A SUMMARY OF SENATE BILL 273 AS PASSED BY THE SENATE 5-5-11

The bill would amend Public Act 27 of 1984, which provides civil immunity to members of the Legislature for acts done pursuant to their duty as legislators, to revise a provision pertaining to a contested case under the Administrative Procedures Act (APA).

Under the act, a legislator may not be made a party in a contested case under <u>Section 3(3)</u> of the APA, or any other administrative proceeding, for any act <u>done</u> "<u>pursuant to</u>" his or her duty as a legislator. Under Senate Bill 273, a member of the Legislature could not be made a party to a contested case under <u>Section 3</u>, or any other administrative proceeding for any act <u>committed</u> by the legislator "<u>while performing</u>" his or her duty as a legislator. The underlined language reflects the changes made by the bill.
