## **HOUSE BILL No. 5278**

August 26, 2009, Introduced by Reps. Espinoza, Terry Brown and Liss and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

A bill to amend 1981 PA 93, entitled

"Michigan right to farm act,"

by amending section 2 (MCL 286.472), as amended by 1995 PA 94.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 2. As used in this act:

(A) "AGRICULTURAL TOURISM" MEANS THE PRACTICE OF VISITING AN
AGRIBUSINESS, HORTICULTURAL, OR AGRICULTURAL OPERATION, INCLUDING,
BUT NOT LIMITED TO, A FARM, ORCHARD, OR WINERY OR A COMPANION
ANIMAL OR LIVESTOCK SHOW, FOR THE PURPOSE OF RECREATION, EDUCATION,
OR ACTIVE INVOLVEMENT IN THE OPERATION, OTHER THAN AS A CONTRACTOR
OR EMPLOYEE OF THE OPERATION.

**(B)** <del>(a)</del> "Farm" means the land, plants, animals, buildings, structures, including ponds used for agricultural or aquacultural

activities, machinery, equipment, and other appurtenances used in
 the commercial production of farm products.

3 (C) (b)—"Farm operation" means the operation and management of 4 a farm or a condition or activity that occurs at any time as 5 necessary on a farm in connection with the commercial production, 6 harvesting, and storage of farm products, and includes, but is not 7 limited to:

(i) Marketing produce at roadside stands or farm markets.

9 (ii) The generation of noise, odors, dust, fumes, and other10 associated conditions.

11 (iii) The operation of machinery and equipment necessary for a 12 farm including, but not limited to, irrigation and drainage systems and pumps and on-farm grain dryers, and the movement of vehicles, 13 14 machinery, equipment, and farm products and associated inputs 15 necessary for farm operations on the roadway as authorized by the Michigan vehicle code, Act No. 300 of the Public Acts of 1949, 16 being sections 257.1 to 257.923 of the Michigan Compiled Laws 1949 17 PA 300, MCL 257.1 TO 257.923. 18

19 (*iv*) Field preparation and ground and aerial seeding and20 spraying.

(v) The application of chemical fertilizers or organic
materials, conditioners, liming materials, or pesticides.

(vi) Use of alternative pest management techniques.

24 (vii) The fencing, feeding, watering, sheltering,
25 transportation, treatment, use, handling and care of farm animals.

26 (viii) The management, storage, transport, utilization, and
27 application of farm by-products, including manure or agricultural

2 (*ix*) The conversion from a farm operation activity to other
3 farm operation activities.

(x) The employment and use of labor.

(xi) AGRICULTURAL TOURISM.

6 (D) (c) "Farm product" means those plants and animals useful to human beings produced by agriculture and includes, but is not 7 limited to, forages and sod crops, grains and feed crops, field 8 crops, dairy and dairy products, poultry and poultry products, 9 cervidae, livestock, including breeding and grazing, equine, fish, 10 11 and other aquacultural products, bees and bee products, berries, 12 herbs, fruits, vegetables, flowers, seeds, grasses, nursery stock, trees and tree products, mushrooms, and other similar products, or 13 14 any other product which incorporates the use of food, feed, fiber, 15 or fur, as determined by the Michigan commission of agriculture.

(E) (d) "Generally accepted agricultural and management 16 17 practices" means those practices as defined by the Michigan commission of agriculture. The commission shall give due 18 19 consideration to available Michigan department of agriculture 20 information and written recommendations from the Michigan state 21 university college of agriculture and natural resources extension 22 and the agricultural experiment station in cooperation with the 23 United States department of agriculture natural resources 24 conservation service and the consolidated farm service agency, the 25 Michigan department of natural resources, and other professional 26 and industry organizations.

(F) (e) "Person" means an individual, corporation,
