HOUSE BILL No. 5898

February 25, 2010, Introduced by Reps. Rogers, Denby, Calley, Pavlov, Haines and Crawford and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 361, entitled
"Michigan exposition and fairgrounds authority act,"
by amending the title and sections 1, 2, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 12, 14a,
15a, and 15b (MCL 285.161, 285.162, 285.165, 285.166, 285.167,
285.168, 285.171, 285.172, 285.174a, 285.175a, and 285.175b), the
title and sections 1, 2, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 12, 14a, and 15a as
amended and section 15b as added by 2004 PA 468; and to repeal acts
and parts of acts.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 TITLE

An act to AUTHORIZE THE HOLDING OF A MICHIGAN STATE FAIR; TO provide for the control and management of certain state exposition centers and fairgrounds; to create a state exposition center and

- 1 fairgrounds authority and board within the department of management
- 2 and budget; to prescribe the authority's and board's powers and
- 3 duties OF CERTAIN STATE AGENCIES AND OFFICIALS; to provide for the
- 4 appointment of a state exposition center and fairgrounds manager
- 5 and to prescribe the manager's powers and duties; to designate the
- 6 method of financing state exposition centers and fairgrounds; to
- 7 create certain funds; to provide for appropriations; and to repeal
- 8 acts and parts of acts.
- 9 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 10 "Michigan exposition and fairgrounds authority STATE FAIR act".
- 11 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 12 (a) "Authority" means the state exposition and fairgrounds
- 13 authority created in section 9.
- 14 (b) "Authority board" means the board for the authority
- 15 appointed under section 9.
- 16 (A) (c) "Department" means the department of management and
- 17 budget.
- 18 (B) (d)—"Director" means the director of the department.
- 19 (C) (e)—"Fund" means the state exposition and fairgrounds fund
- 20 created in section 14a.
- 21 (D) "PERSON" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL, PARTNERSHIP, CORPORATION,
- 22 ASSOCIATION, OR OTHER PUBLIC OR PRIVATE ENTITY.
- 23 (f) "Manager" means the manager of the authority appointed
- 24 under section 4.
- 25 (g) "Type I transfer" means that term as defined in section 3
- 26 of the executive organization act of 1965, 1965 PA 380, MCL 16.103.
- 27 Sec. 5. The control of all land and other property held or

- 1 acquired by this state or its people for the purpose of holding and
- 2 conducting agricultural and industrial fairs and exhibitions is
- 3 vested in the authority DEPARTMENT.
- 4 Sec. 6. (1) The authority shall DEPARTMENT MAY do all 1 OR
- 5 MORE of the following:
- 6 (a) Conduct an annual state fair and other exhibits or events
- 7 for the purpose of promoting all phases of the economy of this
- 8 state. This fair and the exhibits or events shall encourage and
- 9 demonstrate agricultural, industrial, commercial, educational,
- 10 entertainment, tourism, technological, cultural, and recreational
- 11 pursuits.
- 12 (B) IF THE DEPARTMENT DOES NOT CONDUCT AN ANNUAL STATE FAIR
- 13 UNDER SUBDIVISION (A), AUTHORIZE, ON AN ANNUAL BASIS, A PERSON TO
- 14 DESIGNATE 1 FAIR TO BE HELD IN THE STATE AS THE "MICHIGAN STATE
- 15 FAIR" IF IT WILL ACCOMPLISH THE PURPOSES DESCRIBED IN SUBDIVISION
- 16 (A).
- 17 (C) (b) Lease the state exposition and fairgrounds, a portion
- 18 of the state exposition and fairgrounds, or a building on the state
- 19 exposition and fairgrounds for purposes considered by the authority
- 20 **DEPARTMENT** to be consistent with the staging of the A state fair
- 21 and other exhibits or events. The authority DEPARTMENT may
- 22 determine and impose rental charges and other fees for the use or
- 23 lease of the buildings and grounds or a portion of the buildings
- 24 and grounds. The authority DEPARTMENT may lease properties to
- 25 private and public organizations for a period not to exceed 30
- 26 years for consideration established by the authority DEPARTMENT.
- 27 The authority DEPARTMENT may grant leases for all or a portion of

- 1 the state exposition and fairgrounds to private and public
- 2 organizations, conditional upon construction and improvements
- 3 according to plans approved by the authority DEPARTMENT to be
- 4 financed by the lessees, for terms not to exceed 30 years. The
- 5 authority DEPARTMENT may grant an extension of the lease term for
- 6 not more than an additional 20 years. The use of the state
- 7 exposition and fairgrounds, a portion of the state exposition and
- 8 fairgrounds, or a building on the state exposition and fairgrounds
- 9 shall not interfere with the preparation for or holding of the A
- 10 state fair and other exhibits or events. Land, a building, or other
- 11 property that is leased under this subdivision to a for-profit
- 12 business shall be leased at fair market value. All leases and
- 13 contracts entered into under this act remain valid until the
- 14 expiration of the term of the lease or contract.
- 15 (D) (c)—Enter into contracts, subject to the requirements of
- 16 the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594,
- 17 to conduct the annual A state fair, exhibits, or other events, at
- 18 the state exposition and fairgrounds that enhance agricultural,
- 19 industrial, commercial, recreational, educational, entertainment,
- 20 tourism, technological, or cultural pursuits or government services
- 21 to citizens.
- 22 (2) The authority DEPARTMENT may enter into cooperative
- 23 agreements, contracts, or other agreements with 1 or more
- 24 governmental entities to use the personnel, services, or facilities
- 25 of the governmental entity to assist the authority DEPARTMENT with
- 26 carrying out its duties under this act and as otherwise provided by
- 27 law.

- 1 Sec. 7. (1) The authority DEPARTMENT annually shall present a
- 2 report to the governor AND the legislature, and the department
- 3 describing the receipts or expenditures through appropriation,
- 4 gift, grant, or conveyance that have a material bearing on the
- 5 operation of the A state fair or the state exposition and
- 6 fairgrounds.
- 7 (2) The authority DEPARTMENT shall be subject to annual post
- 8 audits of its financial transactions and accounts and to
- 9 performance post audits by the auditor general.
- 10 (3) The authority DEPARTMENT may promulgate rules governing
- 11 the conduct of the AN annual state fair and state exposition and
- 12 fairgrounds and the development and administration of the state
- 13 exposition and fairgrounds as a commercial, agricultural,
- 14 recreational, and multipurpose facility, pursuant to the
- administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to
- 16 24.328. Any rules in effect on the effective date of the amendatory
- 17 act that added this sentence MARCH 1, 2005 shall remain in effect
- 18 until rescinded by the authority.DEPARTMENT.
- 19 Sec. 8. The manager DEPARTMENT shall do all of the following:
- 20 (a) Be directly responsible to the authority.
- 21 (b) Be the chief administrative officer for the management and
- 22 operation of the state exposition and fairgrounds, and may enter
- 23 into contracts and leases, subject to the requirements of the
- 24 management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594, as
- 25 authorized by rule promulgated under this act.
- 26 (c) Have as a primary work station the site of the state
- 27 exposition and fairgrounds.

- 1 (A) Serve as an appointing authority for any necessary
- 2 personnel associated with the management and operation of MANAGE
- 3 AND OPERATE the state exposition and fairgrounds.
- 4 (B) (e) Be responsible for the financial operation of the
- 5 state exposition and fairgrounds.
- 6 (C) (f) Develop ideas and programs that enhance the operation
- 7 and functioning of the state exposition and fairgrounds.
- 8 (D) (g) Be responsible for the preparation of the PREPARE AN
- 9 annual budget for the state exposition and fairgrounds. for
- 10 presentation to the department.
- 11 (h) Develop and present to the authority board for its
- 12 approval each of the following:
- 14 (ii) A rolling 5-year operations plan submitted annually.
- 15 (iii) A facility and utility renovation plan, updated as
- 16 determined by the manager or as requested by the authority board.
- 17 (iv) A long-range master plan for authority facilities and the
- 18 state exposition and fairgrounds, updated as determined by the
- 19 manager or as requested by the authority board.
- Sec. 11. Except as otherwise provided in this act, the
- 21 authority board DEPARTMENT shall do all things necessary or
- 22 convenient to implement the purposes, objectives, and provisions of
- 23 this act, and the purposes, objectives, and powers delegated to the
- 24 authority by other laws or executive orders, including, but not
- 25 limited to, all of the following:
- 26 (a) Review and approve policies, including dates for the A
- 27 STATE fair and the budget.

- 1 (b) Develop and submit to the department, the legislature, and
- 2 the governor on a yearly basis a rolling 5-year operational plan
- 3 and construction plan, including a master plan for the use of
- 4 buildings and the grounds.
- 5 (c) Report to the director, the legislature, and the governor
- 6 on the operating budget, capital improvements, programs, exhibits,
- 7 and other matters relevant to the state exposition and fairgrounds.
- 8 (d) Approve or authorize the manager to approve utilization of
- 9 the state exposition and fairgrounds, including its use as the site
- 10 for the annual A state fair, and on any other matter which the
- 11 authority may regard as CONSIDERED appropriate.
- 12 (e) Promote, encourage, and assist the manager in conducting
- 13 CONDUCT exhibits or other events at the state exposition and
- 14 fairgrounds that enhance agricultural, industrial, commercial,
- 15 recreational, educational, or cultural pursuits or government
- 16 service to citizens.
- 17 Sec. 12. (1) In staging the annual—A state fair, the authority
- 18 DEPARTMENT may enter into licensing agreements with concessionaires
- 19 permitting games of skill which THAT shall be conducted in
- 20 accordance with the following criteria:
- 21 (a) Winning the game of skill does not require great skill on
- 22 the part of the participant.
- 23 (b) The game does not constitute a fraud upon the
- 24 participants.
- 25 (c) The game is not similar to games of chance in which
- 26 winning depends primarily upon fortuitous or accidental
- 27 circumstances beyond the control of the participant including games

- 1 such as roulette, beano, cards, dice, or wheels of fortune and the
- 2 game does not include a mechanical or physical device that directly
- 3 or indirectly impedes, impairs, or thwarts the skill of the player.
- 4 (d) If the game is a group or contest participation game, each
- 5 participant shall be in attendance at the time the game is played
- 6 and shall actively participate throughout the entire game by
- 7 personally designating his or her target, goal, or desired
- 8 objective. A winner shall be determined by the skill of 1 or more
- 9 of the participants in the group or contest game, and each
- 10 participant shall be randomly selected. The distribution of prizes
- 11 shall be made in the presence of each participant at the time the
- 12 game is played.
- 13 (e) The prize has nominal value and is not redeemable or
- 14 convertible into cash, directly or indirectly.
- 15 (2) The department may promulgate rules pursuant to the
- 16 administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to
- 17 24.328, consistent with the criteria established in subsection (1)
- 18 to regulate the conduct of games of skill during the annual A state
- 19 fair and to protect the public from unauthorized or dishonest
- 20 practices in conducting those games.
- 21 (3) The department may, after an administrative hearing held
- 22 pursuant to the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306,
- 23 MCL 24.201 to 24.328, revoke the licensing agreement of a
- 24 concessionaire if the department determines that the public is
- 25 being defrauded, or that this act or a rule promulgated pursuant to
- 26 this act is being violated.
- 27 (4) The department may promulgate rules pursuant to the

- 1 administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to
- 2 24.328, to permit the operation of a bingo or a millionaire party
- 3 permitted and licensed under the Traxler-McCauley-Law-Bowman bingo
- 4 act, 1972 PA 382, MCL 432.101 to 432.120. The authority DEPARTMENT
- 5 may lease facilities as a location within or at which an
- 6 organization qualified and licensed under that act may conduct
- 7 bingo or a millionaire party.
- 8 Sec. 14a. (1) The state exposition and fairgrounds fund is
- 9 created within the state treasury. The fund shall be administered
- 10 by the authority .
- 11 (2) The state treasurer shall direct the investment of the
- 12 fund. The state treasurer shall credit to the fund interest and
- 13 earnings from fund investments. The state treasurer may receive
- 14 money or other assets from any source for deposit into the fund.
- 15 Money generated from the operation of activities authorized by this
- 16 act shall be deposited into the fund. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL BE THE
- 17 ADMINISTRATOR OF THE FUND FOR AUDITING PURPOSES.
- 18 (3) Money in the fund at the close of the fiscal year shall
- 19 remain in the fund and shall not lapse to the general fund.
- 20 (4) The authority shall submit an annual report to the
- 21 legislature and the department showing the amount of money received
- 22 under this act and how that money was spent.
- 23 (4) (5)—The money in the fund shall be expended pursuant to
- 24 appropriation of the legislature by the authority in the following
- 25 order of priority:
- 26 (a) Providing for an annual A state fair CONDUCTED BY THE
- 27 DEPARTMENT.

- 1 (b) Maintaining the state exposition and fairgrounds.
- 2 (c) Any other purpose authorized under this act.
- 3 Sec. 15a. The authority DEPARTMENT may demolish or permit the
- 4 demolition of any building or structure on the state exposition and
- 5 fairgrounds that is determined by the authority DEPARTMENT to be
- 6 unsuitable for uses consistent with the holding of the state fair.
- 7 Sec. 15b. (1) The authority DEPARTMENT shall develop a
- 8 newsletter to be published not less often than twice per calendar
- 9 year for residents of the surrounding area of the state exposition
- 10 and fairgrounds. The authority DEPARTMENT shall make the newsletter
- 11 available electronically on its website and, if requested, by mail.
- 12 (2) The minutes of the meeting of the authority board shall be
- 13 posted on the authority's website.
- 14 (2) (3)—The authority—DEPARTMENT shall establish a local
- 15 neighborhood advisory council for the purpose of public input on
- 16 the authority's activities. USE OF THE STATE EXPOSITION AND
- 17 FAIRGROUNDS.
- 18 Enacting section 1. Sections 4, 9, 10, and 15 of the Michigan
- 19 exposition and fairgrounds authority act, 1978 PA 361, MCL 285.164,
- 20 285.169, 285.170, and 285.175, are repealed.
