Senate Bill 39 (as introduced 1-27-09) Sponsor: Senator Raymond E. Basham Committee: Judiciary

<u>CONTENT</u>

The bill would amend the governmental immunity law to extend immunity to a peace officer who assisted an individual outside the geographical boundaries of the local unit where the officer was employed.

Under the law, except as it otherwise provides, and without regard to the discretionary or ministerial nature of the conduct in question, each officer and employee of a governmental agency is immune from tort liability for an injury to a person or damage to property caused by the officer or employee while in the course of employment or service. That immunity applies if all of the following are met:

- -- The officer or employee is acting or reasonably believes he or she is acting within the scope of his or her authority.
- -- The governmental agency is engaged in the exercise or discharge of a governmental function.
- -- The officer's or employee's conduct does not amount to gross negligence that is the proximate cause of the injury or damage.

Under the bill, "course of employment or service", if the officer or employee were a peace officer, would include coming to the aid of an individual who was threatened with injury or death while the officer was outside the geographical boundaries of the county, city, village, township, or university that employed the officer.
