CONTENT

The bill would amend the Michigan Vehicle Code to do the following:

- Remove the eight-plate limit on State-sponsored fund-raising license plates.
- Require the Secretary of State to develop and issue a fund-raising plate recognizing the Michigan Humane Society.
- Create the "Michigan Humane Society Fund" and require donations for those plates to be deposited into the Fund.
- Require money in the Fund to be disbursed to the Michigan Humane Society for pet sterilization.
- Require the Michigan Humane Society to submit to the State Treasurer a summary of the previous year's expenditures of the money received under the bill, beginning not later than February 1, 2013.

FISCAL IMPACT

The bill would create a start-up cost to the Department of State. The start-up fee of \$15,000 prescribed in the Code could be paid to the Department of State from the Michigan Humane Society Fund proposed in the bill; however, the bill does not include such a requirement. The revenue generated from the fund-raising license plate established under the bill would be deposited into the proposed Fund, after which the State Treasurer would disburse payments from the Fund on a quarterly basis to the Michigan Humane Society.

The bill would have no fiscal impact on local government.
