## **HOUSE BILL No. 4800**

June 22, 2011, Introduced by Reps. Walsh, LeBlanc, Constan, Tlaib, Bledsoe, Nathan, Poleski, Womack, Olumba and Meadows and referred to the Committee on Redistricting and Elections.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code,"

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by amending section 705 (MCL 380.705), as amended by 2003 PA 299.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 705. (1) Beginning in 1997, and in each year after 1997, a regional enhancement property tax may be levied by an intermediate school district at a rate not to exceed 3 mills to enhance other state and local funding for local school district operations if approved by a majority of the intermediate school electors voting on the question.
  - (2) If a resolution requesting that the question of a regional enhancement property tax be submitted to the **voters**-INTERMEDIATE

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- 1 SCHOOL ELECTORS is adopted within a 180-day period and transmitted
- 2 to the intermediate school board by 1 or more boards of its
- 3 constituent school districts representing a majority of the
- 4 combined membership of the constituent school districts as of the
- 5 most recent pupil membership count day and if those resolutions all
- 6 contain an identical specified number of mills to be levied under
- 7 this section and an identical specified number of years for which
- 8 the tax shall be levied, the question of levying a regional
- 9 enhancement property tax by the intermediate school district shall
- 10 be placed on the ballot by the intermediate school district at the
- 11 next regular school election held in each of the constituent
- 12 districts. If the question is to be submitted to the intermediate
- 13 school electors of an intermediate school district having a
- 14 population of more than 1,400,000, the intermediate school board
- 15 shall call a special election to be held at the next state primary
- 16 or general election. If the resolution requirement is met more than
- 17 180 days before the next regular school district elections, and if
- 18 requested in the resolutions, the intermediate school board shall
- 19 submit the question of levying a regional enhancement property tax
- 20 within the intermediate school district on the ballot at a special
- 21 election called by the intermediate school board for that purpose
- 22 not earlier than 90 days after the resolution requirements are met.
- 23 (3) Not later than 10 days after receipt by the intermediate
- 24 school district of the revenue from the regional enhancement
- 25 property tax, the intermediate school district shall calculate and
- 26 pay to each of its constituent school districts an amount of the
- 27 revenue calculated by dividing the total amount of the revenue by

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- 1 the combined membership of the constituent school districts within
- 2 the intermediate district, as of the most recent pupil membership
- 3 count day, and multiplying that quotient by the constituent school
- 4 district's membership, as of the most recent pupil membership count
- 5 day for which a final department-audited pupil count is available.
- 6 (4) Regional enhancement property tax under this section may
- 7 be levied for a term not to exceed 20 years, as specified in the
- 8 ballot question, and may be renewed for the same term with the
- 9 approval of a majority of the intermediate school electors voting
- 10 on the question.
- 11 (5) The question of levying a regional enhancement property
- 12 tax under this section shall be presented to the intermediate
- 13 school electors as a separate question.

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
