

SENATE BILL No. 1260

April 14, 2010, Introduced by Senators McMANUS and BROWN and referred to the Committee on Campaign and Election Oversight.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law," by amending section 642a (MCL 168.642a), as amended by 2005 PA 71.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 642a. (1) After December 31, 2004, a city council that
2 adopted a resolution so that its regular election is held on the
3 May regular election date may change its regular election to the
4 odd year general election by adopting a resolution in compliance
5 with section 642. If a city council adopts the resolution in
6 compliance with section 642 to hold its regular election at the odd
7 year general election, after December 31 of the year in which the
8 resolution is adopted, the city's regular election is at the odd
9 year general election.

1 (2) After December 31, 2004, a city council that holds its
2 regular election for city offices annually or in the even year on
3 the November regular election date may change its regular election
4 schedule to the odd year general election and the odd year primary
5 election by adopting a resolution in compliance with section 642.
6 If a city council adopts the resolution in compliance with section
7 642, the city's regular election is at the odd year general
8 election and its primary is at the odd year primary election.

9 ~~(3) After December 31, 2004, a city council that adopted a~~
10 ~~resolution so that its regular election primary is held at the~~
11 ~~September primary election may change its regular election primary~~
12 ~~to the odd year primary election by adopting a resolution in~~
13 ~~compliance with section 642. If a city council adopts the~~
14 ~~resolution in compliance with section 642 to hold its regular~~
15 ~~election primary on the odd year primary election date, after~~
16 ~~December 31 of the year in which the resolution is adopted, the~~
17 ~~city's regular election primary is on the odd year primary election~~
18 ~~date.~~

19 (3) AFTER DECEMBER 31, 2010, A CITY THAT ADOPTED A RESOLUTION
20 SO THAT ITS REGULAR ELECTION PRIMARY IS HELD AT THE SEPTEMBER
21 ELECTION SHALL HOLD ITS REGULAR ELECTION PRIMARY AT THE ODD YEAR
22 PRIMARY ELECTION.

23 (4) After December 31, 2004, a school district's school board
24 that adopted a resolution so that its regular election is held on a
25 date other than at the odd year general election may change its
26 regular election to the odd year general election, the general
27 November election, the November regular election date in both even

1 and odd years, or the odd year May regular election date by
2 adopting a resolution in compliance with section 642. If a school
3 board adopts the resolution in compliance with section 642 to hold
4 its regular election at the odd year general election, the general
5 November election, the November regular election date in both even
6 and odd years, or the odd year May regular election date, after
7 December 31 of the year in which the resolution is adopted, the
8 school board's school district shall hold its regular election on
9 the election date adopted in the resolution.

10 (5) After December 31, 2004, a village council that adopted a
11 resolution so that its regular election is held on the September
12 ~~primary~~-election date may change its regular election to the
13 November regular election date by adopting a resolution in
14 compliance with section 642. If a village council adopts the
15 resolution in compliance with section 642 to hold its regular
16 election at the November regular election date, after December 31
17 of the year in which the resolution is adopted, the village's
18 regular election is at the November regular election date.
