CONTENT

The bill would amend the Worker's Disability Compensation Act to specify that an employer would not have to reimburse, or cause to be reimbursed, charges for medical marihuana treatment, regardless of the requirements in Section 315.

Under that section, an employer must furnish, or cause to be furnished, reasonable medical, surgical, or hospital services and medicine, or other attendance or treatment that is legal under State law, to an employee who receives a personal injury arising out of and in the course of employment.
