



Senate Bill 582 (as introduced 8-24-11)

CONTENT

The bill would amend the Michigan Vehicle Code to allow a truck tractor and lowboy trailer combination of any length to operate on a designated highway, subject to certain conditions.

The Code prescribes maximum lengths for different types of vehicles operating on designated highways. ("Designated highway" means a highway approved by the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) or a local authority with respect to a highway under its jurisdiction.)

The bill provides that, for a truck tractor and lowboy trailer combination on a designated highway, there would be no maximum length, if the lowboy trailer did not exceed 59 feet, except as otherwise permitted. A lowboy trailer wheelbase could not exceed 55 feet as measured from the kingpin coupling to the center of the rear axle or the rear axle assembly. A lowboy trailer longer than 59 feet could not operate with more than four axles unless an oversized load permit were issued by MDOT or a local authority with respect to highways under its jurisdiction.
