SENATE BILL No. 1236

August 15, 2012, Introduced by Senator CASPERSON and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

A bill to amend 2000 PA 274, entitled "Large carnivore act,"

by amending sections 2 and 22 (MCL 287.1102 and 287.1122).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Animal control officer" means a county animal control
 3 officer as described in sections 29a and 29b of the dog law of
 4 1919, 1919 PA 339, MCL 287.289a and 287.289b, or a city, village,
 5 or township animal control officer as described in section 29c of
 6 the dog law of 1919, 1919 PA 339, MCL 287.289c.
 - (b) "Animal control shelter" or "animal protection shelter" means an animal control shelter or animal protection shelter, respectively, registered with the department under section 6 of 1969 PA 287, MCL 287.336.
 - (c) "Circus" means an incorporated, class C licensee that is

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- 1 licensed under chapter I of title 9 of the code of federal
- 2 regulations, that is temporarily in this state, and that offers
- 3 skilled performances by live animals, clowns, and acrobats for
- 4 public entertainment. Circus does not include a person, whether or
- 5 not a class C licensee, who presents a large carnivore to the
- 6 public as part of a carnival or for any of the following purposes:
- 7 (i) Exhibition.
- 8 (ii) Education.
- 9 (iii) Entertainment that includes wrestling, a photography
- 10 opportunity with a patron, or an activity in which the large
- 11 carnivore and a patron are in close contact with each other.
- 12 (d) "Department" means the department of agriculture AND RURAL
- 13 DEVELOPMENT.
- 14 (e) "Facility" means an indoor or outdoor cage, pen, or
- 15 similar enclosure where a large carnivore is kept.
- 16 (f) "Large carnivore" means either of the following:
- 17 (i) Any of the following cats of the Felidae family, whether
- 18 wild or captive bred, including a hybrid cross with such a cat:
- **19** (A) A lion.
- 20 (B) A leopard, including, but not limited to, a snow leopard
- 21 or clouded leopard.
- 22 (C) A jaguar.
- 23 (D) A tiger.
- 24 (E) A cougar.
- 25 (F) A panther.
- 26 (G) A cheetah.
- (ii) A bear of a species that is native or nonnative to this

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- 1 state, whether wild or captive bred.
- 2 (g) "Law enforcement officer" means:
- 3 (i) A sheriff or sheriff's deputy.
- 4 (ii) A village or township marshal.
- 5 (iii) An officer of the police department of a city, village, or
- 6 township.
- 7 (*iv*) An officer of the Michigan state police.
- 8 (v) A peace officer who is trained and certified under the
- 9 commission on law enforcement standards act, 1965 PA 203, MCL
- 10 28.601 to 28.616.
- 11 (vi) A conservation officer appointed by the department of
- 12 natural resources.
- 13 (vii) An animal control officer.
- 14 (viii) A law enforcement officer of the federal government
- 15 authorized to enforce any federal law regulating animals.
- 16 (h) "Livestock" means that term as defined in section 5 of the
- 17 animal industry act, of 1987, 1988 PA 466, MCL 287.705.
- (i) "Local unit" means a city, village, township, or county.
- 19 (j) "Permit" means a permit issued under section 4.
- 20 (k) "Permitting agency" means the agency of a local unit that
- 21 issues permits under section 4.
- (1) "Person" means an individual, partnership, corporation,
- 23 association, governmental entity, or other legal entity.
- 24 (m) "Pet shop" means a pet shop licensed by the department
- 25 under section 3 of 1969 PA 287, MCL 287.333.
- 26 (n) "Veterinarian" means a person licensed to practice
- 27 veterinary medicine under article 15 of the public health code,

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- 1 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.16101 to 333.18838.
- 2 Sec. 22. (1) Sections 4, 5, and 6 do not apply to any of the
- 3 following:
- 4 (a) An animal control shelter or animal protection shelter.
- 5 (b) A person licensed or approved by the department of natural
- 6 resources of this state or by the United States fish and wildlife
- 7 service of the United States department of the interior. This
- 8 subdivision does not apply to a person in possession of 1 or more
- 9 black bears under the authority of a permit to hold wildlife in
- 10 captivity issued by the department of natural resources.
- 11 (c) A zoological park approved or accredited by the American
- 12 zoo and aquarium association.
- 13 (d) A person approved by the association of sanctuaries or the
- 14 American sanctuary association.
- 15 (e) A law enforcement officer acting under the authority of
- 16 this act.
- 17 (f) A veterinarian temporarily in possession of a large
- 18 carnivore to provide veterinary care for or humanely euthanize the
- 19 large carnivore.
- 20 (2) Sections 4, 5, 6(1)(d) to (5)(d), 8, and 14(3) do not
- 21 apply to a person who is not a resident of this state and who is in
- 22 this state only for the purpose of travel between locations outside
- 23 of this state.
- 24 (3) Subject to subsection (2), this act does not apply to a
- 25 person who meets all of the following requirements:
- 26 (a) Is conducting a for-profit or nonprofit business that
- 27 meets both of the following requirements:

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- 1 (i) The primary purpose of the business is the presentation of
- 2 animals including large carnivores to the public for education or
- 3 exhibition purposes.
- 4 (ii) The business is not conducted in connection with another
- 5 business as a means of attracting customers to that other business.
- 6 (b) Is a class C licensee that possesses and maintains a class
- 7 C license under 9 C.F.R. CFR 1.1.
- 8 (c) Meets or exceeds all standards, including but not limited
- 9 to standards for training, housing, care, and transport of large
- 10 carnivores, required of a class C licensee under 9 C.F.R. CFR 1.1.
- (d) Does not allow a patron to do any of the following:
- 12 (i) Come into direct contact with a large carnivore OTHER THAN
- 13 A BEAR LESS THAN 36 WEEKS OF AGE.
- 14 (ii) COME INTO DIRECT CONTACT WITH A BEAR 36 WEEKS OF AGE OR
- 15 OLDER.
- 16 (iii) (iii) Come into close enough contact with a large carnivore
- 17 over 20 weeks of age, OTHER THAN A BEAR LESS THAN 36 WEEKS OF AGE,
- 18 so as to place the patron in jeopardy of being harmed by the large
- 19 carnivore.
- 20 (iv) COME INTO CLOSE ENOUGH CONTACT WITH A BEAR 36 WEEKS OF AGE
- 21 OR OLDER SO AS TO PLACE THE PATRON IN JEOPARDY OF BEING HARMED BY
- 22 THE BEAR.
- 23 (e) Does not sell large carnivores, except to another person
- 24 that meets the requirements of this subsection.
- 25 (f) Does not breed large carnivores.
- 26 (4) This act does not apply to a circus.
