THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 33. As used in this article:
- - (A) (b)—"Loiter" means to remain for a period of time and under circumstances that a reasonable person would determine is for the primary purpose of observing or contacting minors.
 - (B) (c) "Minor" means an individual less than 18 years of age.
 - (C) (d)—"School" means a public, private, denominational, or
