FOR, VIOLATING A
- 7 STATE OR FEDERAL LAW RESPECTING THE EMPLOYMENT OF PERSONS NOT
- 8 AUTHORIZED TO WORK IN THE UNITED STATES.
  - (B) IN PERFORMING THE CONTRACT, THE VENDOR WILL NOT DIRECTLY

- 1 OR INDIRECTLY EMPLOY A PERSON WHO IS UNAUTHORIZED TO WORK IN THE

- 3 (C) THE VENDOR WILL TAKE REASONABLE STEPS TO ASCERTAIN THAT
- 4 EACH PERSON EMPLOYED TO PERFORM SERVICES DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY
- 5 UNDER THE STATE CONTRACT IS AUTHORIZED TO WORK IN THE UNITED

- 7 (D) IF THE VENDOR LEARNS THAT A PERSON WHO IS NOT AUTHORIZED

- 12 (2) AFTER NOTICE AND A HEARING, IF THE DEPARTMENT DETERMINES

- 14 INFORMATION OR KNOWINGLY VIOLATED THE AFFIRMATIONS REQUIRED UNDER
- 15 SUBSECTION (1), THE STATE MAY DO 1 OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 16 (A) CANCEL THE CONTRACT.
- 17 (B) REQUIRE FORFEITURE TO THE STATE OF UP TO 20% OF THE
- 18 PAYMENT DUE UNDER THE CONTRACT.
- 19 (C) DEBAR THE VENDOR OR SUBCONTRACTOR FROM BIDDING ON, OR THE
- 20 AWARD OF, STATE CONTRACTS FOR A PERIOD OF NOT MORE THAN 5 YEARS.
