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## **HOUSE BILL No. 5547**

October 27, 2009, Introduced by Reps. Liss, Roy Schmidt, Ball and Byrum and referred to the Committee on Ethics and Elections.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending sections 17703, 17704, 17706, and 17707 (MCL 333.17703, 333.17704, 333.17706, and 333.17707), section 17703 as amended by 2006 PA 672, section 17706 as amended by 1986 PA 304, and section 17707 as amended by 1990 PA 333, and by adding section 17746a.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 17703. (1) "Device" means an instrument, apparatus, or contrivance, including its components, parts, and accessories, intended for use in the diagnosis, cure, mitigation, treatment, or prevention of disease in human beings or other animals, or to affect the structure or function of the body of human beings or

- 1 other animals.
- 2 (2) "Dispense" means to issue 1 or more doses of a drug for
- 3 subsequent administration to, or use by, a patient.
- 4 (3) "Dispensing prescriber" means a prescriber, other than a
- 5 veterinarian, who dispenses prescription drugs.
- 6 (4) "Drug" means any of the following:
- 7 (a) A substance recognized or for which the standards or
- 8 specifications are prescribed in the official compendium.
- 9 (b) A substance intended for use in the diagnosis, cure,
- 10 mitigation, treatment, or prevention of disease in human beings or
- 11 other animals.
- 12 (c) A substance, other than food, intended to affect the
- 13 structure or a function of the body of human beings or other
- 14 animals.
- 15 (d) A substance intended for use as a component of a substance
- 16 specified in subdivision (a), (b), or (c), but not including a
- 17 device or its components, parts, or accessories.
- 18 (5) "Electronic signature" means an electronic sound, symbol,
- 19 or process attached to or logically associated with a record and
- 20 executed or adopted by a person with the intent to sign the record.
- 21 (6) "Electronically transmitted prescription" means the
- 22 communication of an original prescription or refill authorization
- 23 by electronic means including computer to computer, computer to
- 24 facsimile machine, or electronic mail transmission that contains
- 25 the same information it contained when the prescriber or authorized
- 26 agent transmitted the prescription. Electronically transmitted
- 27 prescription does not include a prescription or refill

- 1 authorization transmitted by telephone or facsimile machine.
- 2 (7) "EMERGENCY DRUGS" ARE THOSE DRUGS THAT ARE REQUIRED TO
- 3 MEET THE IMMEDIATE THERAPEUTIC NEED OF A RESIDENT OF A MEDICAL
- 4 INSTITUTION AND THAT ARE TO BE ADMINISTERED BY AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL
- 5 TO THE RESIDENT BEFORE THE INTERPRETATION AND REVIEW BY A
- 6 PHARMACIST WHEN WAITING FOR INTERPRETATION AND REVIEW WOULD CAUSE A
- 7 MEDICALLY UNACCEPTABLE DELAY.
- 8 Sec. 17704. (1) "Federal act" means the federal food, drug,
- 9 and cosmetic act, of 1938, 21 U.S.C. USC 301 to 392 399A.
- 10 (2) "Generic name" means the established or official name of a
- 11 drug or drug product.
- 12 (3) "Harmful drug" means a drug intended for use by human
- 13 beings which THAT is harmful because of its toxicity, habit-forming
- 14 nature, or other potential adverse effect, the method of its use,
- 15 or the collateral measures necessary to its safe and effective use,
- 16 and which THAT is designated as harmful by the board according to
- **17** rule.
- 18 (4) "INSTITUTIONAL PHARMACY" MEANS A PHARMACY LICENSED UNDER
- 19 THIS PART THAT IS LOCATED IN THIS STATE; THAT DISPENSES, COMPOUNDS,
- 20 AND DISTRIBUTES DRUGS, DEVICES, AND OTHER MATERIALS; AND THAT
- 21 ENGAGES IN THE PRACTICE OF PHARMACY FOR A MEDICAL INSTITUTION.
- 22 (5) (4) "Internship" means an educational program of
- 23 professional and practical experience for an intern.
- 24 Sec. 17706. (1) "Manufacturer" means a person who prepares,
- 25 produces, derives, propagates, compounds, processes, packages, or
- 26 repackages a drug or device salable on prescription only, or
- 27 otherwise changes the container or the labeling of a drug or device

- 1 salable on prescription only, and who supplies, distributes, sells,
- 2 offers for sale, barters, or otherwise disposes of that drug or
- 3 device and any other drug or device salable on prescription only,
- 4 to another person for resale, compounding, or dispensing.
- 5 (2) "MEDICAL INSTITUTION" MEANS A FEDERALLY- OR STATE-LICENSED
- 6 ORGANIZATION OR FACILITY THE PRIMARY PURPOSE OF WHICH IS TO PROVIDE
- 7 A PHYSICAL ENVIRONMENT AT WHICH ON-SITE MEDICAL CARE IS PROVIDED TO
- 8 INDIVIDUALS AND A PERMANENT MEDICAL RECORD DOCUMENTING THE
- 9 PROVISION OF MEDICAL CARE, INCLUDING MEDICATIONS ORDERED AND
- 10 ADMINISTERED, TO THAT INDIVIDUAL IS MAINTAINED. MEDICAL INSTITUTION
- 11 INCLUDES, BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO, A HOSPITAL, CONVALESCENT HOME,
- 12 HOME FOR THE AGED, NURSING HOME, SKILLED NURSING FACILITY, COUNTY
- 13 MEDICAL CARE FACILITY, EXTENDED CARE FACILITY, ADULT FOSTER CARE
- 14 FACILITY, ASSISTED LIVING FACILITY, MENTAL HEALTH FACILITY,
- 15 PSYCHIATRIC CENTER, DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY CENTER, AND ANY OTHER
- 16 HEALTH FACILITY OR AGENCY THAT IS LICENSED UNDER ARTICLE 17 AND
- 17 THAT DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY PROVIDES OR INCLUDES PHARMACY SERVICES
- 18 TO RESIDENTS.
- 19 (3) "MEDICATION DRUG KITS" ARE THOSE DRUGS THAT MAY BE
- 20 REOUIRED TO MEET THE THERAPEUTIC NEEDS OF A RESIDENT OF A MEDICAL
- 21 INSTITUTION WHEN A PHARMACIST IS NOT IN PERSONAL CHARGE OF THE
- 22 INSTITUTIONAL PHARMACY.
- 23 (4) "MEDICATION ORDER" MEANS A LAWFUL ORDER ENTERED ON THE
- 24 PERMANENT MEDICAL RECORD OF A RESIDENT OF A MEDICAL INSTITUTION BY
- 25 A PRESCRIBER AND IS CONSIDERED A PRESCRIPTION DRUG ORDER. IF
- 26 WRITTEN, THE MEDICATION ORDER SHALL INCLUDE THE SIGNATURE OF THE
- 27 PRESCRIBER OR PERSONNEL AUTHORIZED BY THE MEDICAL INSTITUTION OR,

- 1 IF ELECTRONICALLY TRANSMITTED, THE APPROPRIATE ELECTRONIC
- 2 SIGNATURE.
- 3 (5) (2) "Official compendium" means the United States
- 4 pharmacopoeia and national formulary, homeopathic pharmacopoeia of
- 5 the United States, or a supplement thereof existing on July 1,
- **6** 1983.
- 7 Sec. 17707. (1) "Personal charge" means the immediate physical
- 8 presence of a pharmacist or dispensing prescriber.
- 9 (2) "Pharmacist" means an individual licensed under this
- 10 article to engage in the practice of pharmacy.
- 11 (3) "Pharmacist intern" or "intern" means an individual who
- 12 satisfactorily completes the requirements set forth in rules
- 13 promulgated by the board and is licensed by the board for the
- 14 purpose of obtaining instruction in the practice of pharmacy from a
- 15 preceptor approved by the board.
- 16 (4) "Pharmacy" means a building or part of a building in which
- 17 the practice of pharmacy is conducted.
- 18 (5) "Practice of pharmacy" means a health service, the
- 19 clinical application of which includes the encouragement of safety
- 20 and efficacy in the prescribing, dispensing, administering, and use
- 21 of drugs and related articles for the prevention of illness, and
- 22 the maintenance and management of health. PRACTICE OF PHARMACY
- 23 INCLUDES THE DIRECT OR INDIRECT PROVISION OF PATIENT CARE SERVICES
- 24 ASSOCIATED WITH THE PRACTICE OF PHARMACY TO MEDICAL INSTITUTIONS.
- 25 Professional functions associated with the practice of pharmacy
- 26 include:
- 27 (a) The interpretation and evaluation of the prescription.

- 1 (b) Drug product selection.
- 2 (c) The compounding, dispensing, safe storage, and
- 3 distribution of drugs and devices.
- 4 (d) The maintenance of legally required records.
- 5 (e) Advising the prescriber and the patient as required as to
- 6 contents, therapeutic action, utilization, and possible adverse
- 7 reactions or interactions of drugs.
- 8 SEC. 17746A. (1) A PHARMACIST IN CHARGE OF AN INSTITUTIONAL
- 9 PHARMACY SHALL MAKE ARRANGEMENT IN ADVANCE FOR THE PERIOD OF TIME
- 10 DURING WHICH A PHARMACIST IS NOT IN PERSONAL CHARGE OF THE
- 11 INSTITUTIONAL PHARMACY. A PHARMACIST SHALL BE ON CALL AND AVAILABLE
- 12 TO THE MEDICAL STAFF AND OTHER AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL OF THE MEDICAL
- 13 INSTITUTION FOR THE PERIOD OF TIME DURING WHICH A PHARMACIST IS NOT
- 14 IN PERSONAL CHARGE OF THE INSTITUTIONAL PHARMACY. A PHARMACIST IN
- 15 CHARGE SHALL INCLUDE IN THE ARRANGEMENT UNDER THIS SUBSECTION A
- 16 METHOD TO PROVIDE DRUGS TO THE MEDICAL STAFF AND OTHER AUTHORIZED
- 17 PERSONNEL OF A MEDICAL INSTITUTION BY USE OF EMERGENCY DRUGS OR
- 18 MEDICATION DRUG KITS, OR BOTH. A PHARMACIST IN CHARGE MAY INCLUDE
- 19 IN EMERGENCY DRUGS OR MEDICATION DRUG KITS THOSE DRUGS THAT MAY BE
- 20 REOUIRED TO MEET THE IMMEDIATE THERAPEUTIC NEEDS OF A RESIDENT OF
- 21 THE MEDICAL INSTITUTION AND THAT ARE NOT AVAILABLE FROM ANY OTHER
- 22 AUTHORIZED SOURCE IN SUFFICIENT TIME TO PREVENT RISK OF HARM TO THE
- 23 RESIDENT BECAUSE OF DELAY RESULTING FROM OBTAINING THE DRUGS FROM
- 24 OTHER SOURCES.
- 25 (2) WHEN A PHARMACIST IS NOT IN PERSONAL CHARGE OF THE
- 26 INSTITUTIONAL PHARMACY, EMERGENCY DRUGS AND MEDICATION DRUG KITS
- 27 SHALL BE STORED IN SECURED AREAS OF THE MEDICAL INSTITUTION TO

- 1 PREVENT UNAUTHORIZED ACCESS AND IN AREAS DESIGNED TO ENSURE A
- 2 PROPER ENVIRONMENT FOR PRESERVATION OF THE DRUGS. THE PHARMACIST IN
- 3 CHARGE, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE APPROPRIATE COMMITTEE OF THE
- 4 MEDICAL INSTITUTION, SHALL DO ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 5 (A) DEVELOP INVENTORY LISTINGS OF THE DRUGS CONTAINED IN THE
- 6 EMERGENCY DRUGS AND MEDICATION DRUG KITS, INCLUDING NAME, STRENGTH,
- 7 QUANTITY, AND EXPIRATION DATE OF THE CONTENTS.
- 8 (B) DETERMINE WHO IS AUTHORIZED ACCESS TO THE EMERGENCY DRUGS
- 9 AND MEDICATION DRUGS KITS AND UNDER WHAT CIRCUMSTANCES.
- 10 (C) ENSURE THAT ALL OF THE EMERGENCY DRUGS AND MEDICATION
- 11 DRUGS KITS ARE PROPERLY LABELED.
- 12 (D) ENSURE THAT ONLY A LIMITED NUMBER OF DRUGS IN UNIT DOSE OR
- 13 UNIT-OF-USE PACKAGING ARE AVAILABLE IN AMOUNTS SUFFICIENT FOR
- 14 IMMEDIATE THERAPEUTIC REQUIREMENTS OF RESIDENTS.
- 15 (E) TO PREVENT DIVERSION OF THE EMERGENCY DRUGS AND MEDICATION
- 16 DRUG KITS, INSTITUTE CONTROLS AND RECORD-KEEPING PROCEDURES TO
- 17 ADEQUATELY ACCOUNT FOR THE DRUGS AND TO ENSURE THAT ALL OF THE
- 18 FOLLOWING OCCUR:
- 19 (i) THAT EMERGENCY DRUGS AND MEDICATION DRUG KITS ARE REMOVED
- 20 FROM THE SECURE AREA ONLY PURSUANT TO A VALID MEDICATION ORDER.
- 21 (ii) THAT ONLY AUTHORIZED INDIVIDUALS ARE ABLE TO ACCESS THE
- 22 EMERGENCY DRUGS AND MEDICATION DRUG KITS AND THAT DOCUMENTATION OF
- 23 THAT ACCESS IS MAINTAINED.
- 24 (iii) THAT DOCUMENTATION OF PROOF-OF-USE BY RESIDENTS OR RETURN
- 25 OF THE UNUSED EMERGENCY DRUGS AND MEDICATION DRUG KITS TO THE
- 26 SECURE AREA IS PROVIDED.
- 27 (iv) THAT ANY OTHER RECORD-KEEPING REQUIREMENT DETERMINED

- 1 NECESSARY UNDER THIS SECTION IS MET.
- 2 (F) PROVIDE PROCEDURES FOR THE INSPECTION OF THE INVENTORY OF
- 3 THE EMERGENCY DRUGS AND MEDICATION DRUG KITS TO ASSURE PROPER
- 4 UTILIZATION AND REPLACEMENT OF THE DRUG SUPPLY.
- 5 (G) UPON NOTIFICATION THAT AN EMERGENCY DRUG OR MEDICATION
- 6 DRUG KIT IS USED, RESTOCK EMERGENCY DRUGS AND MEDICATION DRUG KITS
- 7 WITHIN A REASONABLE TIME SO AS TO PREVENT RISK OF HARM TO
- 8 RESIDENTS.
- 9 (H) ESTABLISH ANY OTHER WRITTEN POLICIES AND PROCEDURES
- 10 NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.
