HOUSE BILL No. 4645

May 17, 2011, Introduced by Reps. Genetski, Franz, Somerville, McBroom, Lori, MacGregor, Agema, Liss, Nesbitt and Cotter and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled

"The revised school code,"

by amending section 1531 (MCL 380.1531), as amended by 2007 PA 32; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1531. (1) Except as provided in this act, the
- 2 superintendent of public instruction shall determine the
- 3 requirements for and issue all licenses and certificates for
- 4 teachers, including preprimary teachers, and the requirements for
- 5 an endorsement of teachers as qualified counselors and an
- 6 endorsement of teachers for teaching a foreign language in an
- 7 elementary grade in the public schools of the state.
 - (2) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the

- 1 superintendent of public instruction shall only issue a teaching
- 2 certificate to a person who has passed appropriate examinations as
- 3 follows:
- 4 (a) For a secondary level teaching certificate, has passed
- 5 both the basic skills examination and the appropriate available
- 6 subject area examination for each subject area in which he or she
- 7 applies to be certified.
- 8 (b) For an elementary level teaching certificate, has passed
- 9 the basic skills examination and, if it is available, the
- 10 elementary certification examination, and has passed the
- 11 appropriate available subject area examination for each subject
- 12 area, if any, in which he or she applies to be certified.
- 13 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the
- 14 superintendent of public instruction shall issue a Michigan
- 15 teaching certificate to a person holding a certificate from another
- 16 state or a teaching degree from an out-of-state teacher preparation
- 17 institution who applies for a Michigan teaching certificate only if
- 18 the person passes appropriate examinations as follows:
- 19 (a) For a secondary level teaching certificate, pass both the
- 20 basic skills examination and the appropriate available subject area
- 21 examination for each subject area in which he or she applies to be
- 22 certified. The superintendent of public instruction may accept
- 23 passage of an equivalent examination approved by the superintendent
- 24 of public instruction to meet 1 or both of these requirements.
- 25 (b) For an elementary level teaching certificate, pass the
- 26 basic skills examination and, if it is available, the elementary
- 27 certification examination, and pass the appropriate available

- 1 subject area examination for each subject area, if any, in which he
- 2 or she applies to be certified. The superintendent of public
- 3 instruction may accept passage of an equivalent examination
- 4 approved by the superintendent of public instruction to meet 1 or
- 5 more of these requirements.
- 6 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the
- 7 superintendent of public instruction shall only issue a teaching
- 8 certificate to a person who has met the elementary or secondary, as
- 9 applicable, reading credit requirements established under
- 10 superintendent of public instruction rule. If a person holds a
- 11 teaching certificate, then beginning July 1, 2009, notwithstanding
- 12 any rule to the contrary, the superintendent of public instruction
- 13 shall not advance the person's certification to professional
- 14 certification unless the person has successfully completed at least
- 15 a 3-credit course of study with appropriate field experiences in
- 16 the diagnosis and remediation of reading disabilities and
- 17 differentiated instruction. To meet this requirement, the course of
- 18 study should include the following elements, as determined by the
- 19 department to be appropriate for the person's certification level
- 20 and endorsements: interest inventories, English language learning
- 21 screening, visual and auditory discrimination tools, language
- 22 expression and processing screening, phonemics, phonics,
- 23 vocabulary, fluency, comprehension, spelling and writing assessment
- 24 tools, and instructional strategies. A person may complete the
- 25 course of study either as part of his or her teacher preparation
- 26 program or during the first 6 years of his or her employment in
- 27 classroom teaching.

- 1 (5) Not later than January 11, 2002, the superintendent of
- 2 public instruction, in cooperation with appropriate curriculum
- 3 specialists and teacher educators, shall revise existing reading
- 4 standards to recognize reading disorders and to enable teachers to
- 5 make referrals for instruction and support for pupils with reading
- 6 disorders.
- 7 (6) Subject to subsection (8), if a person holding a teaching
- 8 certificate from another state applies to the superintendent of
- 9 public instruction for a Michigan teaching certificate and meets
- 10 the requirements of this subsection, the superintendent of public
- 11 instruction shall issue to the person a Michigan professional
- 12 education teaching certificate and applicable endorsements
- 13 comparable to those the person holds in the other state, without
- 14 requiring the person to pass a basic skills examination or the
- 15 applicable subject area examination otherwise required under
- 16 subsection (2) or (3). To be eligible to receive a Michigan
- 17 professional education teaching certificate under this subsection,
- 18 a person shall provide evidence satisfactory to the department that
- 19 he or she meets all of the following requirements:
- 20 (a) Has taught successfully for at least 3 years in a position
- 21 for which the person's teaching certification from the other state
- 22 was valid.
- 23 (b) Has earned, after his or her initial certification in
- 24 another state, at least 18 semester credit hours in a planned
- 25 course of study at an institution of higher education approved by
- 26 the superintendent of public instruction or has earned, at any
- 27 time, a master's or doctoral degree approved by the superintendent

- 1 of public instruction.
- 2 (c) Has met the elementary or secondary, as applicable,
- 3 reading credit requirement established under superintendent of
- 4 public instruction rule.
- 5 (7) A person who receives a teaching certificate and
- 6 endorsement or endorsements under subsection (6) is eligible to
- 7 receive 1 or more additional endorsements comparable to
- 8 endorsements the person holds in another state only if the person
- 9 passes the appropriate subject area examinations required under
- **10** subsection (2) or (3).
- 11 (8) The superintendent of public instruction shall deny a
- 12 Michigan teaching certificate to a person described in subsection
- 13 (6) for fraud, material misrepresentation, or concealment in the
- 14 person's application for a certificate or for a conviction for
- 15 which a person's teaching certificate may be revoked under section
- **16** 1535a.
- 17 (9) The department, based upon criteria recommended pursuant
- 18 to subsection (11), shall provide to approved teacher education
- 19 institutions guidelines and criteria approved by the superintendent
- 20 of public instruction for use in the development or selection of a
- 21 basic skills examination and approved guidelines and criteria for
- 22 use in the development or selection of subject area examinations.
- 23 (10) For the purposes of this section, the superintendent of
- 24 public instruction, based upon criteria recommended pursuant to
- 25 subsection (11), shall develop, select, or develop and select 1 or
- 26 more basic skills examinations and subject area examinations. In
- 27 addition, the superintendent of public instruction, based upon

- 1 criteria recommended pursuant to subsection (11), shall approve an
- 2 elementary certification examination and a reading subject area
- 3 examination.
- 4 (11) The superintendent of public instruction shall appoint an
- 5 11-member teacher examination advisory committee comprised of
- 6 representatives of approved teacher education institutions and
- 7 Michigan education organizations and associations. Not more than
- 8 1/2 of the members comprising this committee shall be certified
- 9 teachers. This committee shall recommend criteria to be used by the
- 10 superintendent of public instruction in the development, selection,
- 11 or development and selection of 1 or more basic skills
- 12 examinations, and criteria to be used by the superintendent of
- 13 public instruction in the development, selection, or development
- 14 and selection of subject area examinations. In addition, the
- 15 committee shall recommend guidelines for the use and administration
- 16 of those examinations. The basic skills examinations referred to in
- 17 this subsection may be developed by the superintendent of public
- 18 instruction or selected by the superintendent of public instruction
- 19 from commercially or university developed examinations. In
- 20 addition, an approved teacher education institution, pursuant to
- 21 guidelines and criteria described in subsection (9), may develop an
- 22 examination at its own expense for approval by the superintendent
- 23 of public instruction. An approved teacher education institution
- 24 that develops its own examination is liable for any litigation that
- 25 results from the use of its examination.
- 26 (12) The superintendent of public instruction shall appoint a
- 27 7-member standing technical advisory council comprised of persons

- 1 who are experts in measurement and assessment. This council shall
- 2 advise the superintendent of public instruction and the teacher
- 3 examination committee on the validity, reliability, and other
- 4 technical standards of the examinations that will be used or are
- 5 being used and of the administration and use of those examinations.
- 6 (13) Not later than November 30 of each year, the
- 7 superintendent of public instruction shall submit in writing a
- 8 report on the development or selection and use of the basic skills
- 9 examination, the elementary certification examination, and the
- 10 subject area examinations to the house and senate education
- 11 committees. The report shall also contain a financial statement
- 12 regarding revenue received from the assessment of fees levied
- 13 pursuant to subsection (15) and the amount of and any purposes for
- 14 which that revenue was expended.
- 15 (14) The basic skills examination, the elementary
- 16 certification examination, and the subject area examinations
- 17 required by this section may be taken at different times during an
- 18 approved teacher preparation program, but the basic skills
- 19 examination must be passed before a person is enrolled for student
- 20 teaching and the elementary certification examination and the
- 21 subject area examinations, as applicable, must be passed before a
- 22 person is recommended for certification.
- 23 (15) The department, or if approved by the superintendent of
- 24 public instruction, a private testing service, may assess fees for
- 25 taking the basic skills examination, elementary certification
- 26 examination, and the subject area examinations. The fees, which
- 27 shall be set by the superintendent of public instruction, shall not

- 1 exceed \$50.00 for a basic skills examination or \$75.00 for an
- 2 elementary certification examination or a subject area examination.
- 3 However, if a subject area examination for vocational education
- 4 includes a performance examination, an additional fee may be
- 5 assessed for taking the performance examination, not to exceed the
- 6 actual cost of administering the performance examination. Fees
- 7 received by the department shall be expended solely for
- 8 administrative expenses that it incurs in implementing this
- 9 section.
- 10 (16) If a person holding a teaching certificate from another
- 11 state applies for a Michigan teaching certificate and meets all
- 12 requirements for the Michigan teaching certificate except passage
- 13 of the appropriate examinations under subsection (3), the
- 14 superintendent of public instruction shall issue a nonrenewable
- 15 temporary teaching certificate, good for 1 year, to the person. The
- 16 superintendent of public instruction shall not issue a Michigan
- 17 teaching certificate to the person after expiration of the
- 18 temporary teaching certificate unless the person passes appropriate
- 19 examinations as described in subsection (3).
- 20 (17) As used in this section:
- 21 (a) "Basic skills examination" means an examination developed
- 22 or selected by the superintendent of public instruction or
- 23 developed pursuant to subsection (11) by an approved teacher
- 24 education institution for the purpose of demonstrating the
- 25 applicant's knowledge and understanding of basic language and
- 26 mathematical skills and other skills necessary for the certificate
- 27 sought, and for determining whether or not an applicant is eligible

- 1 for a provisional Michigan teaching certificate.
- 2 (b) "Elementary certification examination" means a
- 3 comprehensive examination for elementary certification that has
- 4 been developed or selected by the superintendent of public
- 5 instruction for demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and
- 6 understanding of the core subjects normally taught in elementary
- 7 classrooms and for determining whether or not an applicant is
- 8 eligible for an elementary level teaching certificate.
- 9 (c) "Subject area examination" means an examination related to
- 10 a specific area of certification, which examination has been
- 11 developed or selected by the superintendent of public instruction
- 12 for the purpose of demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and
- 13 understanding of the subject matter and determining whether or not
- 14 an applicant is eligible for a Michigan teaching certificate.
- 15 (18) The superintendent of public instruction shall promulgate
- 16 rules for the implementation of this section.
- 17 (19) Notwithstanding any rule to the contrary, the
- 18 superintendent of public instruction shall continue to issue state
- 19 elementary or secondary continuing education certificates pursuant
- 20 to R 390.1132(1) of the Michigan administrative code to persons who
- 21 completed the requirements of that rule by December 31, 1992 and
- 22 who apply for that certificate not later than March 15, 1994. If
- 23 the superintendent of public instruction has issued a state
- 24 elementary or secondary professional education certificate to a
- 25 person described in this section, the superintendent of public
- 26 instruction shall consider the person to have a state elementary or
- 27 secondary, as applicable, continuing education certificate.

- 1 (20) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY RULE TO THE CONTRARY, AN INDIVIDUAL
- 2 IS NOT REQUIRED TO HAVE ANY TEACHING CERTIFICATE TO TEACH IN THIS
- 3 STATE OTHER THAN A VALID PROVISIONAL TEACHING CERTIFICATE OR THE
- 4 SINGLE TEACHING CERTIFICATE DESCRIBED IN SUBDIVISION (A), EXCEPT
- 5 THAT THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION MAY CONTINUE TO
- 6 REOUIRE AN OCCUPATIONAL TEACHING CERTIFICATE FOR INSTRUCTION THAT
- 7 REQUIRED THAT CERTIFICATE AS OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS
- 8 SUBSECTION. BEGINNING ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBSECTION. ALL
- 9 OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY TO THE ISSUANCE OF TEACHING CERTIFICATES IN
- 10 THIS STATE, OTHER THAN AN OCCUPATIONAL EDUCATION CERTIFICATE:
- 11 (A) THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION SHALL ISSUE A
- 12 SINGLE TEACHING CERTIFICATE THAT IS VALID FOR TEACHING IN THIS
- 13 STATE RATHER THAN ISSUING A PROVISIONAL TEACHING CERTIFICATE AND
- 14 THEN ISSUING A MICHIGAN PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION CERTIFICATE AT THE
- 15 EXPIRATION OF A PROVISIONAL TEACHING CERTIFICATE. THE EDUCATION
- 16 REQUIREMENTS FOR THE SINGLE TEACHING CERTIFICATE SHALL NOT EXCEED
- 17 THE EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS IN EFFECT AS OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF
- 18 THIS SUBSECTION FOR A PROVISIONAL TEACHING CERTIFICATE.
- 19 (B) SUBJECT TO SUBDIVISION (C), UPON EXPIRATION OF AN
- 20 INDIVIDUAL'S TEACHING CERTIFICATE THAT IS IN EFFECT AS OF THE
- 21 EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION, WHETHER IT IS A PROVISIONAL OR
- 22 PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION TEACHING CERTIFICATE, AND FULFILLMENT OF
- 23 REQUIREMENTS FOR RENEWAL OF THAT TEACHING CERTIFICATE, THE
- 24 SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION SHALL ISSUE TO THE INDIVIDUAL
- 25 THE SINGLE TEACHING CERTIFICATE DESCRIBED IN SUBDIVISION (A).
- 26 (C) THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION SHALL NOT REQUIRE
- 27 COMPLETION OF ANY CREDIT HOURS, CONTINUING EDUCATION UNITS, OR

- 1 DEGREE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ISSUANCE OR RENEWAL OF THE SINGLE
- 2 TEACHING CERTIFICATE DESCRIBED IN SUBDIVISION (A) EXCEPT FOR THE
- 3 EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS UNDER SUBDIVISION (A).
- 4 Enacting section 1. Section 1531e of the revised school code,
- 5 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1531e, is repealed.
